## COMMUTATION TAX FOR 1904.

NOTICE is hereby given to persons residing within the limits of the Local Board, Negombo, that the Board, acting under the provisions of section 35 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, has imposed an annual tax on account of the year 1904, payable in six days' labour, upon all persons residing within the limits of the Local Board, who would have been liable, under the provisions of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1861, to the performance of labour for the maintenance of the roads or other public means of communication by land or by water, if the Ordinance No. 31 of 1884 had not been passed.

Such labour may be commuted by a money payment of Rs. 2 in the town of Negombo and the islands of Pitipana and Munnakkara, and Re. 1.50 in the island of Duwa, on or before March 31, 1904; after that date the payment will be Rs. 4 and Rs. 3 respectively per head.
