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## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, November 6, 1903.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated October 31, 1903.

*Present* :—Mr. C. D. Vigors, Acting Chairman ; Mr. P. D. Khan ; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, C.M.G. ; Major A. W. de Wilton ; Dr. C. W. van Geysel ; Mr. F. C. Allen ; Mr. L. Creasy ; Mr. G. H. Alston ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. James Peiris ; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen ; Dr. W. H. de Silva ; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam ; and Mr. M. Finlay.

The Minutes of October 9, 1903, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of October 9, 1903, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved—That this Council do present an address of welcome to His Excellency Sir H. Blake on his arrival in the Island.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved—That a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. James Peiris, and Mr. H. A. Jayewardene be appointed—three to form a quorum—to prepare the address, and that the Council do vote a sum of Rs. 150 to meet the necessary expenses.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

3. The motion standing in Mr. C. P. Dias's name was withdrawn by leave of Council.

4. To present a petition from W. de Alwis, Tax Collector for the Mutwal Ward, and to move for papers.

Dr. Solomon Fernando moved to amend the motion standing in his name by adding the words "and that the petition be considered."

Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried.

The matter was considered.

5. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of October 27, 1903, Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 28, 1903, and Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of October 30, 1903, were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of October 27, 1903:—

(2) Papers with reference to standardization of milk in Colombo.

The adoption of a standard on the basis of a large number of samples, which would thus be a definite test, is advisable. The Standing Committee, however think that in view of the number of samples to be analyzed for this purpose, for sewage experiments, water, food, &c., it is advisable for Council either to equip a laboratory and appoint an analyst or to see if arrangements could not be made with Mr. Bamber to do all the Council's work for a fixed annual fee.

(3) Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the first quarter, 1903.

The Committee have no special remarks to offer, the question of infant mortality and the condition of the lake are engaging the Medical Officer of Health's attention.

(4) Letter No. 809 of September 2, 1903, from Municipal Engineer, with reference to the extension of the vegetable market under construction in Kachcheri road.

The Standing Committee strongly recommends the extension.

(6) Papers with reference to appointment of a competent Inspector to inspect dairies and laundries.

The Committee recommends that two Inspectors for laundries and dairies outside Colombo be appointed and the payment of fees to headmen discontinued.

(8) Tenders for Grandpass market for 1904.

The tender of J. E. G. Ameresinghe is recommended.

(9) Tenders for St. John's Fish market for 1904.

The tender of W. J. Mendis is recommended.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. M. Finlay, who was accordingly elected as a Member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

7. The report of the Special Committee appointed on October 9, 1903, to draft a valedictory address to His Excellency the Governor on his departure from the Island, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the adoption of the draft address.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

8. A report of the Special Committee appointed to consider the question of the Hill House quarry was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the report be adopted.

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.—Carried.

9. The report of the Special Committee appointed to consider whether any portion, and if so, what might be set apart for payment from existing balances and current revenue towards the cost of the modified Mansergh scheme was not ready.

10. Papers with reference to the appointment of a Works Engineer were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations made by Mr. Cooper be adopted, and that he be authorized to draw the money required.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved as an amendment that the post be offered to Mr. S. W. Dassanaiké, and that he be seconded for service.

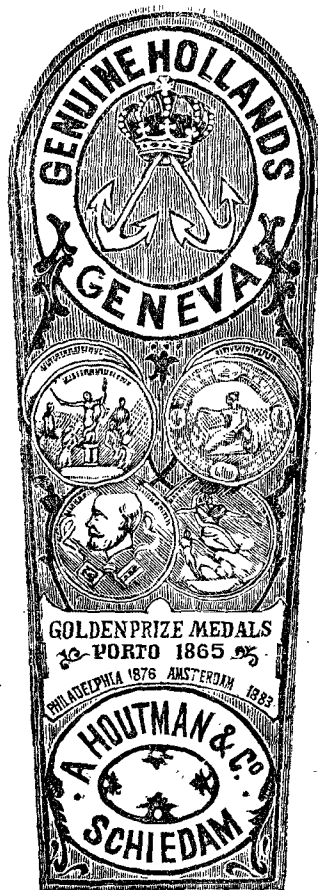
