MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, February 19, 1904.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 13, 1904.

Present :—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman ; Mr. P. D. Khan ; Major A. W. de Wilton ; Dr. C. W. van Geysel ; Mr. F. C. Allen ; Mr. L. Creasy ; Mr. G. H. Alston ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. James Peiris ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; Dr. W. H. de Silva ; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam ; and Mr. M. Finlay.

The Minutes of January 8, 1904, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of January 8, 1904, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the new Gas Inspector, Mr. Barber, be a Member of the Staff of the Municipal Works Department.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether the Chairman had written to Government requesting the amendment of section 48 of the Municipal Ordinance with reference to the raising of the Chairman's salary to that of a Civil Servant of the First Class.

The Chairman replied in the affirmative.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That the correspondence with reference to the raising of the Chairman's salary to that of a Civil Servant of the First Class be laid on the table.

Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded.—Carried. The Chairman stated that it will be done when the correspondence has been printed and circulated to Council.

4. The motion standing in the name of Mr. C. Perera "that the Electrical Adviser's report on Tram Cars be circulated among the Members," was with leave of Council withdrawn.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That the letter dated January 8, 1904, from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, be referred to the Electrical Adviser for his information and report, and that the papers with his report be circulated among the Members.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

6. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 11 and 25, 1904, Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of January 12 and 26, 1904, Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of January 20, 1904, and Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of January 21 and February 16, 1904, were laid before the Council :—

Approved. Funds should be provided.

The Committee recommend that Council grant Messrs. Delmege, Forsyth & Co. the concession asked for, on the terms already allowed in connection with their petroleum pipe line (copy annexed marked C). The rental should be Rs. 25 per annum.

ANNEXURE C.

The Standing Committee recommend that the concession asked for should be given on the following conditions :—

- (1) Payment of a rental of Rs. 25 per annum in advance on January 5 in each year.
 - (2) The Council retain the right, in the event of its being deemed by the Council necessary in the public interest, to require the entire removal of the pipes within twelve months of their giving notice to this effect, and in case of any difference of opinion arising between the Council and Messrs. Delmege, Forsyth & Co., as to whether the entire removal of the pipes is necessary in the public interest, the matter shall be referred to the arbitration of His Excellency the Governor, and that His Excellency's decision in such case shall be final.
 - (3) The Council retain the right to require the entire removal of the pipes within twelve months of their giving notice to this effect.
 - (4) The undertakers to agree at their own expense to deviate the line of pipes or to suspend their use in such manner and to such extent and for such periods as the Chairman may from time to time require for the construction, maintenance, or repair of any work of a public nature, whether carried out by the Government, the Municipal Council, or any other persons whatsoever.
 - (5) The undertakers to indemnify the Council against any claim for loss or damage, directly or indirectly, arising to person or property from the existence of or use of the pipes or other materials laid under this concession.
 - (6) The undertakers to have no claim against the Council for any damage caused to their pipes and other property by reason of the traffic in the streets or the construction, maintenance, and repair of any public work. Construction, maintenance, and repair is to include the use of steam rollers as well as all other means.
 - (7) All works of construction, maintenance, and repair to be carried out and completed in every respect to the requirement and satisfaction of the Municipal Engineer, and the undertakers to observe, as far as they are applicable, sections 49 and 50 of the Council's rules for the laying of electric mains.
 - (8) Detailed plans on a scale of one chain to the inch, and sections on a scale of one chain to the inch horizontal and ten feet to the inch vertical to be supplied to the Council by the undertakers on mounted drawing paper, and to be approved by the Chairman before any work is commenced. Detailed drawings showing the nature and arrangement of the air valves to be submitted by the undertakers and approved by the Chairman.
- All air valves and draw off valves to be provided with locked covers, and no oil to be drawn off in the public streets without the permission of the Municipal Engineer.

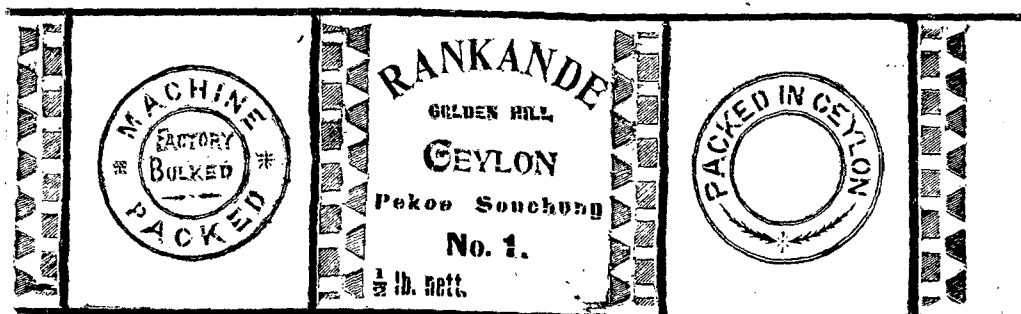
