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MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, February 20, 1904, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated February 16, 1904.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; H. F. Tomalin, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 30, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1903 to January 31, 1904, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of January.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during January.

4. Auditor's report, dated January 29, was submitted.

Resolved—That the report and connected papers be circulated.

5. *Correspondence.*—The following letters were submitted and read :—

(a) Letter No. 8, dated February 2, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that the Conservator of Forests will be glad to report on the afforestation of the land within the catchment area of the reservoir.

(b) Letter No. 9, dated February 8, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that the suggestion to keep the voltmeter at the Municipal Office is approved.

(c) Letter dated February 11, from Mr. S. Haughton, thanking the Council for the vote of thanks recorded by them in recognition of his services as Chairman.

6. Revised by-laws of the Kandy Municipality were submitted by Special Committee.

Resolved—That the revised by-laws be circulated and brought up at the next Meeting for final consideration.

7. In accordance with the resolution under Minute 8 of the Meeting held on January 30, Council's opinion had been obtained as to whether the appointment of Chief Inspector lies with the Chairman or the Council. The papers had been circulated and seen by all the Members.

The Chairman intimated that he had appointed Inspector P. Senanayaka to be Chief Inspector, and Mr. C. D. M. Wickramatunga (clerk and storekeeper) a subordinate Inspector.

8. Draft lease of the site for a term of 21 years, in front of the old Post Office, for a building for the Young Women's Christian Association, submitted by Mr. H. P. Borrett, Proctor, was laid on the table, and had been approved of by Messrs. Sproule and Vanderwall.

Resolved—That the draft lease be approved of with addition of a clause that the cutting of any trees be prohibited, without the permission in writing of the Chairman, and that it be forwarded to the Secretary of the Young Women's Christian Association for purpose of being completed and prepared for signature.

9. Read letter dated February 10, from Mr. P. F. Toussaint, late Chief Inspector, complaining that the Secretary had "taken upon himself to send official papers, or to convey information" to the Resident Engineer, Northern Railway, in order to prevent his getting employment.

Read explanation by the Secretary and letters from Mr. Oliver.

Resolved—That Mr. Toussaint be informed that the Council is satisfied he has no cause of complaint against the Secretary on account of his discontinuance from employment by Mr. Oliver.

Carried unanimously.

10. In accordance with notice Mr. Gibbon asked the following questions :—

(1) When will horse, carriage, and cart traffic be available across the Mahaweli-ganga; and the connecting roads be completed between the ferry and main roads?

Reply.—On February 22.

(2) What action is the Chairman of the Municipality taking to recoup from Government the loss to the Municipality through traffic across the Mahaweli-ganga being stopped along the Peradeniya satinwood bridge, and the toll renter not being able to collect tolls?

Reply.—The Chairman stated that as Chairman he had not as yet taken steps in the manner indicated. As Government Agent, after a recent visit, he had made representation to Government regarding the inconvenience to the public and the loss sustained by the Council through the hasty closing of the bridge by the Public Works Department, and the consequent cessation of recoveries of the toll thereon.

(3) When will these (new pillar boxes) be available to the public of Kandy?

Reply.—In letter of December 30, the Postmaster-General stated that "pillar boxes will be erected at the places named when they arrive from England."

Resolved—That the attention of the Postmaster-General be invited to the delay, and he be asked when the pillar boxes are likely to be received.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of January, 1904.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month. The scavenger should be told to pay more attention to the "traps" over the side drains, particularly during these heavy rains, which carry all kinds of refuse into the deeper drains and might give trouble later on in the dry season.

Drainage.—The drains have been kept clean and well flushed owing to the rains which fell during the month.

Water Supply.—Good and sufficient.

Alleys.—Kept as clean as such alleys can be. Please see my many reports.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—Well kept.

Bakeries.—Well kept.

Market.—Clean and well kept.

Cattle passed during the Month.—Cattle, 490; buffaloes, 116; sheep, 143; goats, 265.

Slaughter House and Exposing Shed.—Well kept.

Night Soil Depot.—Well kept.

Cooly Lines.—All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General Health.—Good. A few cases of chickenpox and three cases of enteric fever were reported and visited by me. Every precaution was taken, and the Ward Inspector instructed to visit and see that my orders were carried out.

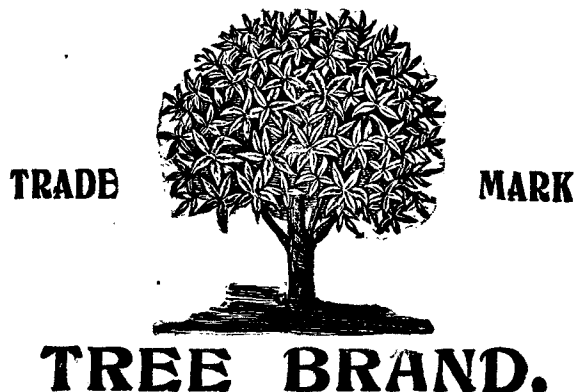

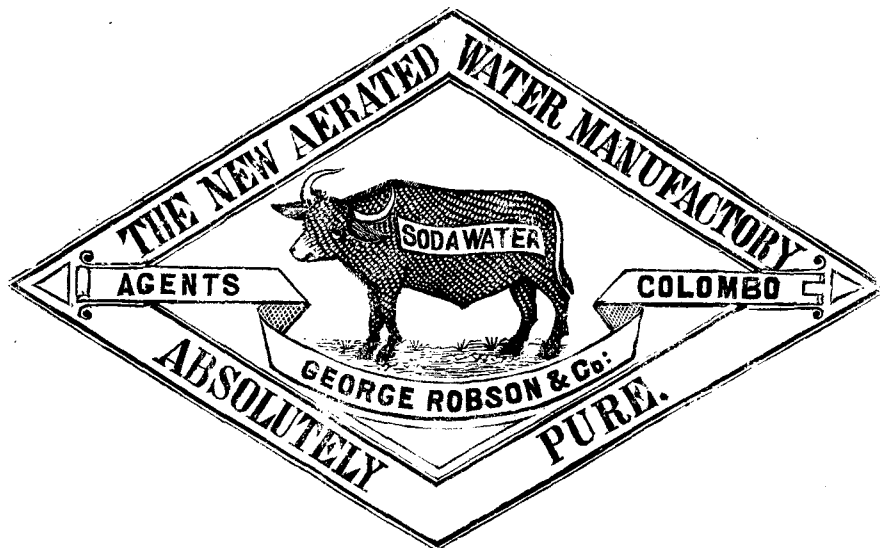
