MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of an adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Tuesday, December 22, 1903, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 19, 1903.

Present :--Hon. Mr. S. Haughton, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman,

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 21 and of a Special Meeting held on December 19, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :--Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to November 30, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during. the month of November, 1903.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :---Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during November.

4. Correspondence.-The following letters were submitted :--

(a) Memorandum dated October 8, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter to Dr. G. P. Schokman nominating him as a Member of the Municipal Council.

(b) Letter No. 34, dated December 3, from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of Chairman's letter No. 88 of November 24, respecting additional postal facilities within the Municipality. Resolved — That the Postmaster-General be requested to communicate with the Council as to the sites proposed for the three pillar posts, and that a copy of the Chairman's letter, No. 40 of May 23, 1902, to the Colonial Secretary on the subject, be forwarded to him for his information.

(c) Letter No. 35, dated December 8, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to Chairman's letter No. 87 of November 24, stating that Mr. Barnard had been informed of his appointment as the Council's Electrical Adviser. Resolved -- That Mr. Barnard be asked to notify to the Chairman the date of his proposed visits to Kandy.

 $(d \cdot \text{Letter No. 36}, \text{dated December 8}, \text{ from the Colonial Secretary, acknowledging receipt of Chairman's letter No. 86 of November 24, respecting arrangements for diversion of traffic during the repairs or re-construction of the Peradeniya bridge, and stating that arrangements had been made to re-open the old Getambe ferry road and to$

provide a horse float. In reply to a question by Mr. Gibbon, as to what progress had been made for traffic, Mr. Tomalin, Provincial Engineer, stated that the approach on the Kandy side had been cut, and the one on other side of the river would soon be taken in hand, and that metal was being collected for the roadway. The ferry boat, it was stated, was being put together.

Mr. Tomalin stated that he had reason to believe that encroachment had been made on the sides of the approach road on the Kandy side of the river.

Resolved-That the owners of the lands on either side of the road be called on to produce their title deeds and plans under section 1, chapter VIII., of the by-laws.

(e) Letter No. 37, dated December 11, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting by-laws submitted re water service under chapter XII., which had been laid on the table of the Legislative Council for forty days, and requesting to be furnished with the necessary Proclamation.

The Secretary stated that the necessary Proclamation and translation had been prepared and would be forwarded in the course of the day.

(f) Letter No. 38, dated December 14, from the Colonial Secretary, advising the despatch of ten copies of Sir West Ridgeway's Review of the Administration of the Colony, 1896–1903, applied for by Chairman's letter No. 89 of November 24, in accordance with a resolution of the Council.

(g) Letter No. 39, dated December 17, from the Colonial Secretary, requesting, in view of the prohibitive cost of a complete scheme of drainage, a report as to what particular portion of the drainage of the town is most in need of improvement, it having been suggested that a modified scheme might be adopted.
 Read Chairman's letter No. 98 of December 22, acknowledging receipt of letter and stating that the matter is

receiving attention.

On proposal by Mr. Beven, seconded by the Chairman, resolved that consideration of the matter remain over for next Meeting.

5. Read letter No. 100, dated December 2, from the Government Agent, stating that the Municipal Council should apply for sanction of Government to lease the land required for a building for use of the Young Women's Christian Association when the negociations have reached the proper stage. Ground plan and plan of building prepared by Mr. Tomalin and the draft of a lease were submitted. Resolved—That the draft lease be referred to the Standing Committee on Law for revision and necessary

alterations, and resolved that the rent payable for the use of the ground be fixed at Re. 1 per annum.

6. In accordance with notice, Mr. Vanderwall moved for a return showing the work done in the upkeep of Lady Horton's walk and connected roads during the last six months, and that immediate steps be taken to improve the condition of these roads.

Work has been carried on since the commencement of the month and is still in progress, and the balance of vote will be expended before end of the year.

7. Applications for post of Chief Inspector, which had been seen by only some of the Members, were laid on the table.

Resolved—That the tabulated list and applications be circulated amongst Members who have not yet seen them, and that a statement of the duties of Chief Inspector be attached for the information of the Members; that the consideration of the applications remain over for next Meeting.

