SIR,—I HAVE the honour to transmit to you for your information, and with a view to its publication in the Colony under your Government, the accompanying copy of a Proclamation by the King in Council determining new designs for Silver Coins.

A · P R O C L A M A T I O N .

EDWARD R. & I.

WHEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin :

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the silver coins specified in this Proclamation, being silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870 :

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. The designs for the said silver coins shall be as follows:—

- (1) *Crown*.—Every crown shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "EDWARDUS VII DEI GRA : BRITT : OMN : REX FID : DEF : IND : IMP : " and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, and on the edge of the piece in raised letters, "DECUS ET TUTAMEN ANNO REGNI," the year of the reign being in Roman numeral letters.
- (2) *Half-Crown*.—Every half-crown shall have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy with the inscription "EDWARDUS VII DEI GRA : BRITT : OMN ; REX : " and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a shield surmounted by the Royal Crown and surrounded by the Garter bearing the motto, "HONI SOIT QUI MALY PENSE," with the inscription, "FID : DEF : IND : IMP : " together with the words "HALF-CROWN," and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge.
- (3) *Florin*.—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression as the half-crown with the inscription "EDWARDUS VII D.G. : BRITT : OMN : REX : F.D. IND : IMP : " and for the reverse the figure of Britannia standing upon the prow of a vessel, her right hand grasping a trident, and her left resting on a shield, with the words "ONE FLORIN TWO SHILLINGS" and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge.
- (4) *Shilling*.—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the half-crown, and for the reverse Our Royal Crest with the date of the year placed across the Crest with the inscription "FID : DEF : IND : IMP : " together with the words "ONE SHILLING," with a graining upon the edge.
- (5) *Sixpence*.—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the crown, and for the reverse the words "SIX PENCE" placed in the centre of the piece, having an olive branch on one side and an oak branch on the other, surmounted by the Royal Crown, and the date of the year between and below the branches, with a graining upon the edge.
- (6) *Silver Fourpence, Threepence, Twopence, and Penny*.—Every silver fourpence, threepence, twopence, and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy with the inscription "EDWARDUS VII D.G. BRITT : OMN : REX : F.D. IND : IMP : " and for the reverse the respective figures "4", "3", "2", "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece) in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown, with a plain edge.

Given at Our Court at *St. James's*, this Thirteenth day of *January*, in the year of Our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Two, and in the first year of Our Reign.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 44 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by section 14 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may make regulations respecting the transit of all forest produce by land or water: and whereas certain regulations were made under the provisions of the said section 44 of the said Ordinance No. 10 of 1885, as amended by the said section 14 of the said Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, and published in the *Government Gazette* by a Notification dated the 4th day of May, 1900:

And whereas by regulation 2 of such regulations it is provided that no forest produce or timber shall be moved (a) in any district which has been proclaimed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from any land, and (b) in any unproclaimed district from any land at the disposal of the Crown, or any land which is adjacent thereto, except with a permit from the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, or from some officer duly authorized by the Government Agent to

issue permits; nor when a permit has been obtained shall any forest produce be moved otherwise than in accordance with the conditions of such permit:

And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the portion of the District of Kegalla, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, set forth in the schedule hereto under the said regulation 2:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the portion of the District of Kegalla, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, set forth in the schedule hereto under the said regulation 2, as from and after the First day of April, 1902.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz. :—

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of the said "Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the period fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the last-mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times hereinbefore recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation declare the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be a reserved forest as from and after the First day of February, 1902.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule.

