## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the  
Municipal Office on Friday, April 15, 1904.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated April 9, 1904.

*Present*:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Mr. P. D. Khan; Dr. C. W. van Geysel; Mr. G. H. Alston; Mr. P. D. Warren; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; Dr. W. H. de Silva; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam; and Mr. M. Finlay.

The Minutes of March 18, 1904, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of March 18, 1904, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. Jayewardene asked—Why the services of Mr. Ondatje as Municipal Magistrate were discontinued, and moved for papers, and with leave of Council amended his motion by substituting for the words “for papers” the words “that the papers on the subject be circulated among the Members of Council.”

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.

The Chairman stated that as regards the question he was unable to answer it, as the Municipal Magistrate was appointed and removed by Government, and not by the Council.

The motion was then carried.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That Dr. W. H. de Silva be appointed to the Special Committee on Mr. Chas. Perera's letter with reference to the Public Health Department in place of Mr. James Peiris, resigned.

Mr. H. A. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

(Mr. Chas. Perera left the room during the discussion of the motion, returning after it was disposed of).

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That he be authorized to require the production of title deeds of premises Nos. 49, 50, 51, 53, 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, and 59, Hulftsdorp street, required in connection with an alleged encroachment, and with leave of Council amended the motion by adding thereto "and also the production of the title deeds of the premises Nos. 50A, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, 96, 97, 98, and 99."

Mr. H. Tiruvilangam seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman withdrew his motion by leave of Council, as no Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works was held on April 14.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. M. Finlay moved—That this Council do pass a vote of thanks to the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., for his services in connection with the applications received for the post of Works Engineer.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. Perera retired during the discussion of the motion.

6. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 22, 1904, and Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904, were laid before the Council:—

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 22, 1904.

- (12) Application from cooly, slaughter-house, Dematagoda, Sevathean, for increase of pay.  
Approved the raising to Rs. 12.50 a month of coolies of six years' service and upwards.
- (7) Estimate for wooden cover for gas meter box, St. John's fish market, Rs. 16.50.  
(Passed by Works Committee, No. 12 of March 12, 1904.)  
Approved.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904.

- (3) Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the third quarter, 1903.  
The Committee have no special remarks to make.
- (4) Papers with reference to picketing and selling horses and cattle at the Racquet Court.  
The Committee are of opinion that six months' notice be given, and the practice discontinued from September 30 next entirely.
- (5) Papers with reference to Gintupiti mutton market.  
The Committee recommended that the stall rents be fixed at Rs. 25 from January 1, 1905.
- (8) Papers with reference to the post of Assistant Medical Officer of Health.  
The Committee regret that the Council is losing the services of Dr. Joseph de Silva. The Committee are also of opinion that his successor should, in addition to his ordinary medical qualification, possess a diploma in public health, or equivalent British medical qualification.
- (9) Papers regarding condemned cesspools.  
The Committee recommend that the Chairman be empowered, under section 209A of Ordinance 7 of 1887, to require the closing of these cesspools and the substitution of dry-earth closets therefor.

The Chairman moved—That Council do go into Committee.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 22, 1904, be adopted.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendation No. 4 of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904, be adopted, altering the date from September 30 to December 31.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

(Copy of recommendation as amended attached.)

The Chairman moved—That the recommendation No. 5 of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904, be adopted.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried. Messrs. C. Perera and H. Tiruvilangam dissenting.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendation No. 8 of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904, be adopted, and that the Chairman do advertise locally and in India, in the original instance, for a successor to Dr. Joseph de Silva in the form of advertisement drawn up (copy annexed), and failing a candidate with the necessary qualifications, that the Chairman do advertise in England.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting, on the ground that he considers the appointment of an Assistant Medical Officer of Health illegal.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the recommendation No. 9 of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of March 22, 1904, and that he be given the necessary authority to issue notices under section 209A.

Dr. C. W. van Geyzel seconded.—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting.

The Chairman moved—That Council do resume, and that the resolutions passed in Committee be adopted.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting, as regards the resolutions on which he dissented in Committee.

7. To elect a Member of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects in place of Mr. James Peiris, resigned.

The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Major A. W. de Wilton, who was thereupon elected as a Member of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

Mr. Chas. Perera did not vote in the ballot.

8. The report of the Special Committee on the question of Municipal aid to primary education was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the report.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.—Carried.

9. Letter from Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram of March 25, 1904, relating to amendments to by-laws, regarding drivers and jinricksha coolies, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the amendments in the by-laws as suggested by the lawyers.

Mr. P. D. Khan seconded.—Carried.

(Copy of by-laws as amended is annexed.)

10. Letter of Alex. Stevenson of March 26, 1904, forwarding a letter signed by a large body of ratepayers of Colombo, regarding the construction of a tramway from Maradana Junction and Armour street, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the matter be referred to a joint Committee consisting of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Law and General Subjects—three to form a quorum.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. Papers with reference to extra payment of Rs. 500 per annum to Volunteer Band were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved—That the extra contribution be approved, and that the two extra monthly performances do take place on the Rifle Green, Slave Island, and at Maligakanda Park, respectively.

Mr. H. A. Jayawardene seconded.—Carried.

12. Papers with reference to position of the Gas Inspector were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

This item was withdrawn, as the Gas Inspector had withdrawn his letter of March 25, 1904.

13. Estimate for repairs to draw-bridge leading to Sedawatta, Rs. 2,000.

The Chairman moved that the estimate for Rs. 2,000 be passed.

Dr. Solomon Fernando seconded.—Carried.

