MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY:

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall; Kandy, on Saturday, January 30, 1904, at 8 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated January 26, 1904.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 22, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to December 31, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the

month of December, 1903.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Health Officer's report the formulated in the several statements. by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the

Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

Resolved—That the Statement of Receipts and Expenditure and Progress Report of Works be circulated, The following papers were laid on the table:-Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during December.

4. Return of burials in the general cemetery during six months ended December 31, 1903.
5. Correspondence.—Read the following:—

(a) Letter No. 40, dated December 29, from Colonial Secretary, making inquiries respecting assessment tax collections for 1903; also Chairman's letter No. 2 of 2nd instant in reply.

(b) Letter No. 1, dated January 12, from Colonial Secretary, respecting Gonawatte ferry approach on the north side of the river, stating that the repairs to landing stage should be paid for by the Council.

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(c) Letter No. 2, dated January 15, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of a letter to the Conservator of Forests, stating that the Government have no objection to his favouring the Council with a report on the afforestation of land in the vicinity of the reservoir.

Resolved - That the Conservator of Forests be asked to favour the Council with a report on the afforestation of the land within the catchment area of the reservoir on work already done, and any further recommendation for

guidance of the Council in future.

(d) Letter No. 3, dated January 15, from Colonial Secretary, requesting remittance to the Director of Public Works the Council's moiety for the purchase of a voltmeter. The Secretary reported that as requested Rs. 150 had been remitted to the Director of Public Works.

(e) Letter No. 4, dated January 15, from Colonial Secretary, intimating the sanction by the Governor of an

assessment tax of six per cent. during 1904.

(f) Letter No. 5, dated January 15, from Colonial Secretary, intimating the sanction by the Governor of the levy of taxes specified in the schedule during 1904.

(g) Letter No. 6, dated January 16, from Colonial Secretary, asking information regarding collection of assessment tax and water-rate during 1903; also Chairman's reply No. 8 of January 29.

(h) Letter No. 7, dated January 23, from Colonial Secretary, inviting attention to E No. 8 of July 21,

respecting the widening of a portion of the road from Lewella to Peradeniya.

After a short discussion, in which several Members took part, it was proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, that with reference to the correspondence just read, the suggested improvement of the road over the spill at the west end of the lake is approved, but that the removal of the steps, the felling of trees on the bund, construction of wall, and alteration of road in front of the Queen's Hotel should not be carried out.

On the motion being put to the Meeting the following votes were recorded:-

Ayes. Dr. Schokman. Mr. P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe. Mr. Tomalin. Mr. Beven. Mr. Jonklaas. Mr. Vanderwall. Mr. Sproule. Chairman.

Ayes, 6; Noes, 2. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

(i) Letter No. 1,163, dated December 30, from the Postmaster-General, stating that the pillar-boxes will be erected at the places named when they arrive from England.

Mr. Beven mentioned instances of neglect in clearing pillar-boxes.

6. Read letter No. 39, dated December 17, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that in view of the prohibitive cost of a complete scheme of drainage for the whole of Kandy it had been suggested that a modified scheme might be adopted, which should provide for the drainage of such parts of the town as are most in need of attention.

Resolved.—That the letter and connected correspondence be left with the Chairman for a further report.

7. Submitted application with connected papers and plan of site and plan and elevation of the proposed building, for a site in front of the Old Post Office, for a building for the use of the Young Women's Christian

Resolved that Government be informed that there is no objection to the proposed site, being portion of the land situated at Bogambra handed over to the Council in 1873, being leased for purpose of the Young Women's Christian Association for a term of 21 years, and renewable on the expiration of the said 21 years.

8. The Chairman reported that out of 170 applications for post of Chief Inspector he had made a preliminary

selection of 35.

He wished to make a further selection and to see the applicants, and would report his selection to the Council at next Meeting.

Under section 59 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 it would appear that the right of appointment lay with the Chairman,

the salary of Chief Inspector being under Rs. 100 per month.

It was proposed by Mr. Beven, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, that Council's opinion be obtained as to whether the appointment lies with the Chairman or the Council.

9. Considered recommendation of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, that the following

applications for house service pipes be recommended on the usual conditions:-

(1) P. M. Fernando, No. 186, Peradeniya road.
(2) V. Cathamuttupillai, No. 11, Peradeniya road.