"**உப்பு ஏற்றுமதிபண்ணிக் கொவற்றன்மேந்தின் குதங்க ளில் நிறுத்துக்கொடுக்கிறதற்கென்றும் கொள்வனவுகாரருக்கு நிறுத்து கொடுக்கிறதற்கென்றும்,**" **மேல் உறையில் எழுதி முத்திரிக்கப்பட்ட கேள்விப்பத்திரங்களை உடன்படிக்கைபண்ணிக்கொள்ள விருப்பமுள்ளவர்களிடமிருந்து வடமேன்மாகாணக் குருளுகல் கொவற்றன்மேந்து ஏசன்றுத் தரையவர்களால் 1902 ம் ஆண்டு பங்குனிமாதம் 24 த்திகதி திங்கக்கிழமை வரைக்கும் குருளுகல் அவருடைய கந்தோரில் வைத்து ஏற்றுக்கொள்ளப்படும், அதாவது :—**

I. புத்தளம் உப்பளங்களில் போளவருஷத்தில் செய்கை பண்ணிச் சேர்த்துவைக்கப்பட்டிருக்கும் ஏறக்குறைய 340,000 அந்தர் உப்பில் 20,000 அந்தர் வரையில் கிழக்கு உப்பளத்தில் இருப்புகித் தொங்கலிவருந்து சரிதொகையாய் இந்த மாசம் ஏற்றப்படும், மிகுதி உப்பை ஏற்றுமதி பண்ணிப் புத்தளத்திலிருக்கும் உப்புக் களஞ்சியங்களுக்கு கொண்டு வந்து நிறுத்துக் குதங்களில் போட்டுக் கொடுக்கும் பணிவிடைக்கும்.

II. உப்புக் களஞ்சியங்களில் வீற்கப்படும் உப்பை நிறுத்து வண்டில்களுக்கும் பாதைகளுக்கும் ஏற்றுமதிபண்ணிக் கொடுக்கிற பணிவிடைக்காகவும்.
கேள்விக்காரர் இதன் பின்னால் சொல்லப்படும் ஏற்பாடுகளைக் கவனிக்கக்கடவர்கள்.
முதலாம் பணிவிடை நடைபெறுதலையிட்டு அவதானிக்க வேண்டியதாவது :—

3. கேள்விக்காரர் நாள் ஒன்றுக்கு 1,500 அந்தர் உப்புக் கொண்டு வந்து நிறுத்து ஒப்புக்கொடுக்க வேண்டியது.
4. மேற்குறித்த வேலை 1902 ம் ஆண்டு சித்திரைமாதம் 1 த்திகதி செவ்வாய்க்கிழமை அல்லது அந்தத் திகதியை அடுத்த நாட்களில் துவங்கப்படல் வேண்டும்.
இரண்டாம் பணிவிடை நடைபெறுதலையிட்டு அவதானிக்கவேண்டியதாவது :—
5. வண்டில்களுக்கும் பாதைகளுக்கும் உப்பை நிறுத்து ஏற்றுமதிபண்ணிக் கொடுக்கிறதற்கு 1,000 அந்தருக்கு என்ன வீதமென்று பிறம்பு பிறம்பாகக் குறித்துக் காட்டியிருக்க வேண்டும்.
6. இத்தப் பணிவிடைக்காகப் போதிய கூலியாட்களையும் வண்டில்களையும் விட்டு வேலை நடப்பித்து ஒரு நாள் ஒன்றுக்கு 2,000 அந்தர் உப்புநிறுத்து ஏற்றிக்கொடுக்க கேள்விக்காரர் ஆயத்தமாயிருக்கவேண்டும்.

7. இந்தவேலை 1902 ம் ஆண்டு சித்திரைமாதம் 1 ந்திகதி துவக்கம் நடப்பிக்கவேண்டும்.

