The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :-

An Ordinance to amend "The Toll Ordinance, 1896."

Preamble.

Short title.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Toll Ordi-nance, 1896" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), in certain particulars: Be it there-fore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Toll (Amend-1 ment) Ordinance, 1904," and shall be read and construed as one with the principal Ordinance; and the principal Ordinance and this Ordinance may be cited together as "The Tolls Ordinances, 1896 and 1904."

In section 22 of the principal Ordinance the following 2 words shall be substituted for the words "river or stream, namely:

"river, stream, canal, lake, estuary, creek, inlet of the sea, or other expanse of water.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :---

> An Ordinance for the better enforcement of certain conditions in the Sales of Tolls and Arrack Rents.

Preamble.

Short title.

Power of government agent to enforce penalties for breaches of conditions of sale of toils and arrack rents.

Where penalty consists in forfeiture of a sum paid to or deposited in the Treasury.

Where penalty consists in re-sale by Crown of privilege or exclusive right or in re-entry into possession.

Form of notice.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relating to the enforcement of certain conditions in sales of tolls and arrack rents: Be it enacted by the Governor of

tolls and arrack rents: Be it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Tolls and Arrack Rents Ordinance, 1904."

2 Whenever by the conditions of sale under which the privilege of selling arrack and toddy in any part of the island, or the exclusive right to levy and collect tolls in respect of any road, bridge, ferry, or canal, is sold or leased by the Crown, it is stipulated that, on default by the purchaser or lessee (hereinafter called "the renter") in the performance of all or any of the conditions contained in the said conditions of sale:

- (a) The government agent shall be at liberty to re-sell the said privilege or exclusive right or so much of the term thereof as may be unexpired; or
- (b) The government agent shall be at liberty to re-enter upon the said privilege or exclusive right or so much of the term thereof as may be unexpired, and the same again to have, collect, receive, retain, and enjoy, as of his former estate, and to expel the renter or his administrators and all others as to the said government agent shall seem meet; or
- (c) The renter shall forfeit any sum which he has paid to or deposited in the Government Treasury ;

it shall be lawful for the government agent, whenever any such default as aforesaid is made, to enforce the penalty in manner hereinafter mentioned, any rule of law to the contrary notwithstanding.

3 Where the penalty consists in the forfeiture of any sum which the renter has paid to or deposited in the Government Treasury, the government agent shall give notice in writing to the renter that such sum has been forfeited to the Crown, and thereupon the same shall be deemed to have been duly forfeited and to have vested in the Crown.

4 Where the penalty consists in the re-sale by the Crown of the privilege or exclusive right or in the re-entry by the Crown into possession thereof, the government agent shall give notice in writing to the renter that the sale or lease to him has been vacated and determined, and thereupon it shall be lawful for the government agent, without process of law or decree or order of any court in that behalf authorizing him, forthwith to re-sell the said privilege or exclusive right or the unexpired term thereof in such manner as the Governor may direct, or to re-enter into possession thereof, and receive, retain, and enjoy the same and remove and expel the renter therefrom as provided by the said conditions.

5 The notice in writing required by the two last foregoing sections may be given by forwarding it by post in a letter addressed to the renter at the place which the renter in pursuance of the conditions of sale has signified for the service on him of notices or processes, or by serving the same on him personally, or by affixing it on his last known place of residence.
