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## PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS the port of Colombo was brought within the operation of the Master's Attendants Ordinance, No. 6 of 1865, by a Proclamation dated the Sixth day of January, One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty-six:

And whereas by section 6 of the said Ordinance, it is enacted that the Governor may, from time to time, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, frame and establish such port rules, not inconsistent with the said Ordinance, as he may think necessary for any of the purposes in the several sub-sections of the said section specified:

And whereas the Governor in Executive Council has, from time to time framed and established certain port rules in respect of the said port for the purposes of the said Ordinance, that is to say, the Port Rules proclaimed on June 15, 1900, May 2, 1901, June 20, 1902, October 24, 1902, and July 10, 1903, respectively:

And whereas it is expedient that an additional port rule should be framed and established, and that rule 8 of Section III. of the rules proclaimed on June 15, 1900, should be revoked, and another rule be framed instead thereof for the said Port of Colombo:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke Port Rule 8 of section III. of the rules proclaimed on June 15, 1900, and do establish the port rules set forth in the schedule hereto for the said Port of Colombo, and We do further promulgate the said rules to take effect as from and after the 20th day of June, 1904:

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twentieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Four.

## GOD SAVE THE KING.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### Section I.

11. All native vessels entering the Port shall proceed straight to the anchorage for native vessels, and if, after inspection by the P rt Surgeon, any vessel is held to be infected or suspected of epidemic diseases, she will be immediately taken in tow by the Government Tug and berthed as directed by the Master Attendant.

#### Section III.

8. No centractor or other person shall discharge logs of timber from any vessel within the port over the side into the water for the purpose of being floated ashore, unless the special permission in writing of the Master Attendant shall have been obtained therefor, wherein shall be set forth the measures required by the Master Attendant for preventing such timber becoming a source of danger or impediment to the navigation of the harbour; and any failure on the part of the contractor or such other person to fulfil any such measures shall be deemed a breach of this rule.

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of March 26, 1900, for officers in the Fourth and Fifth Classes of the Civil Service will also be held on July 18, 1904, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.
