WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 6 of 1901, as amended by Ordinance No. 17 of 1901, relating to the possession and use of firearms, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any municipality, division, district, or villages under the operation of the said Ordinance :

And whereas it is expedient to bring the town of Batticaloa and the following villages in the Batticaloa District, viz., Navalkuda, Nochimunai, and Uppodai of the Eastern Province under the operation of the said Ordinance :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the powers in Us vested by the said Ordinance, do hereby as from and after the 15th day of March, 1902, bring the town and villages aforesaid under the operation of the said Ordinance.

On the West.—A line from the north-western boundary of land appearing in title plan No. 99,563 following the eastern boundary of Galkadamukalana as far as the northern boundary of the land appearing in title plan No. 100,362, and thence a straight line to the river.

On the North and North-East.—Following the minor road to Weralupe from its junction with the Colombo road between the 54th and 55th mileposts to the bridge crossing the Katugas-ela, and thence along the Outer Circular road to the gate of the new cemetery, thence a line keeping to the west of the range of paddy fields to the bridge over Parakanda-ela on the minor road to Gilimale, and following this road as far as the Alubokkekumbura-ela, and along this ela to its junction with Kalu-ganga.

When a person executing a deed is not known to the Notary, but to the attesting witnesses, the Notary must satisfy himself before accepting them as witnesses that the witnesses are well acquainted with the executant and know his proper name, occupation, and residence.

I, the Principal Civil Medical Officer and Inspector-General of Hospitals, by virtue of the power vested in me by clause 2 of "The Poisons Ordinance, 1901," by order declare that the following articles ought to be deemed poisons within the meaning of the Ordinance:—

1. All poisonous vegetable alkaloids and their salts.
2. Atropine and its preparations.
3. Preparations of cantharides.
4. Preparations of metallic cyanides.
5. Preparations of strychnine.
6. All vermin killers containing any of the above preparations and those preparations mentioned in part I., clause 2, of the amended draft regulations.
7. Chloral hydrate and its preparations.
8. Corrosive sublimate preparations and all other mercury salts.
9. Nux vomica and its preparations.

THE following by-law made by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901, in respect of the charging, levying, and recovering fees for the removal of and disposed of night soil, has been confirmed by the Governor in Executive Council, and is hereby published for general information.

This by-law is substituted for by-law No. 10 of the by-laws published in *Government Gazette* No. 5,520 of 31st December, 1897.

By-law referred to.

10. The rates of payment to the said Municipal Council by any person so employing a Municipal Officer for the removal of night soil shall be as follows:—

- (a) In the case of any house, building, land, or tenement assessed for Municipal rates at the annual value of Rs. 400 or more for each standard bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer, at the rate of two rupees for every month or fraction of a month.
- (b) In the case of any house, building, land, or tenement assessed for Municipal rates at an annual value of less than Rs. 400 for each standard bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer, at the rate of one rupee for every month or fraction of a month.

All such payments shall be made in advance, and every person who has become liable to the payments mentioned in this by-law shall continue to be so liable until he gives notice in writing to the Chairman of the Council that he wishes the services of the Municipal Officer to be discontinued, together with the date from which he wishes such services to be discontinued.

All sums payable under this by-law if not paid on or before the 10th day of the month in respect of which, or of any part of which, it is due, or in the case of a first application as soon as notice is given of the commencement of the service of the Municipal Officer, shall be recoverable as hereinafter provided.

47. Conditions to be attached to licenses for importation of explosives under sub-section 8 (b) of section 26. The conditions are :—

- (h) Quantities of any explosive as aforesaid in excess of 100 lb. shall be landed and shipped only at the Prince of Wales's jetty (or at such other jetty as may be appointed by the Principal Collector of Customs) between the hours of 6 and 8 A.M. and 2 and 4 P.M., when all other boats shall have been removed from the jetty; and no carts or persons shall be allowed on the jetty during the landing or loading of the explosive, except those actually engaged in the work.

