BENGAL.—No. 1.

*New Zealand—South Island, North-West Coast—  
Kahurangi Point—Intended Light.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 995 of 1903) that about the end of November a fixed light, elevated 110 ft. above high water, and visible in clear

weather from a distance of 16 miles, will be established in a light tower being constructed on Kahurangi point; it will have a red sector of 20° over Stewart breaker; and its visibility will extend over an arc of about 212°, but elsewhere it will show white. The light will be dioptric of the second order.

Approximate position: lat. 40° 46' S., long. 172° 13½' E.  
Further notice will be given when this light is exhibited.

## BENGAL.—No. 2.

*Eastern Archipelago—Borneo, North Coast—Banguey Island—A Coral Patch to the Eastward.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 999 of 1903) of the existence of a coral patch, with a depth of 4 fathoms over it, at low water ordinary springs, off the north coast of Borneo, situated with Mullawalle summit (562 ft.) bearing S 44° W., distant 28 miles, and Balabac peak N. 48° W.

Approximate position : lat. 7° 23' N., long. 117° 35' E.

Another coral patch with a depth of 6 fathoms over it was found 2 cables eastward of the above, and a sounding of 8 fathoms at a distance of 3 cables north-eastward from the same patch.

*Japan—Kiusiu, West Coast—Hirado No Seto Approach—Odate (Odate) Shima—Light replaced by Temporary Light.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 1,006 of 1903) that on and after November 3, 1903, during the reconstruction of the lighthouse, the fixed light, showing white and red sectors on Odate (Odate) shima, would be replaced by a temporary white fixed light hoisted on a staff; this light will be obscured between the bearings of N. 84° E. and N. 44° E.

*China, North-east Coast—Shantung—Sang Kau Bay Shoals.*

## BENGAL.—No. 5.

*China—Shang Tung—Kyau Chau Bay Approach—Tcha lien tau—Light altered.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 74, dated April 11, 1899, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 1,008 of 1903) that on October 3, 1903, the temporary white fixed light on Tcha lien tau was replaced by a white flashing light every ten seconds, elevated 252 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 21 miles; it is shown from a gray sandstone tower 49 ft. high.

## BENGAL.—No. 6.

*Japan—Kiusiu, South-East Coast—Osima and Tanega Sima—Rocks to the Northward.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 1,012 of 1903) of the existence of the under-mentioned rocks to the northward of Osima and Tanega sima :—

- (1) A rock named Nakanose, with a depth of 3½ fathoms over it, situated at a distance of 6½ cables southward of Udo bana in approximately lat. 31° 38' N., long. 131° 28½' E. There are depths of from 5 to 11 fathoms around this rock.
- (2) A rock, named Tabunoki, with a depth of 4½ fathoms over it, about 1½ miles to the southward of Udo bana in approximately lat. 31° 36¾' N., long. 131° 28½' E. There is a depth of 17 fathoms immediately seaward of this rock.
- (3) A rock, named Senohana, with a least depth of 4 fathoms over it, situated 1½ miles to the northward of Kisaka misaki, Tanega sima, in approximately lat. 30° 51¾' N., long. 131° 4¼' E. There is a depth of 20 fathoms close to the western side of this rock, but for half a mile to the eastward of it there is less than 10 fathoms.

*Eastern Archipelago—Serwatti Islands—Brisbane Islet  
(Maety Mirarang)—Light established.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 372, dated December 20, 1902, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 1,018 of 1903) that a white group flashing light, showing two short flashes in quick succession every ten seconds, elevated 75 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles, has been established in an iron framework tower, painted white, having a white dwelling with red roof at its base, erected on Brisbane islet or Maety Mirarang.

The light is of the fifth order.

## BENGAL.—No. 8.

*Pacific Ocean—The Philippine Islands—Panay—  
Ilo Ilo—Buoyage altered.*

With reference to notice to Mariners No. 308, dated June 15, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 1,022 of 1903) that the buoyage in the northern entrance to Ilo Ilo has been altered to conform to the United States uniform system, as follows:—

(1) The black nun buoy, No. 1, moored in a depth of 3¼ fathoms, with Siete Pecados Lighthouse bearing N. 75° W., distant 4¾ miles, has been replaced by a black can buoy marked No. 1. There is a depth of only 17 ft. at distance of one cable northward of this buoy.

(2) The red can buoy, No. 2, moored off Dumangas point in a depth of 3 fathoms, with Siete Pecados Lighthouse bearing S. 81° W., distant 5½ miles, has been replaced by a red nun buoy marked No. 2.

(3) The black nun buoy, No. 3, moored in a depth of 3 fathoms, with Siete Pecados Lighthouse bearing N. 71° W., distant 1¼ miles, has been replaced by a black can buoy marked No. 3.

(4) A red nun buoy, marked No. 4, has been established on the southern edge of Iguana bank, in a depth of 2½ fathoms with Siete Pecados Lighthouse bearing N. 57° W. distant 3¾ miles.

(5) The buoy exhibiting a red fixed light is situated one cable E. by N. from Ilo Ilo Lighthouse, and not 3½ cables S. 35° E. from it, as stated in Notice to Mariners No. 395 of 1903.

Approximate position, Siete Pecados Lighthouse: lat. 10° 46' N., long. 122° 41' E.

Vessels should give these buoys a berth of 2 cables.

## MADRAS.—No. 36. OF 1903.

*India, East Coast—Vizagapatam—Light established  
at Bimlipatam.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 53 of 1903, it is further notified that on December 20, 1903, a group occulting white light showing four occultations every minute (a group of four occultations of about 4½ seconds separated by light of about 5½ seconds, and followed by light of about 26 seconds' duration) has been established at Bimlipatam at an elevation of 35 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 11 miles in all directions seaward. The light, which is of the fourth order (the light power being .00 candles), is shown from a masonry tower 36 ft. high, erected close to the port flagstaff.
