MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, January 8, 1904.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated December 31, 1903.

Present :—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman ; Mr. P. D. Khan ; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton ; Major A. W. de Wilton ; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel ; Dr. A. Perry ; Mr. F. C. Allen ; Mr. L. Creasy ; Mr. G. H. Alston ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. James Peiris ; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen ; Dr. W. H. de Silva ; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam ; and Mr. M. Finlay.

The Minutes of December 11, 1903, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of December 11, 1903, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That Council do contribute, with the sanction of the Governor in Executive Council, a sum of Rs. 150 towards the cost of lighting York street on the occasion of His Excellency Sir West Ridgeway's departure from Ceylon.

Mr. M. Finlay seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the services of one of the three surveyors engaged in the assessment survey of Colombo be engaged on a salary of Rs. 150 a month from the termination of the assessment survey (in accordance with the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, dated April 21, 1903, and adopted by Council on May 1, 1903), and that the Chairman be authorized to select one of these three surveyors after consulting the Municipal Engineer and the Surveyor-General on the subject. The surveyor engaged to work under the Municipal Engineer's supervision.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting on the latter part of the motion.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the analytical work of the Council be given to Mr. Bamber at a fee of Rs. 6,000 a year (he being the only person who has tendered for it), subject to the following conditions:—

All the analytical work of the Council must be undertaken without charge beyond the annual fee.

The Analyst must undertake to attend in court when necessary to give evidence without charge beyond the annual fee.

Six months' notice on either side will be required for termination of the contract, and that the necessary provision be made in the Supplemental Budget.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. G. H. Alston moved—That Government be requested to amend section 48 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 by fixing the maximum of the Chairman's salary at such sum as will enable the appointment to be held, whenever considered advisable, by an officer of the First Class of the Ceylon Civil Service.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. H. de Silva moved—That a Committee be appointed to consider the nuisance caused in Colombo by the prevalence of dust at certain periods of the year and to report what steps should be taken, and with the permission of Council added the words "at the next Meeting of Council. The Committee to consist of the joint Committees of the Standing Committees on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation and Municipal Works" at the end of his motion.

Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That the "papers with reference to enteric fever at Pamankada" referred to in item 2 of the Minutes of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 17, 1903, be laid on the table and circulated among the Members for their information, and with leave of Council deleted the words "laid on the table and."

The motion as amended was seconded by the Chairman and was carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That all the correspondence with Government *re* the appointment of first Assistant Engineer, New Works, and third Assistant Engineer Mechanical Works, be laid on the table.

Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen seconded.

The Chairman moved as an amendment that the words "be circulated among the Members of Council" be substituted for the words "be laid on the table."

- (3) Committee on Finance and Assessment.—Mr. P. D. Khan, Mr. G. H. Alston, and Mr. M. Finlay.
- (4) Committee on Municipal Works.—Mr. L. Creasy, Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. H. A. Jayewardene.

Accordingly the above-named Members were elected to form, with the Chairman, the four Standing Committees for 1904.

9. The Chairman moved that the Special Committees on (1) overcrowding, (2) Colombo lake, (3) cost of modified Mansergh scheme, (4) flushing of drains be re-appointed.

10. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1903, and Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 17, 1903, were laid before the Council :—

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1903.

- (4) Estimate for bi-monthly weeding of Madampitiya cemetery, Rs. 86-40.
Approved. To be done next year.
- (2) Estimate for repairs to roads in Madampitiya cemetery, Rs. 112-14.
Approved. May be done next year.
- (7) Papers with reference to land purchased from Eastern Produce Company for widening Railway road. The Committee see no objection to the Eastern Produce Company being allowed to remain in possession of the land for such period after March 31, as may be found necessary by the Chairman, on payment of such rate of interest on the purchase money as may be agreed on between the Eastern Produce Company and the Chairman.
- (11) Papers with reference to the erection of a mortuary chapel at the Madampitiya Cemetery. The Committee approve the proposal to put up a mortuary chapel in accordance with the plan bearing Municipal Council's stamp of December 15, 1903. The cornices, however, are not secure as designed, and the design must be altered so as to make them secure.
- (13) Estimate for metalling Narahenpitiya road, Cemetery gate to night soil depôt, Rs. 2,647-35.
Approved. For next year.

