By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

## HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by section 8 of the Road Ordinance, No. 10 of 1861, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that any road, canal, or river shall be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such road, canal, or river shall, from the time specified in such Proclamation, be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road between Kandapola and Uda Pussellawa in the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province, known as the Kandapola-Uda Pussellawa road, a principal thoroughfare:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, acting with the advice aforesaid, do by this our Proclamation declare that the said road between Kandapola and Uda Pussellawa in the District of Nuwara Eliya, Central Province, known as the Kandapola-Uda Pussellawa road, shall for the purposes of the said Ordinance be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare as from and after the First day of January, One thousand Nine hundred and Four.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this First day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Four.

W HEREAS by section 13 (1) of the Ordinance No. 6 of 1899, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Law relating to Inquiries into Shipping Casualties and the conduct of Ships' Officers," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, make general rules from time to time for carrying into effect the provisions relating to formal investigations, and in particular with respect to the appointment and summoning of assessors, and (2) that all rules made under the provisions of the said section shall be laid before the Legislative Council if then in session, and, if not then in session then so soon as possible after the commencement of the next session, and if within forty days after their being so laid before the Legislative Council any of such rules be objected to by the Legislative Council, the said Council may by resolution annul any such rules, and (3) that such rules as shall not be so annulled by the said Council within the usual forty days shall be proclaimed in the Government Gazette and shall come into force upon the publication thereof, or on such other day as may be specified in such Proclamation:

And whereas certain rules were made on the 20th day of April, 1900, and proclaimed in the Government Gazette of the same date:

And whereas the amended rule set out in the schedule hereto, which is intended to be substituted for the rule relating to Mercantile Marine Masters in Part II. of the Appendix to the said rules of April 20, 1900, was laid before the Legislative Council, and has not been annulled by the said Council within the said period of forty days, and it is expedient to proclaim the said amended rule:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by the said section of the said Ordinance and of every other power in that behalf enabling Us, do hereby proclaim that the rule set forth in the schedule hereto shall be substituted for the rule appearing in the Appendix II. to the rules of the 20th day of April, 1900, under the title "Class I. Mercantile Marine Masters," and declare that the same shall come into force as from and after the First day of June, 1904.

#### SCHEDULE.

#### Class 1.—Mercantile Marine Masters.

(a) Three years' service as a master in the merchant service and five years' service with a master's certificate of competency, of which two years must have been service in command of a sailing ship.

(b) Three years' service as a master in the merchant service and five years' service with a master's certificate of competency, of which two years must have been service in command of a steamship.

The Master Attendant, Colombo, shall be ex officio a nautical assessor in this class.

WHEREAS by section 38 of "The Estate Roads Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that in any case in which a road or portion of a road has been constructed or partially constructed, or shall after the coming into operation of the said Ordinance be constructed by the proprietors of any estates, it shall be lawful for the proprietors for the time being of such estates to apply to the Governor that such road may be treated as a road constructed under the said Ordinance, and that on receipt of such application the Governor may, if he thinks fit, issue a Proclamation declaring that such road shall be treated as a road made under the said Ordinance:

And whereas a road from Gampola to Dolosbage in the Central Province has been constructed by the proprietors of the following estates, namely, Cooroondoowatta, Hapugahawatta, Jak Tree Hill, Meddegodda, and Somerset:

And whereas such proprietors have applied to the Governor that such road be treated as a road constructed under the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient that the said road shall be treated as a road made under "The Estate Roads Ordinance, 1902."

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby declare that the said road from Gampola to Dolosbage in the Central Province shall, as from and after the First day of January, 1904, be treated as a road made under "The Estate Roads Ordinance, 1902."

By-laws referred to.

1. No burial or cremation of any person dying within the limits of the Local Board of Gampola shall take place except in a cemetery duly proclaimed under Ordinance No. 9 of 1899, or on premises specially registered as a burial or cremation ground in the

office of the Local Board of Gampola.

2. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial or cremation ground shall apply in writing to the Local Board of Gampola to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper, if any, of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and the duties of such keeper.

3. If no such keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial or cremation ground is made shall be held to be the

keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of regulations.

4. The Local Board of Gampola will have the power to reject any application for registration of a burial or cremation ground, when it considers that such ground is objectionable for the purpose of burial or cremation of dead bodies.

5. When the Local Board of Gampola is of opinion that a registered burial or

cremation ground is objectionable, it shall order such ground to be closed. No burial or cremation shall take place within such ground thereafter. Provided that thirty days notice of such order be given in writing to the person in charge of such ground.

6. The Local Board of Gampola will keep a register of all the burial and cremation grounds within the limits of the Board.

7. No grave shall be less than 6 ft. in depth or at a less distance than 2 ft. from another. No grave shall be re-opened within a year, nor vault within six months, from the date of last interment.

8. It shall be the duty of every keeper of a burial or cremation ground to keep the same clean and in good order, to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Local Board.

9. The cemetery-keeper or the person in charge of a registered burial or cremation

ground shall not permit, under any pretext whatsoever, a burial within such grounds without the production of a certificate of a notice of death from a registrar under section 32 (1), of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, or in the case of a death occurring on an estate, an authority from the superintendent of such estate in the form O in the second schedule of the Births and Deaths Ordinance, No. 1 of

1895, section 32 (e).

10. It shall be the duty of the keeper of any burial or cremation ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is keeper on the proper standard form (G. A.—M 20). Such forms may be obtained on application to

the Local Board.

11.
