IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS Section 1 of the Firearms Ordinance, No. 6 of 1901, as amended by the Ordinance No. 17 of 1901, it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such provinces, municipalities, divisions, districts, or villages, and at such times, as the Governor shall from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* appoint:

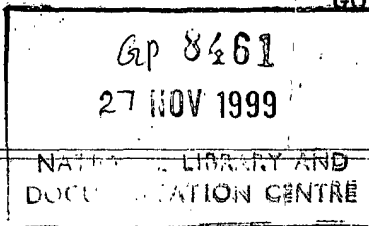
Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation appoint that the said Ordinance No. 6 of 1901, intituled "An Ordinance relating to the possession and use of Firearms," as amended by Ordinance No. 17 of 1901, shall come into operation within the limits of the Municipality of Kandy in the Central Province of the said Island, as defined by Proclamation dated 19th February, 1902, as from and after the 1st day of May, 1902.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-seventh day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Two.
