Japan—Niki (Inland Sea)—Simonoseki Strait, Eastern Approach—Alteration in Buoyage.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 71, dated February 27, 1904, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has giving further notice (No. 129 of 1904) that the buoyage in the eastern approach to Simonoseki strait has been altered as follows:—

(a) The black conical buoy, situated at a distance of  $3\frac{2}{3}$  miles S. 23° W. from Misaki, Motoyama bay, has been replaced by a light buoy, painted black, exhibiting a white occulting light every nine seconds, thus: light five seconds, eclipse four seconds.

Approximate position: lat. 33° 52½' N., long. 131° 14½' E.

(b) A conical buoy painted red and surmounted by a triangle has been moored off the south-east extreme of Naka no su, in a position from which He saki light bears S. 27° W., distant one mile, and Kanabuse light N. 89° W.

(c) A light buoy painted red exhibiting a white occulting light every six seconds, thus: light four seconds, eclipse two seconds, has been moored off the north-east extreme of Naka no su, in a position from which He saki light bears S. 27° W., distant 13 cables, and Kanabuse light S. 84° W.

(d) The conical buoy painted white and red in horizontal bands, marking the eastern end of Naka no su, situated with He saki light bearing S. 21° W., distant 11 cables, has been withdrawn.

Approximate position: He saki light, lat. 33° 57½' N., long. 131° 1¼' E.

*China, East Coast—Shungtung—Kyau Chau Approach—Buoyage altered—Fog Signal discontinued.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 276, dated August 14, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 132 of 1904) that the under-mentioned alterations have been made in the buoyage of the approach to Kyau Chau:—

- (a) A whistle buoy, painted red and marked "Ju nui san" has been moored in a depth of 12 fathoms in a position from which Ju nui san (Yu nui san) lighthouse bears N.  $45^{\circ}$  E., distant 5 cables, and the northern extremity of Chi po san N.  $57^{\circ}$  W.
- (b) The red spar buoy, situated 14 cables S.  $60^{\circ}$  E. from Ilitis peninsula marking north shoal, has been replaced by a whistle buoy, painted red and marked N.F.

*Eastern Archipelago—Borneo, North Coast—Marudu Bay—Non-existence of Rock.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 133 of 1904) that he has made a very careful search for the rock, marked doubtful on the Charts and shown at a distance of 5 miles N.  $69^{\circ}$  E. from the eastern point of Melow island in the approach to Kudat bay. The ship was anchored in 13 fathoms in the supposed position, and soundings of not less than 12 fathoms were obtained for a distance of one mile around her in all directions without finding any indication of a shoal, nor was any discoloured water observed from the masthead. The fishermen and local authorities at Kudat, who are intimately acquainted with Marudu bay, know nothing of the existence of any danger hereabouts.

The above-mentioned rock, which was not seen by H. M. S. Egeria in 1889, was inserted on the Charts from old documents, which probably were not very reliable; it has therefore now been expunged from the Admiralty publications.

*Pacific Ocean—The Philippine Islands—Luzon—Manila Bay—Caballo Island Light—Its Description given.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 134 of 1904) that the light established on Caballo island, Manila bay, is white fixed, elevated 95 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles from the bearing of S.  $5^{\circ}$  W. through west and north to N.  $23^{\circ}$  E., but obscured in other directions; it is shown from a white cylindrical tower about 11 ft. high, and is of the 6th order.

*Australia, Gulf of Carpentaria—Norman Bar—Removal of Lightship.*

The Port Master, Brisbane, has given notice (No. 3 of 1904) that on and after March 1, 1904, the light exhibited from the lightship Norman Bar will be discontinued and the Lightship removed.

The existing leading lights for entering the Norman river will remain as usual, and arrangements have been made that on each arrival of the mail steamer a light will be exhibited from the masthead of a lighter moored at the anchorage.

*Australia, South—Spencer Gulf—Shoalwater Point—Buoy established.*

The following amended Notice to Mariners (No. 10 of 1903) issued by the President, Marine Board, Port Adelaide, is re-published for general information in substitution of this office No. 56, dated February 12, 1904:—

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others are hereby informed that a large buoy, painted black, with staff and diamond-shaped head, has been placed in 18 fms. O. L. W., with Shoalwater point bearing N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., distant two and a half miles.

Approximate position: lat.  $33^{\circ} 42' 20''$  South, long.  $137^{\circ} 15' 15''$  East.

Mariners navigating Spencer Gulf north of Tipara Shoal are cautioned against making too free with the western shore, as between Frankling Harbour and Point Lowly the shoal water extends in several places from one and a half mile to four miles from the shore line, which in many places is very low and often distorted by mirage.

Vessels beating up or down the Gulf against strong head winds are therefore cautioned to keep about the middle of the Gulf, towards the Middle Bank Lightship, which may be passed close to. They may also anchor anywhere north of Tipara Shoal and await a slant of wind.

*Japan, East Coast—Houshu—Yamada Harbour—Amended Depth on One Sho.*

*Eastern Archipelago—Straits Settlements—Strait of Malacca—Kwala Klang (Port Swettenham)—Bar formed—Depth alongside Wharves.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 149 of 1904) that a bar has formed across the northern entrance to Kwala Klang (Port Swettenham), and that the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ -fathom

shoal shown on the Charts in that entrance does not exist. The exact position of this bar is not known, but the depths over its southern part are from 17 to 18 ft., and over the northern part from 20 to 22 ft.

The wharves in the harbour are difficult of access on account of the cross currents, and silting has reduced the depth alongside them all, so that now only 14 ft. can be relied on.

*China Sea—Gulf of Siam—Pulo Obi—Light exhibited.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 168 of 1904) that on January 1, 1904, a white flashing light every five seconds, elevated 984 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 40 miles, would be established in a square tower of light gray granite, about 49 ft. high, erected on the eastern summit of Pulo Obi. The duration of the flash is under one-tenth of a second. At a distance of 8 miles from the island the light is obscured by the land between the bearings of N. 39° E. and N. 53° E., as the light is approached this obscured arc increases.

*Africa, South-East Coast—Penge River—Mascuti Point—Provisional Light established—Fog Signal.*

With reference to notice to Mariners No. 377, dated November 21, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 170 of 1904) that further information has been received from H. B. M. Consul at the Port of Beira that on January 2, 1904, a white flashing light every nine seconds, elevated about 100 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 16 miles, was established in a lighthouse, painted in black and white horizontal bands, erected eastward of Mascuti point, in the approach to Beira, in a position from which point Jea light bears N. 80° W., distant 3¾ miles, and the two conspicuous trees N. 13° E.

This light is provisional and will be replaced by one of greater power.

A fog horn, worked by compressed air, has also been established, and will be sounded in thick or foggy weather.

reported.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 178 of  
1904) that information, dated January 21, 1904, has  
been received from Commander S. St. J. Farquhar,  
H.M.S. Vestal, that when his vessel was steering to the  
north-eastward off the north coast of Formosa, about

10 miles N. 65° W. from Foki Kaku, a sounding of 11  
fathoms, rocky bottom, was obtained in approximately  
lat. 25° 22½' N., long. 121° 21½' E., at the same time  
breakers were observed at a distance of about 1½ or  
2 miles to the south eastward.

Thick weather prevailed at the time, so that no  
bearings were obtained, and the position, depending on  
the reckoning, must be considered doubtful.

It must also be considered doubtful whether what was  
seen was a breaker over a danger, or merely an overfall  
caused by a tide rip over part of the foul ground.
