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#### PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

#### No. 21 of 1904.

An Ordinance to amend "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887."

HENRY A. BLAKE.

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to amend in the particulars hereinafter set forth "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," hereinafter referred as to "the principal Ordinance:" Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Municipal Councils' Amendment Ordinance, 1904," and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and the amending Ordinances No. 26 of 1890, No. 1 of 1896, No. 12 of 1898, No. 8 of 1901, and No. 7 of 1902 shall be read as one, and may be cited collectively as "The Municipal Councils' Ordinances, 1887 to 1904." Chairman to grant leave of absence to subordinate officers.

- 2 For section 61 of the principal Ordinance there shall be substituted the following section, namely:
  - 61 (1) Leave of absence may be granted to all subordinate officers and servants of the municipal council other than the chairman, assistant chairman, and municipal magistrate, in accordance with such regulations as the municipal council may from time to time make.
  - (2) The municipal council may from time to time alter, amend, or cancel any or all such regulations and substitute another or others therefor.
  - (3) No regulation nor the alteration, amendment, or cancelment of, or substitution for, any regulation shall take effect until the same has been approved by the Governor and the Executive Council. Notice of such approval shall be given in the *Government Gazette*.
  - (4) Provided that in any case not specially provided for in such regulations the chairman may, in cases of urgency, with the approval of the municipal council, grant leave of absence to any such officer or servant as to the municipal council may seem fit.

Commencement.

3 This Ordinance shall come into operation on the First day of January, 1905.

## MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to raise a Loan of £1,000,000 Sterling for the construction of Railway, Harbour, or any Public Work on which the expenditure of the Moneys raised under this Ordinance shall be approved by Resolution of the Legislative Council, for the completion of the Colombo Waterworks, and for the construction of Works for the Drainage of Colombo.

Preamble.

W HEREAS it is expedient to raise a loan not exceeding one million pounds sterling, British money, for the purpose of constructing railway, harbour, and any public work on which the expenditure of the moneys raised under this Ordinance shall be approved by resolution of the Legislative Council in that behalf, for completing the Colombo Waterworks, and for constructing works for the drainage of Colombo: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance shall be cited as "The Public Works Loan Ordinance, 1905," and this Ordinance and "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance, 1884," shall be construed and read as one Ordinance.

Authority to Governor to borrow by sale of debentures or inscribed stock,

Application of

2 The Governor is hereby authorized to borrow a sum not exceeding one million pounds sterling, British money, by the sale of debentures or by the sale of inscribed stock, or partly by the sale of debentures and partly by the sale of inscribed stock, under the provisions, terms, and conditions of "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance, 1884."

3 The proceeds arising from such loan shall be applied exclusively to the following purposes; that is to say, the construction of railway, harbour, and any public work on which the expenditure of the moneys raised under this Ordinance shall be approved by resolution of the Legislative Council in that behalf, for the completion of the Colombo Waterworks, and the construction of works for the drainage of Colombo, and in the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for and in connection with such purposes.

Commencement of contribution to sinking fund.

4 The contributions to the sinking fund as contemplated by sections 10 and 24 of "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance, 1884," for the repayment of the said sum of one million pounds sterling, British money, hereby authorized to be borrowed, shall commence after the expiration of three years from the date on which the interest on the first debentures or inscribed stock to be issued under this Ordinance shall begin to run.

Explanatory Memorandum of the Objects of the Draft Ordinance.

THE Draft Ordinance authorizes the Governor to borrow a sum not exceeding £1,000,000 sterling under the provisions of "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance."

- 2. The proceeds of the loan are applicable to the public works specially mentioned in the Ordinance and to such other public work as shall be expressly sanctioned by resolution of the Legislative Council in that behalf, and to the purchase of such lands, materials, and other things as may be required for such purposes.
- 3. Contributions to the sinking fund for the repayment of the loan commence after the expiration of three years from the date on which the interest on the first debentures or inscribed stock begins to run.

An Ordinance to readjust the Customs Duties leviable on Perfumery and Perfumed Spirits.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to readjust the customs duties levied on perfumery and perfumed spirits under the provisions of Ordinances No. 17 of 1869, No. 20 of 1898, and No. 2 of 1904: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

To be read with Ordinances No. 17 of 1869, No. 20 of 1898, and No. 2 of 1903.

1 This Ordinance and the schedule hereto shall be construed and read as one with the Ordinances No. 17 of 1869, No. 20 of 1898, and No. 2 of 1903.

Duties to be levied on perfumery, perfumed spirits, and bay rum. 2 From and after the passing of this Ordinance the duties set out in the schedule hereto shall be levied on perfumery, perfumed spirits, and bay rum respectively, anything in the aforesaid Ordinances No. 17 of 1869, No. 20 of 1898, and No. 2 of 1903 to the contrary notwithstanding.

On perfumery other than perfumed spirits, for every Rs. 100 of the value thereof a duty of ... 5 50

#### Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Ordinance is to enable perfumery which does not contain spirits to be imported on the ordinary ad valorem duty of  $5\frac{1}{2}$  per cent., and at the same time to retain the duty of Rs. 7 per gallon on perfumed spirits and bay rum, which the Schedule B to Ordinance No. 2 of 1903 imposed on all perfumery.
