"PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Henry Arthur Blake, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

HEREAS by section 31 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to declare that the provisions of the said section and of the five sections following thereafter of the said Ordinance shall come into operation in any town, district, or place on a date to be fixed by such Proclamation, and that every such Proclamation shall define the limits of the town, district, or place within which the said sections shall come into operation, and that it shall be lawful for the Governor, in like manner, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time to amend, alter, or revoke such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the aforesaid sections of the Ordinance into operation in the town or place named in the achedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby declare that the provisions of the said section 31 and of the five sections following thereafter of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895 shall come into operation as from and after the First day of July,

One thousand Nine hundred and Four, in the town or place mentioned in the schedule hereto, and We do hereby further define the limits of the said town or place within which the provisions of the said sections of the said Ordinance shall come into operation to be those set out in the said schedule.

Whenever the Government Agent shall forward an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance to Government, together with his report as to the necessity for locating a police force in any district, and as to the number of men to compose such force, and the amount in money required for its upkeep, it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to establish a police force in such district from such time as shall be therein named, and to introduce therein such of the clauses of the said Ordinance as the Governor and Council shall consider expedient:

And whereas the Government Agent of the Central Province did forward to Government an application of the nature described in sections 15 and 16 of the said Ordinance, together with his report as to necessity for locating a police force in the district of Maturata, in the Central Province, and as to the number of men to compose such force, and the amount in money required for its upkeep as required by the said section 17 of the said Ordinance:

W HEREAS by section 6 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," as amended by section 2 of "The Births and Deaths Registration Amendment Ordinance, 1900," it is among other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by notification in the Government Gazette, to divide the several Provinces in the Island into such and so many divisions for the purposes of the registration of births and deaths as shall appear expedient, and such divisions or any of them at any time, with the like advice, to amend, alter, or abolish:

And whereas by notifications bearing dates 1st July, 1899, 18th July, 1901, 19th December, 1901, 2nd June, 1902, 23rd February, 1903, 7th July, 1903, 10th December, 1903, and 5th March, 1904, in the Government Gazette, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, divided the several Provinces of the Island for the registration of births and deaths into the divisions specified in the schedules to the said notifications:

And whereas it appears expedient to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to amend and alter some of the said divisions:

The purchaser will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4:50 per gallon.