Resolved—That the recommendation be adopted on the usual conditions.

- 10. The Meeting then proceeded to ballot for Members of the several Standing Committees under section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902. The Chairman declared the following Members to have been elected:-

 - (a) Law and General Subjects.—Messrs. Sproule, Beven, and Vanderwall.
 (b) Market and Sanitation.—Messrs. H. F. Tomalin, Jonklass, and Schoknam.

(c) Finance and Assessment.—Messrs. Gibbon, Beven, and Vanderwall.
(d) Municipal Works.—Messrs. Sproule, Gibbon, and Tomalin.

On proposal by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Beven, the following Members were appointed a Committee of Management in respect of the recreation grounds under rule 3:-The Chairman, Messrs. Gibbon, Tomalin, and Dr. Schokman.

12. The following Members were appointed to represent the Council on the Committee of the Kandy

Volunteer and Public Band:—Messrs. Gibbon and Jonklaas.

13. Petitions from (1) residents of Mapanawature, Wattarantenne, dated November 26, 1903; (2) residents of Dodanwala, Leula, Bahioawakande, dated November 27, 1903; and (3) residents of Mavilmada, dated January 23, 1904, respecting the claim made by the Council for the recovery of the consolidated rate (Police and Lighting) were submitted.

Resolved—That the petitioners be informed that the Council has no power to exempt any premises from the

tax or rate fixed by law.

14. On permission granted, it was proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Beven, that a cordial vote of thanks be recorded to Mr. Haughton in recognition of his services while Chairman, and that a copy of the resolution be sent to Mr. Haughton.

On being put to the Meeting the resolution was unanimously carried.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of December, 1903.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town has been satisfactorily carried out during this month.

Drainage.—The drains both surface and deep were kept clean, with the exception of the side drain in railway approach road, which I have many times reported upon.

Water Supply .- Good. See my analysis of November 12.

Alleys.—By the constant supervision of my Inspectors and self, kept as clean as possible.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—Well kept.
Bakeries.—Well kept.

Market.-Clean and well kept.

Cattle passed this Month.—Cattle, 469; buffaloes, 106; sheep, 153; goats, 277. Slaughter House and Exposing Shed.—Well kept.

Night Soil Depôt. -Well kent.

Cooly Lines.—All fairly well kept. Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health.—Good. No infectious disease has been prevalent during this month. There have been a few cases of murrain (foot-and-mouth disease) amongst the town cattle; these were isolated at once and put under native treatment, as their owners refused to carry out mine. January 16, 1904, there have been no fresh cases reported.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, December 11, 1903.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 5, 1903.

Present:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Mr. P. D. Khan; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Dr. A. Perry; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. L. Creasy; Mr. G. H. Alston; Mr. Chas. Perra; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; Dr. W. H. de Silva; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; and

The Minutes of November 6 and December 1, 1903, having been printed, and a copies thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of November 6 and December 1, 1903, be confirmed.

Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved-That Government be asked to allow the Municipal Council the services of Mr. Richards of the Govennment Printing Office for a further period of three months, on the same terms as before, in order to instruct the staff of the Municipal Printing Office in the use of the new machinery recently provided and to supervise the starting of the new Printing Office.

Mr. H. A. Jayawardene seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. F. C. Allen moved-That it is desirable to make an addition to chapter VII. of the new by-laws, after paragraphs 25 and 19, so as to have photographs of all licensed drivers and jinricksha pullers attached to their individual licenses as an additional means of identification.

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.—Carried.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. Tiruvilangam asked-Why the built open drains in Colombo are not flushed at

present with water?

The Chairman replied that it was due to the scarcity of the water supply during the year, and to the request of the Director of Public Works that the flushing of drains should be discontinued in consequence of that scarcity.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. Tiruvilangam moved-That the built open drains be flushed with water, and if Labugama water is not available, that they be finshed with water from the sea or the lake.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that the matter be referred to a joint Committee consisting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation and the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

Mr. F. C. Allen seconded. Whereupon Mr. Tiruvilangam withdrew his motion with leave of Council in

favour of the amendment which was carried.

Pursuant to notice, Mr. Chas. Perera moved... That in addition to the Agenda of the Meetings of Council, now sent to the press, printed documents referred to in the Agenda, except documents of a confidential character, be likewise sent to the newspapers for publication should they deem it necessary.