- (4) Diaries of Medical Officer of Health.

The Committee, having conferred with the Medical Officer of Health, and having had explained the system of work in the Public Health Department, from which it appears that particulars of all inspections are noted in the Ward Inspectors' daily diaries (all of which pass through the hands of the Medical Officer of Health), and that these diaries, together with the papers in the office, form the foundation for the Medical Officer of Health's quarterly reports, in which there is a large fund of information regarding the work of the department during the quarter, are of opinion that the diary furnished by the Medical Officer of Health is unnecessary and should be discontinued, as any information with regard to any particular defects noticed by Members of Council can be found in the diaries of the Inspectors and the office papers, which will be at once furnished on application with regard to any particular case for which they are wanted.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1903, be adopted, subject to items 4, 5, and 13 being approved by the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

Dr. A. Perry moved—That this Council strongly disapproves of the unfounded insinuations contained in Mr. Chas. Perera's letter against the Medical Officer of Health in whose ability and integrity the Council has complete confidence, and by leave of the Council substituted the word "unsubstantiated" for "unfounded."

Dr. C. W. van Geysel seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

Council having resumed and Mr. Chas. Perera having unreservedly withdrawn any insinuations that are in his letter against the character and integrity of Dr. Philip, and having unreservedly apologized to Dr. Philip therefor, Dr. A. Perry moved that this Council record that it has complete confidence in the ability and integrity of Dr. Philip, the Medical Officer of Health.

Dr. C. W. van Geysel seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved—That the complaints appearing in Mr. Chas. Perera's letter against the working of the Public Health Department be referred to the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation.

Mr. G. H. Alston seconded.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene moved as an amendment that they be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Dr. A. Perry, Mr. G. H. Alston, Mr. James Pieris, and Mr. H. Tiruvilangam—three to form a quorum.
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman withdrew his motion in favour of the amendment, which was carried.

12. Letter No. 1,164 of December 18, 1903, from the Municipal Engineer, regarding the appointment of Assistant Municipal Engineer, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That an additional Engineer be engaged on an agreement; that the terms of the agreement be those in the annexure marked A²; and that this Council do empower the Hon. Mr. Francis A. Cooper, C.M.G., Director of Public Works, Ceylon, to select a person for the said post of Assistant Engineer, and to enter into the necessary agreement with him on behalf of this Council; and that the sum of £60 be placed to the credit of the Hon. Mr. Francis A. Cooper in the Hongkong and Shanghai Bank, Colombo, to meet the expenses of the passage out of the person appointed; and that if the Hon. Mr. Francis A. Cooper is unable to make the selection, he be authorized to nominate another person to make it and to enter into the necessary agreement.

Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.

Owing to the lateness of the hour the Chairman, with leave of Council, withdrew his motion, and moved that the matter be postponed to next Meeting of Council.

14. Memorandum from the Chief Clerk, asking for a vote of Rs. 260, amount short provided in 1903, on account cost of assessment surveys.

The Chairman moved—That the vote be sanctioned and included in the first Supplemental Budget.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

15. Papers with reference to the appointment of a Superintendent to the Fire Brigade were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the matter be postponed to next Meeting of Council.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

16. Papers with reference to the appointment of two Inspectors to inspect dairies and laundries were laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That Council, as an experiment, do authorize the Government Agent, Western Province (he being willing to undertake the supervision of dairies and laundries outside Municipal limits), to engage an officer on a salary of Rs. 1,200 per annum to make the necessary inspections under the Government Agent's directions—the appointment to be a non-pensionable one, and to be terminable by three months' notice on either side.
