WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 12th May, 1900, the forest called Mandaklarkadu in the Punakary division of the Jaffna District, in the Northern Province, was declared a reserved forest under section 19 of "The Forest Ordinance of 1885," as amended by section 6 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, and the limits of the said forest were set forth in the schedule annexed to the said Proclamation :

Whereas under section 22 of "The Forest Ordinance 1885," as amended by section 6 of the Ordinance of 1892, We are empowered to rescind or modify any order made under chapter II. of the said Ordinance within five years from the publication of any Proclamation under section 19 :

And whereas it has been found that the villagers of Veravil, Ponnaveli, and Kiranchi of the Punakary division have a right to pasture their cattle in the lakes of Teravilkulam and Tikkuvillu, comprised within the limits of the said reserve of Mandaklar, and which right was not acknowledged to them in the Proclamation above-mentioned :

Now know all Men that We, the said Governor, do hereby by this Our Proclamation continue to the said villagers a right of pasturing their cattle in the said lakes of Teravilkulam and Tekkuvillu, comprised within the limits of the forest reserve called Mandaklar.

WHEREAS by section 94 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is amongst other things enacted that "whosoever shall leave or permit to be left on any road to which this provision shall be extended as hereinafter mentioned any cart or other carriage without the oxen, horses, or other animals being yoked or harnessed thereto, unless such cart or carriage shall have accidentally broken down there, and in case of such accident for a longer time than may be necessary for its removal," and that "whosoever shall drive any cart drawn by one or more bullocks or suffer the same to remain in any thoroughfare between the hours of sunset and sunrise without having a light attached thereto, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5" :

And whereas it is further enacted by the said section that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council by Proclamation, to declare that the aforesaid provision shall extend and be applicable to any road in this Colony, or to any section of such road, whenever it shall appear to the said Governor and Council that a sufficient number of halting places have been constructed along the same :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Us, the said Governor and Council, that a sufficient number of halting places as set out in the schedule hereto annexed, have been constructed along the following road, viz., Passara-Madulsima road to Dunedin Factory :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, acting with the advice aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the hereinbefore recited provisions of section 94 of the said Ordinance, shall, from and after the First day of April, 1902, extend and be applicable to the same road, viz., Passara-Madulsima road to Dunedin Factory.
