COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended March 4, 1905, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 80. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 24.6,* as against 26.7 in the preceding week and 20.0 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 84. The death-rate per 1,000 was 25.8,* as against 30.4 in the previous week and 28.5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—One person died from measles; 8 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 29 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 7 from different kinds of fever; and 3 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 84 total deaths, 12 were of infants under 1 year of age, being in the proportion of 150 to 1,000 registered births, as against 252 to 1,000 in the previous week and 297 to 1,000 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

SEALED Tenders (in duplicate), marked on the envelopes "Tender for the Removal of the Wreck of the ss. Secundra," will be received at the Colonial Secretary's Office up to 12 o'clock noon on Monday, March 20, 1905, from persons willing to contract for the following works :—

For the removal of the ss. Secundra now lying in Galle Harbour, consisting of the remainder of the whole of the ship and cargo, so as to give both a clear waterway and a clean anchorage by the removal of all the wreck and remains of the cargo lying above and below the harbour bed.

The materials removed cannot be deposited in the bed of the harbour without written authority from the Master Attendant.

2. The materials removed to become the property of the contractor.

3. Tender forms to be obtained from the Government Agent, Southern Province, at Galle, on the payment of a deposit of Rs. 500. No tender will be recognized that is not drawn out on the proper form and completely filled in all respects. In case of any alteration in the amount inserted in the tender such alteration must bear the initials of the tenderer; failing this, the tender will be treated as informal.

4. Should any person decline to enter into a contract after he has tendered, his deposit money shall be forfeited to the Crown as liquidated and ascertained damages. All other deposits will be returned after the contract has been signed.

5. The contractor shall be bound to complete the work within a specified time before the commencement of the south-west monsoon, which time must be given in his tender, and no payments will be made until the completion of the work in accordance with the specification to the satisfaction of Government.

6. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all of the tenders.

7. The person whose tender is accepted will be required to supply at his own cost and charges all appliances, material, and labour necessary for the breaking up of the wreck and for the removal of the material and cargo thereof, and for depositing such materials and cargo as may be directed by the Master Attendant.

8. Persons tendering must do so at their own cost.

Specification.

Specification of the Work to be performed in breaking up, completely removing, and depositing the Wreck of the ss. "Secundra and the Cargo of same lying in Galle Harbour.

Extent of Contract.

1. The contractor shall provide at his own cost and charges all labour, material, and appliances, including boats, machinery, cranes, tackle, &c., necessary for breaking up, completely removing, and depositing, as may be directed, the whole of the wreck and cargo or any portion of the wreck and cargo that may remain. He shall furnish all lights and watchmen and everything necessary for securing the safety of vessels approaching the Port.

Liability of Contractor for Damage or Injury.

2. The contractor shall be liable for all damage or injury to any steamer, vessel, craft, person, or thing arising out of this contract, and the Government reserves to itself the right of paying the value of any such damages or injuries as may be awarded by any competent Committee and deducting the amount so paid as liquidated and ascertained damages from any moneys due or that may become due to the contractor.

Removal of Wreck.

3. The contractor shall break up and completely remove the whole of the wreck and cargo of the ship above and below the harbour bed, including all portion or portions of the ship and cargo thereof that may have or may become detached therefrom that lie above or below the harbour bed, so that there shall be a clear anchorage above and below the harbour bed and a clear waterway for all steamers, vessels, or other craft entering or leaving the harbour at any time whatever.

Disposal of the Wreck.

4. The whole of the wreck and cargo or any remain of the wreck and cargo of the ship shall be removed and become the property of the contractor.

Inspection of Work after Completion.

5. The contractor shall at his own expense pay for the services of a Government European Diver to examine and certify that the work has been properly completed in terms of the foregoing specification.

Time of Completion.

6. The whole of the work included in this contract must be carried out and completed to the satisfaction of the Government before the commencement of the south-west monsoon.

Payment.

7. Payment will be made after the completion of the work in accordance with the specification to the satisfaction of Government.

Security.

8. The contractor shall be required to sign a contract and execute and perform the work in accordance with this specification and to give approved security to the extent of Rs. 10,000 (Rupees Ten thousand) for the due and faithful performance of the contract, which will be forfeited by way of liquidated and ascertained damages in the event of the contractor failing to carry out this contract to the satisfaction of the Government.