8. Copy of the address of welcome to His Excellency Sir Henry Arthur Blake, which was presented on his arrival in Kandy on Monday, December 21, was submitted. (Appendix A.)

The Meeting then proceeded to ballot for a Member of the Standing Committee on Market and Sanitation 9. in place of Dr. J. H. Ebell, who has gone to Galle.

The Chairman, after scrutinizing the votes, declared Dr. G. P. Schokman had been elected Member of Standing Committee.

10. Read recommendation of Standing Committee on Municipal Works, "that the application of Mrs. Warren Walker for house service pipes to premises No. 36, Ward street, be granted on the usual conditions."

Resolved-That the recommendation be adopted.

With permission of the Council, as being an urgent matter, proposed by Mr. Gibbon, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the attention of Government be drawn to the great inconvenience caused to the public by the discontinuance, under the new time table, of the 9.30 P.M. train from Nanu-oya via Kandy to Colombo, and that arrangements be made for the resumption of this train.

The resolution was agreed to nem. con.

For improvements in the drainage of the town the Council look for substantial aid from Government, their revenue unaided being unequal to the cost of such an expensive scheme.

The want of additional postal facilities has been the subject of correspondence with Government, and the Council, while thankful for recent provision to supply them to some extent, would continue to ask for favourable consideration of the remaining wants of the town in this respect. His Excellency the Governor's Reply.

MR. HAUGHTON AND GENTLEMEN, MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL,—I thank you for your welcome to Lady Blake and myself. I have neard of Kandy all my life; I have read of its beauties; and I have tried to form in my imagination a picture of it, but the picture falls far short of the reality For nine years I governed the Island of Jamaica in the Western Ocean and revelled in its exquisite and varied beauties. Now, after an interval, I find myself in this Pearl of the Eastern Seas, and almost dazed as I am by the grandeur and the unspeakable loveliness of the road from the sea to this ancient capital, with its thrilling interests reaching back continuously through the centuries to the earliest dawn of history, I feel that it will be to me a lasting happiness that it has been my lot to govern two of the fairest lands in all the world.

I assure you, Gentlemen, that Municipal institutions have my entire support and sympathy, feeling that Municipal institutions afford in the first place an opportunity of personal supervision of the most closely interested and a restraint upon undue expenditure by the influence of those who themselves will have to bear the burden of Municipal taxation. I shall gratefully consider any questions and proposals that you may place before me, with every

desire to meet your wishes as far as practicable. I need no assurance of the loyalty of Ceylon, for Ceylon has given proofs that she is ready to take her part and stand shoulder to shoulder with other portions of the Empire, in opposing the enemies of His Majesty the King, and the records of your Legislature show with what consideration and care and capacity your representatives have always considered the measures for the common good that have been placed before them from year to year. I assure you, Gentlemen, that nothing will be wanting on my part to secure the continuance of those happy

relations between the Governor and the people, of which the proceedings at the departure of my predecessor, Sir West Ridgeway, have given me ample and complete evidence. Again I thank you for your hearty welcome, welcome to Lady Blake and myself, and for your good wishes, which we most heartily reciprocate.

- (3) Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment :--Mr. D. G. Gunawardana, Mr. M. Ismail, Mr. C. P. Hayley.
- (4) Standing Committee on Municipal Public Works :- Mr. H. A. Grant, Dr. E. Ludovici, Mr. F. Abeysundara.

Resolved—That the quorum of each Standing Committee be fixed at two. Provided that when two Members only are present and they differ in opinion the matter be postponed for consideration to a full Meeting of the Committee.

3. Decided that a fee of one rupee be charged under section 5 of Ordinance No. 25 of 1901 for the registration of dogs.

4. Read letter from the Colonial Surgeon, No. 1 of January 4, 1904, reporting on the water hawked about the town and used for drinking. Resolved—That the Sanitary Officer be required to make a weekly inspection of the water casks and see that