14. To obtain authority of Council to require the production of title deed of premises No. 20, New Chetty street.

The Chairman moved that he be authorized to call for the title deed.

Mr. P. D. Warren seconded.—Carried.

WANTED AN ASSISTANT MEDICAL OFFICER OF HEALTH FOR THE CITY OF COLOMBO.

The appointment will be for a period of five years from the date of taking up duties in Colombo. The salary will be Rs. 3,000, equivalent to £200, rising by annual increments of Rs. 500 to a maximum of Rs. 5,000. A conveyance of Rs. 80 a month, equal to £64 a year, will be paid in addition to the salary while he is actually performing the duties.

Candidates for the post must hold an English diploma in Public Health, or equivalent British qualification in addition to their ordinary medical qualification.

The officer appointed will be required to reside in Colombo, and will be debarred from private practice or employment outside the duties of his office.

At the end of the period of five years it will be optional for the Council to engage the Assistant Medical Officer for such further period and on such terms as may be agreed on should he desire to be re-engaged.

Should the officer be compelled at any time during the five years to relinquish his appointment owing to ill-health contracted through no fault of his own the agreement will thereupon be determined.

Candidates should address their applications stating age, general qualifications, and qualifications for post of Assistant Medical Officer of Health, with such testimonials as they desire to submit, to the Medical Officer of Health of the Municipal Council, Colombo.

The applications must be received not later than May 16, 1904.

DRAFT BY-LAWS AS AMENDED BY LAWYERS.

18. No person shall pull or draw a jinricksha for hire unless he holds a license from the Chairman. The license shall be in force from the date of its issue until the 31st day of December next following. It shall contain the licensee's name in full and the licensed number, his nationality, the print of his left thumb and two forefingers, and any other particulars which may ensure his complete identification. To such license it shall be the duty of the licensee to keep attached at all times a photograph of himself with the signature of the Secretary of the Municipal Council and the number of the license written or stamped across it. Every such licensee shall wear in a conspicuous place on his left arm a metal badge bearing his licensed number to be provided for him by the Council.

19. It shall be lawful for the Chairman before granting the license to make or cause to be made such inquiry as he may consider necessary regarding the character of the applicant for license his physical fitness for the work of pulling or drawing a jinricksha, and to examine him or cause him to be examined as to his knowledge of the rule of the road. It shall be lawful for the Chairman to refuse to grant a license to any applicant, and also to cancel, withdraw, or suspend any license granted by him for such grounds as to him may seem reasonable.

19 (a). Every person pulling or drawing a jinricksha for hire shall at any time when required to do so by an officer of police, not under the rank of Inspector, furnish proof of his identity by producing his license and photograph, and by allowing the impression of his thumbs and fingers to be taken in such manner and at such places as the said officer may require.

19 (b). It shall be the duty of every person pulling or drawing a jinricksha for hire to produce immediately for inspection his photograph and license when required to do so by any person who employs him for hire.

25. Add at end :—" To such license it shall be the duty of the driver to keep attached at all times a photograph of himself with the signature of the Secretary of the Municipal Council and the number of the license written or stamped across it."

25. Add at end of amendment already sanctioned :—" It shall be the duty of the driver to produce immediately for inspection his photograph and license when required to do so by any person who takes the carriage on hire."

## MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

### Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on April 16, 1904, at 2 p.m.

*Present* :—The Chairman ; N. Dias Abeysinha, Esq. ; D. G. Goonawardana, Esq. ; F. Abeysundara, Esq. ; Magdon Ismail, Esq. ; and C. P. Hayley, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on March 5, 1904.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley asked—What revenue is derived from the dog tax, how is it collected, and is it not worth while to obtain a census of the dogs owned in Municipal limits?

The Chairman replied that the tax on dogs imposed by the Municipal Ordinance has been abolished by Ordinance No. 25 of 1901, which came into force in Galle in June, 1902. The latter Ordinance provides for the registration of dogs, and under its provisions all owners of dogs within a Municipality are to apply to the Chairman of the Municipal Council for the registration of dogs in their custody before the 31st March of each year paying the registration fee. During the current year 438 dogs were registered up to April 14, more than double the number registered the previous year. At the beginning of the year schedules are served on all persons known to possess dogs to be filled in and returned.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Hayley asked—Is it the duty of the Superintendent of Works to repair Municipal roads when necessary, if not, who is responsible for the state in which the road near the Wesleyan church has been for a long time?

The Chairman replied that it is the duty of the Superintendent of Works to repair roads and to put in order any road he may find in bad repair. His attention will be called to the road referred to in the question.

4. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1903 was laid on the table.

Moved by Mr. D. G. Goonawardana—That the Administration Report for 1903, which had been circulated among the Members of Council, be adopted.

Seconded by Mr. M. Ismail.—Carried.

5. Read letter from Mr. J. G. Keegel, Council's Proctor, dated March 16, 1904, recommending that defendant's costs in case No. 6,760 be paid by the Council.

Resolved—That the Council agrees to pay costs of defendant in the case.

6. Submitted letter from Mr. Alec. C. Hayley, Honorary Secretary, Galle Tennis Club, dated March 23, inquiring whether he may be permitted to make use of water from the standpost in Middle street for watering the tennis court.

Resolved—That the consideration of the question be deferred for next Meeting.

7. Submitted report from the Manager, Health Department, that the alley behind the houses Nos. 34, 35, and 36, Church street, has been completed, and that the dry-earth system of working latrines may be introduced in them.

Resolved—That the Chairman be empowered, under section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to order the owners of these houses to close their cesspits and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.
