MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to amend "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," in certain respects.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance," in certain respects: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1904," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance, and the principal Ordinance and the Ordinances amending the same and this Ordinance may be cited together as "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinances, 1889 to 1904."

Amendment of section 61 (1) (b) of Municipal Ordinance.

- 2 For clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 61 of the principal Ordinance the following clause shall be substituted, namely:
 - b) Make, lay down, and carry out to the satisfaction of the government agent all such drains, pipes, and other works as may be necessary to carry the water from such land or premises either over or under the channel, water-course, or ela, so as not to injure the same.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to further amend "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902."

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), by enabling special rates to be charged for the carriage of passengers and goods over the portion of the Ceylon Government Railway known as the Uda Pussellawa section: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Ceylon Railway (Amendment) Ordinance, 1904," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance, and this Ordinance and the principal Ordinance and "The Ceylon Railways (Amendment) Ordinance, 1903," may be cited together as "The Ceylon Railway Ordinances, 1902 and 1904."
- 2 After section 5 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be added and numbered 5A.
 - 5A. Notwithstanding anything in section 5 contained, the charges for conveying passengers, goods, and parcels over any part of the section of the railway between Nanuoya and Ragalla, or over any future extension or branch of such section, may exceed the rates specified in the schedule to the principal Ordinance, provided that the same do not exceed the rates specified in the schedule hereto of special rates chargeable in respect of the said section of the railway.

Schedule of Special Rates chargeable for conveyance of Goods and Passengers over the Nanuoya-Ragalla Section.

RATE OF RAILWAY FARES.

Passengers.

1st class not exceeding 17 cents per mile. 2nd class not exceeding 12 cents per mile. 3rd class not exceeding 4 cents per mile. No reduction to be made for return tickets.

Goods.

Not exceeding 44 cents per ton per mile for goods of every description.
