MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, January 10, 1902.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 4, 1902.

Present:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. P. D. Warren; the Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; and Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen.

The Minutes of December 6 and 13, 1901, having been printed, and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

A few printer's errors were corrected.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of December 6 and 13, 1901, as corrected, be confirmed.

1. The following extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee of December 20, 1901, were laid before the Council:—

December 20, 1901.

- (2) Letter No. 1,169 of October 31, 1901, from Superintendent of Works, with reference to the extra clerk employed by him.
 - A temporary appointment may be made on Rs. 60 a month, as suggested by Superintendent of Works, pending the question of distribution of duties.
- (5) Estimate for footways, Church street, Fort, Rs. 4,784 04.
 Committee approve of the estimate, omitting the footways, which they do not consider necessary.
- (7) Letter dated November 12, 1901, from Mr. W. L. de Silva, extra draughtsman, applying for the concession allowed to the clerks for travelling by train.

 Approved.
- (9) Letter No. 173 of September 29, 1901, from Auditor-General, with reference to regulations for Works Department.
 - The Committee recommend that they be referred to the Special Committee on the Works Department.

- (21) Letter No. 2,007 of October 15, 1901, from Superintendent of Works, forwarding an application from Amala Marikar, head mason, for a gratuity. Approved the sum of Rs. 200.
- (23) Letter No. 583 of December 10, 1901, from Manager, Health Department, with reference to bonus to coolies, Rs. 400. Approved.
- (36) Application dated December 13, 1901, from Head Printer for overtime allowance. Chairman may settle. The Committee recommend it.
- (38) Letter No. 596 of December 17, 1901, from Manager, Health Department, forwarding an application from K. D. Philip, peon, for overtime allowance. Approved.
- Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne moved,—That the recommendations contained in the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee of December 20, 1901, be adopted.
 Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen seconded.—Carried.

- The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of five Members to form a Standing Committee for 1902. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. Chas. Perera, Mr. Chas. P. Dias, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and Mr. H. A. Jayewardene, who were accordingly elected to form the Standing Committee for 1902.
 - 3. Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved the re-appointment of the following Special Committees:-

1) Committee appointed to consider, inter alia, rules in connection with tramways.
2) Committee appointed to consider the question of providing a new Municipal Office in view of the increase of business and establishment.

Committee appointed to inquire and report on the matter of widening Wellawatta lane.

Committee appointed to define duties of Head Overseer, Works Department.

- (5) Committee appointed to go into the question of providing shelter at or near the Borella cemetery.
 (6) Committee appointed on August 9, 1901, to consider letter No. 64/13713 of July 30, 1901, from Colonial Secretary, with reference to drainage and water supply of Colombo.
 (7) Committee appointed on December 13, 1901, to inquire into the sufficiency of the method of keeping accounts in the Department of the Superintendent of Works and of their audit, and, in case it be found insufficient to suggest an adaptate and appropriate scheme of account leaving. found insufficient, to suggest an adequate and appropriate scheme of account-keeping. Also to make an investigation into the accounts of the Department (so far as they have been kept according to the present system) from the year 1899 to the end of the current year, with the view of ascertaining what losses, if any, this Council has sustained by irregularities on the part of the subordinate officers of the Department, and how far those losses may be recoverable. The Special Committee so appointed to have power to engage and pay for the services of a competent person in making the necessary examination and suggestions.
- Mr. Arthur Alvis seconded.—Carried.
- 4. Letter dated December 11, 1901, from the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, inviting Chairman's attention to the occupation of the roads in the vicinity of the Museum for military practice, and letter No. 121/022876 of December 28, 1901, from the Colonial Secretary on the subject, were laid on the table, having been previously printed and

 Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved,—That the Chairman's memorandum dated November 25, 1901, on the subject,

be adopted.

Mr. P. D. Warren seconded.—Carried.

6. A. letter No. 122/023177 of December 23, 1901, from Colonial Secretary, informing that it has been decided to carry out Mr. Mansergh's modified scheme for the drainage of Colombo, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

7. Notes by Audit on the inspection of the Council's books for 1901, together with a memorandum by the

Chairman, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. Perera moved,-That the matter be referred to the Special Committee appointed on December 13, 1901, to inquire into, inter alia, the method of keeping accounts in the Works Department, and that the Committee be authorized to deal with and recommend what staff they consider necessary for the Works Department, and such distribution of duties as they may think proper.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.—Carried.

- 8. To obtain authority of Council to strike off irrecoverable arrears of dog tax of 1900.

 Mr. C. Perera moved,—That authority be granted to the Chairman to strike off the irrecoverable arrears of tax.

 Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen seconded.—Carried.
- 9. Papers relating to leave to J. S. Perera, clerk, Vehicles and Animals Tax Department, were laid before the Council.
 - Mr. C. P. Dias moved, —That the leave granted by the Chairman be confirmed.

Mr. P. D. Warren seconded.—Carried.

- 10. Papers regarding the diaries of the Sanitary Officer and charges framed against him were laid before the Council
 - Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved,-That Council do go into Committee.

16. A letter No. 1,524 of December 28, 1901, from Superintendent of Works, regarding the closing of the gravel pits at Maligakanda, was laid before the Council.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved,—That the matter be referred to the Special Committee appointed, inter alia, to inquire into the method of keeping of accounts in the Works Department, and that the Chairman may use his discretion meanwhile in allowing gravel to be removed from the pits.

Mr. P. D. Warren seconded .- Carried.

- 18. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to December 31, 1901, and Progress Report of Work done for December, 1901, were laid on the table.

A letter No. 2/023014 dated January 6, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, regarding the draft Ordinance to empower the Council to grant permission to lay electric mains in the streets, was laid before the Council—Council having agreed to dispose of the matter at this Meeting, though not included in the Agenda.
