## DRAFT ORDINANCE

## MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

> An Ordinance to amend "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865."

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to amend in certain parti-VV culars "The Masters Attendant's Ordinance, 1865;" hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance:" Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 The Ordinance may be cited as "The Masters Attendant's (Amendment) Ordinance, 1904," and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and the Ordinances amending the same shall be read and construed as one Ordinance, and may be cited together as "The Masters Attendant's Ordinances, 1865 to 1904."

2 After sub-section 13 of section 6 of the principal Ordinance, the following sub-section shall be added and shall be numbered (13 A):—

Prohibition of removal of coal by unlicensed persons. (13 A) For prohibiting the collection or removal of any coal which may be washed ashore or found within the limits of any such port except by duly licensed persons, and for granting licenses for the collection and removal of such coal.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE Draft Ordinance is introduced to meet the complaint that port authorities have no legal power, under the existing law, to prevent unauthorized persons from collecting on their own account the coal which falls overboard from vessels and lighters when discharging coal.

2. The Draft Ordinance empowers the Governor in Executive Council, by means of port rules, to prohibit the collection or removal of coal washed ashore or found in ports to which the Masters Attendant's Ordinance applies except by licensed persons, and to provide for the granting of licenses. The section will enable rules to be framed legalizing arrangements, like that in force at the port of Colombo, by which derelict coal is collected for the benefit of the importers.