8. மேலே சொல்லப்பட்ட இரண்டு வித பணிவிடகளை யிட்டு ஒவ்வொரு கேள்விக்காரரும் கேள்விகேட்க முதல் புத்தளம் குருளகல் கச்சேரிகளில் ரூபா 50 ஒடுக்கவேண்டும். அவ்விதம் காசகட்டாத ஒரு கேள்வியாவது ஏற்றுக் கொள்ளப்படமாட்டாது. கொந்திறத்தைச் சரியாக நடப்பிக்கிறதற்கு 1,000 ரூபாய்கொண்ட இரண்டு சமீதிப்புப் பெற்ற பிணைகொடுக்க அல்லது பொருத்த உடன்படிக்கை பண்ணிக்கொள்ளத் தவறிலால் இந்தக் கட்டின பணம் கொவந்ணமே ந்துக்காகப் பரிமுதலாக்கப்படும், பரிமுதலாக்கப்படாத கட்டின பணம் கேள்விக்காரருக்குத் திரும்பக் கொடுக்கப்படும்.

9. கொந்திசு அல்லது கடிதங்களைப் பெற்றுக்கொள்வதற்காகக் கேள்விக்காரன் தனக்குப் பதிலாய்ப் புத்தளத்தில ஓர் பெயர்வளியின் மேல்விலாசத்தைக் கொடுக்கவேண்டியது.

10. இந்தக் கொந்திறத்துச் சரியாக நடைபெறுகிறதற்காகப் பிணைக்கு ஏற்படுகிறதாகிய இரண்டு போதிய ஆட்களால் கையொப்பமிடப்பட்டு அவர்களின் மேல்விலாசமும் எழுதப்பட்ட கடிதம் ஒவ்வொரு கேள்விப்பத்திரத்துடனும் அணைத்திருக்கவேண்டியது.

11. கேள்வியின் விதங்களையிட்டு ஏதும் மாற்றுதல் அல்லது திருத்தங்களைப்பண்ணினால் அந்த இடத்தில் கேள்விக்காரனின் கையொப்ப அடையாளமிடப்பட்டிருக்கவேண்டும்.

12. கேள்விப்பத்திரத்தின் இணைப்பிரதி யொன்று கொழும்பிலிருக்கும் சங்கைபோந்த நகரக்கதிகாரித்தலைவர் அவர்களுக்கும் அதின் மூலப்பிரதியை குருளகல் ஏசன்றுத் துரைக்கு அனுப்பும் சமையங் கேள்விக்காரன் தபால்வழியாக அனுப்பவேண்டும்.

SEALED Tenders, marked on the envelopes "Tender for the privilege of selling Light Refreshments on the Platforms at Kankasanturai, Jaffna, and Chavakachcheri, during 1902," will be received up to 12 noon on Monday, April 21 next, from persons willing to tender for the same.

The person whose tender is accepted by the Government will be allowed to erect a small refreshment stall at each of the stations named, on a site to be selected by the General Manager, on the sole conditions that the said stalls are constructed to the satisfaction of the

General Manager or person delegated by him, and that they are conducted in a proper and cleanly manner.

If the said stalls are not so conducted, the General Manager, on the representation of the Station Masters or other responsible officers, retains the right to order the stalls to be removed and the contract cancelled.

Tenders must be submitted in duplicate, the original being forwarded to the General Manager of the Railway and the duplicate direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being required to be forwarded at the same time.

The tenders are to be made on forms which will be supplied upon application at the office of the Station Master at Jaffna, and no tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form.

Before tender forms are supplied to persons wishing to tender, they will have to satisfy the General Manager or person delegated by him that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, and for this purpose they must be prepared to produce documentary or other evidence, if called for.

A deposit of Rs. 10 will be required before any form of tender is issued, and should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered, or should he fail to furnish the required security, such deposit of Rs. 10 will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

The security required will be a month's rent in cash, and any further information required can be obtained on application at the office of the General Manager.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and is further not bound to accept the lowest tender.

The person whose tender is accepted by the Government will be required to bear the expenses of having the security bonds prepared for the due performance of the contract, which bonds will be subject to the approval of the Attorney-General, but may be drawn by the tenderers' own lawyers, the name or stamp of whom should be affixed to the document.

Every alteration should bear the initials of the tenderer, and all tenders containing alterations not bearing the tenderers' initials will be treated as informal and rejected.
