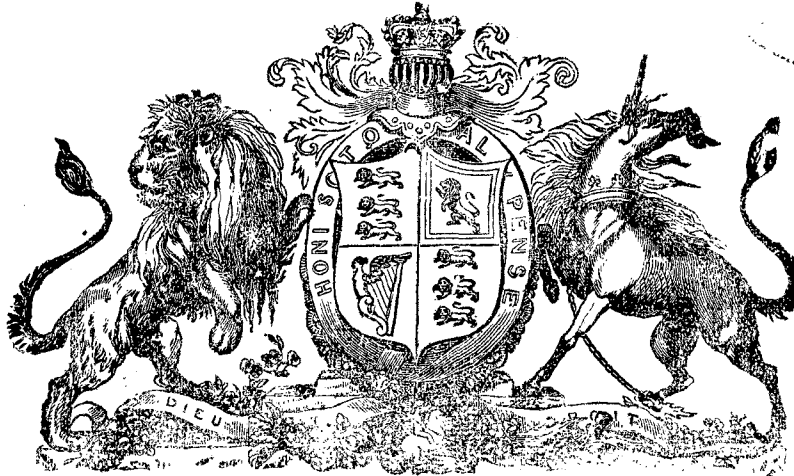

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

Rules of the District Committee, Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, Kalutara, made under section 12 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889, and sanctioned by the Provincial Committee, Colombo, under section 5 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1895.

(A).

1. Two members of the District Committee shall form a *quorum*.
2. When a vacancy occurs in the Committee the remaining members of the Committee shall elect a suitable person to fill such vacancy.
3. In the absence of the President one of the members present shall be elected to preside; he shall have for the time being all the rights and privileges vested in the President.

(B).

4. The meetings shall be convened by the President, and shall be held at such time and at such place within the district after due notice thereof to the members.
5. The proceedings of the meetings shall be entered in a book specially kept for the purpose.

(C).

6. Trustees shall enter in detail in a book specially kept for the purpose all income received by them in respect of any temple, and shall likewise enter all expenditure in a separate book.

(D).

7. Whenever a school is opened in connection with a temple the Committee shall appoint a manager to be in charge of such school.