IT is hereby notified that an examination under the regulations of 26th August, 1891, for gentlemen in the Civil Service, will be held in the Council Chamber on Monday, April 21, 1902, at 11 o'clock A.M., and following days, namely :—

It is also hereby notified that the examination under the Minute of 12th December, 1898, and the *viva voce* examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department will be held at the same time and place.

Only the Police Magistrates who are not members of the Bar or of the Civil Service and those candidates who have been specially nominated by the Governor will be admitted to the former examination.

The examination in the Criminal Procedure Code prescribed under the Minute of 26th March, 1900, for officers in the Fourth and Fifth Classes of the Civil Service will also be held on the 21st April, 1902, as well as at the Kandy Kachcheri.

Candidates are required to send in their names not later than 3rd April, 1902.

Gentlemen in the Civil Service should state in their applications whether they are presenting themselves for the first or second examination, and whether they intend taking up Sinhalese or Tamil.

THE Preliminary Examination for Medical Students of either sex will begin on March 17, 1902. The last day for entry is March 1, 1902.

The following is an extract from the Examination Regulations:—

The Preliminary.—This examination is held once a year in the third week in March. Before admission to the preliminary the candidate must present to the Registrar not later than March 1 the following certificates:—

- (1) Certificate of having attained 16 years of age.
- (2) Certificate from one of his teachers of being of good character.

The candidate must pay the examination fee of Rs. 15 into the account of the Principal, the Ceylon Medical College, at the Bank of Madras, Colombo, and a receipt must be obtained, and must be forwarded with the application. The candidate will then receive a ticket bearing a number, which will admit him to the examination.

Subjects of the Examination.

1. English Language, including Grammar and Composition.
2. Latin, including Grammar, translation from specified author (the author selected is Livy, Book XXII.), and translation of easy passages not taken from such author.
3. Mathematics, comprising Arithmetic; Algebra as far as simple equations inclusive; Geometry, the subject matter of Euclid, Books I., II., and III., and easy deductions.
4. One of the following optional subjects: Greek, French, German, Italian, Sinhalese, Tamil. The questions on optional subjects include Grammar, easy translation from and into English.

Scheme of the Examination.

First Day	...	{ 9-12 A.M. English Language. 2-4 P.M. English Essay.
Second Day	...	{ 9-12 A.M. Latin, prescribed book. Unseen translation. 2-4 P.M. Latin Grammar, English into Latin.
Third Day	...	{ 9-12 A.M. Arithmetic and Algebra. 2-4 P.M. Geometry.
Fourth Day	...	9-12 A.M. Optional subjects.

Results of the Examination.

In publishing the results the names of the candidates will be placed in two classes, first and second. Those in the first, in order of merit; and those in the second, alphabetically.

The Preliminary Examination Prizes.

The highest candidate in the first class, provided he obtains a sufficient number of marks, shall be awarded Government scholarship entitling him to three years' free education at the Ceylon Medical College; the second shall receive a medal.

Examination Papers.

Copies of previous examination papers may be obtained on application to the Registrar.

Examinations accepted in lieu of the Preliminary.

The following examinations are accepted in lieu of the Preliminary Examination, provided that they include all the above subjects, and that these subjects have all been passed at one and the same time. Schoolmasters and teachers are particularly warned that the optional subject must be a modern language, and that Logic, Science, &c., are not recognized in place of such language:—

- (1) The Matriculation Examination of any recognized University of Great Britain, of the University of Bombay.
- (2) The First Examination in Arts of the University of Calcutta, Madras.
- (3) The Entrance Examination of Punjab, Allahabad.
- (4) The Senior or Junior Local Examinations of the University of Oxford or of Cambridge.
- (5) The Examination of the College of Preceptors for a First Class Certificate.
- (6) The Matriculation Examination of some University of Australia, New Zealand, Cape of Good Hope, &c.
- (7) Some Examination of Foreign Universities in Europe.
- (8) The Examination for the Secondary Education Certificate of the Egyptian Government.
