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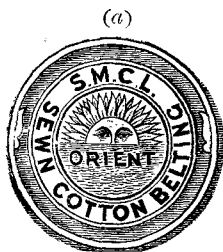

*India—West Coast—Wreck at Beypore.*

Information has been received from the Port Officer, Calicut, that a small sunken buggalow, with a stump of a mast at present standing and visible, lies in  $3\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms of water at L. W. ordinary springs, off Beypore. Approximate position of the danger is with Beypore flagstaff bearing E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. and the new Calicut Lighthouse N.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. (magnetic) from the wreck.

It is expected that the vessel will break up and disappear during the monsoon.

Yakataishi Rock—Light established.*

*Pacific Ocean, South—Royal Company's Islands—  
Non-existence of, reported.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 252 of 1904) that on old Charts of the South Pacific Ocean, in the area south of Australia, a group of islands, named Royal Company's islands, are marked as existing in lat.  $50^{\circ} 20' S.$ , long.  $143^{\circ} 0' E.$  They have consequently been inserted for many years in the Admiralty publications.

These islands are not mentioned in any Sailing Directions, the original report of their existence cannot be traced, nor have they apparently been seen by any passing vessel.

Since 1890 the Hydrographic Department of the Admiralty has been collecting data showing where ice and icebergs may be met with in the southern oceans, and this has necessitated plotting the tracks of many vessels passing south of Australia, several of which have passed over, or close to, the position assigned to the Royal Company's islands without seeing them or any sign of land near them:—thus in 1892 the *Pakeha* passed one mile north of their assigned position; in 1893 the *Crusader* passed 5 miles north of them; in 1894 the *Rangatira* passed 15 miles north of them; in 1895 the *Maori* passed  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles south and the *Bangatira* 15 miles

south of them; in 1899 the Rangatira passed 1 mile south of them and the Matatua 2 miles north; in 1900 the Matatua passed over the position in which they are supposed to be situated; in 1901 the Karamea passed 40 miles south of them; and in 1902 the Pakeha passed 12 miles south of them.

As no certain information is available as to why these islands were originally placed on the Charts, and as it is evident from the tracks plotted that no land exists in the locality in which they are marked on the Charts, they have now been expunged from the Admiralty publications.

*Australia, West—Geographe Bay—Cape Naturaliste—Light established.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 356, dated October 31, 1903, issued by this office the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 253 of 1904) that on April 15, 1904, a white group flashing dioptric light showing groups of two flashes every ten seconds, thus: flash, one-tenth of a second; eclipse, two and six-tenths of a second; flash, one-tenth of a second; eclipse, seven and two-tenths of a second will be established in a gray stone tower, 62 ft. high, constructed in a position about a mile S. 67° E. from the extremity of Cape Naturaliste. The light will be elevated 404 ft. above high water and visible in clear weather from a distance of 29 miles; it will be obscured over the land from the bearing of N. 20° E., through north, to N. 63° W.

*Africa North-east—Red Sea, Western Shore—Massawa Channel—Intended Alteration in lighting—Buoy.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 254 of 1904) that it is intended to make the under-mentioned alteration in the lighting of the Massawa channel:—

1. Difnein island.—The white fixed light on this island will be replaced by a white flashing light every five seconds, with a red sector, exhibited from an iron tower 114 ft. high.

2. Madote island.—A white fixed light, visible from a distance of 10 miles, will be established on a framework support, 35 ft. high, now being constructed on this island.

3. Shumma island.—The white fixed light on this island will be increased in power, and be visible from a distance of 16 miles; it will be established on an iron tower 72 ft. high.

4. Shab Shakhs.—It is intended to establish a white flashing light every five seconds on the extremity of this reef.

5. Ras Mudir.—It is intended to establish a fixed white light, visible about 16 miles from an iron tower, 72 ft. in height on Ras Mudir, south side of entrance to Mussawa.

Also that the black can buoy marking Mujunia reef has sunk, and will not be replaced.

*New Zealand—North Island, West Coast—Kaipara Bar—Channel altered.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 257 of 1904) that the black and white beacons on North sand spit, Kaipara harbour, in line, now lead over the shoalest part of the bar, they will therefore be removed.

A new channel half a mile wide, in which there are depths ranging from 4½ to 7 fathoms at low water; has opened out through North spit; it is intended to erect leading beacons to mark this channel, but in the meantime it may be used by keeping a large grassy patch (the only one in the vicinity), situated about six-tenths of a cable S. 22° E. from the lighthouse, in line with the lighthouse flagstaff N. 52° E.; this will lead through the new channel in a depth of not less than 4½ fathoms at low-water ordinary springs. The soundings being irregular the sea will probably break heavily in westerly gales in this channel.

*Japan—Naikai Inland Sea—Hirosima Approach—Nishinogoban sho—Beacon constructed—Light established.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 280, dated August 21, 1903, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 291 of 1904) that a conical beacon, painted red, the upper portion being iron and the lower stone, has been constructed on a 2½ fathoms patch, named Nishinogoban sho, situated about 14 cables S. 45° W. from the south-western point of Kurahasi sima in the approach to Hirosima, and that on March 10 a flashing light every ten seconds, elevated 50 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles, showing red from the bearing of S. 83° W., through west, to N. 44° W., and white in other directions, would be established on this beacon.
