SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Town of Nuwara Eliya.

North-West.—Along the north-west boundary of title plans 73,338 and 73,339 at the Kodigaha gap.

North-East and North.—Along the north-east and northern boundaries of private property till it reaches Talagala-oya, up the right bank of that stream and western edge of the reservoir of the waterworks to the point where the stream enters the reservoir, from that point straight to the waterfall at the north-west corner of Lover's Leap estate.

East and North-East.—Along the eastern boundary of the military reserve till it reaches the boundary of title plan 87,650, along the northern and eastern boundaries of title plan 87,650 and production of the eastern boundary of that title plan till it touches the edge of the Barrack Plain reservoir, along the north-east edge of reservoir to the dam, along the top of the dam and its direction produced in a straight line until it reaches a point 66 ft. from the centre of the Moon Plains road and on the outer side of that road.

East and South-East.—From the point last mentioned along a line 66 ft. distant from and parallel to the centre of the Moon Plains road on its outer side for a distance of 27 chains along this line as far as the patana, and then due south across the stream to the edge of the forest, thence south and east along the forest to the extreme south-east corner of the tongue of patana which comprises the new rifle range. From this corner in a direct south-westerly line to the north-east corner of title plan 78,049, then following the south-east boundary of title plan 78,049 to the main road from Nuwara Eliya to Badulla, across the road in a direct line to the south-east corner of the wire fence enclosing Baker's Farm private lands, then following the wire fence to include Baker's Farm as far as Baker's Farm triangulation station.

South.—From this point in a direct line to the Gregory lake dam, thence down the course of the Nanu-oya to Blackpool.

South-West.—From Blackpool straight to One Tree Hill triangulation station; thence along the top of ridge overlooking Nuwara Eliya to a point due west up to Queen's Cottage, from that point straight to Kikilimana triangulation station, thence straight to the north-west corner of title plan 73,338.

Boundaries.

North.—The outer Circular road from the 2nd milepost to the north-eastern corner of Jetawanarama, and thence a line drawn eastwards across the Malwatu-oya to the junction of the Rambewa and MacBride roads.

General Regulations of the Ceylon Technical College.

DEPARTMENTS OF

1. *Age and Conditions of Admission.*—Candidates for admission to any of the departments of the College must fill in and present to the Superintendent of the College the "Form of Application," giving in their own handwriting the particulars required therein, and the signatures of two persons who have personal knowledge of them and who are prepared to answer inquiries as to their character. They must be not less than 16 years of age on the first day of the year they propose to enter. They must present a certificate from the Principal of the School or College they attended last, and such other certificates of educational attainments from public examining bodies as they may possess. They must pass a medical examination for physical fitness and an entrance examination for sufficient general knowledge. Candidates who hold certificates of having passed the Senior Cambridge or other examination of similar standing, or have matriculated at the London University or other similar institution from time to time approved by His Excellency the Governor, will be exempted from the entrance examinations in all subjects except the prescribed vernacular subjects, if their certificates show that they have passed in mathematics. The applications of those who show that they possess the necessary qualifications will be submitted to His Excellency the Governor, who will nominate a sufficient number to be admitted as students of the College in the department they select.

2. *Fees and Deposits, &c.*—The fees will be paid in all cases for one year in advance, and a deposit in addition to cover the cost of instruments and books will be made on admission. Fees for the year and the deposit on admission must be paid before the student joins any of the classes.

3. *Instruments and Books, &c.*—Certain instruments, tools, books, &c., which the students are required to possess (see the schedule attached to syllabus of each department) will be supplied to them at economical rates and the cost debited to deposit, but they may purchase elsewhere so long as the articles are of approved kind. The balance of the deposit, after providing what is necessary, and after deducting the cost of damage to College property through culpable negligence or malice, will be refunded at the end of the course. Students are not to borrow from or lend to one another in class any of the instruments, tools, books, &c., which are enumerated and prescribed for their own possession.

4. *Hours of Study.*—The registers will be marked at the commencement of every class, and at other times if necessary, and every student must be in his place then. The hours of study are from 10.30 A.M. to 12.30 P.M., and from 1 P.M. to 4 P.M. every week day, except Saturday. There will be surveying classes for engineering students on Saturday mornings during certain terms of the course.

5. *Note Books.*—Every student is required to prepare in books of the prescribed kind the laboratory and lecture notes and home exercises with regularity, fulness, neatness, and accuracy. Special attention is to be paid to the note book work. All note books are to be brought to the College daily, and be ready for reference or examination at any time during working hours.

6. *Care of Students' Property.*—Instruments, books, and other personal property when not in immediate use may be given in care of the College Sergeant at his office during working hours. But no responsibility will be taken for safe custody of such property after working hours; articles left overnight will lie at risk of the owner. Students are recommended to provide themselves with locked handbags marked with their names. Every student should also provide himself with towel and soap.

7. *Drill.*—Every student must attend drill at the prescribed times. Those students who elect to join the College detachment of the Ceylon Volunteers and make themselves efficient each year will not be required to attend the other drills in order to qualify for the diploma.

8. *Vacation.*—The usual vacations will be observed at Easter, in August, and at Christmas. Students whose course includes surveying and levelling will attend for a fortnight at camp in one of the vacations.

9. *Examinations.*—Examinations will be held three times a year, and the place of the student in order of merit determined accordingly. But due account will be taken besides, in determining the order of merit, of the thoroughness of the home work as shown by the note books, regularity of attendance, and general conduct.

10. *Diplomas.*—Diplomas will be granted to those students in each department of the College who take the full course and who satisfy the Examiners at the term and final examinations.

11. *Irregularities.*—Reports of absence or irregularity of any kind will be made to parents or guardians.

A student who misconducts himself may be expelled at the option of the Director of Public Instruction.

No claim shall lie for any refund of fees paid on behalf of a student who has been sentenced to expulsion.

DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING.
THREE-YEAR COURSE.

SYLLABUS.

The Entrance Examination will be as follows:—

Preliminary.—Handwriting, Orthography, Arithmetic (including vulgar and decimal fractions).

English: Composition, English History, Geography; Algebra (up to and including quadratic equations); Geometry (the first two books of Euclid).

Colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese (required of candidates for certain Government appointments).

Candidates who hold certificates of having passed the Senior Cambridge or other examination of similar standing, or have matriculated at the London University or other similar institution from time to time approved by His Excellency the Governor, will be exempted from this examination in all subjects except colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese, if their certificates show that they have passed in Mathematics.

The Syllabus for the College course will be that of the Institution of Civil Engineers as laid down for the examinations for the election of Associate Members as follows:—

- I.—*Theoretical and elementary applied mechanics*.—Statics of solids and fluids; statical problems connected with loaded structures; gravity and attraction; friction; static, kinematic, and kinetic problems relating to machines; conservation of energy; theory of mechanisms.
- II.—*Theory of structures and the strength and elasticity of materials*.—Graphic and analytic methods for calculation of bending moments and of shearing forces and of the stresses in individual members of framework structures loaded at the joints; plate and box girders; incomplete and redundant frames; theory of continuous girders and principal methods of calculation; travelling loads; rivetted and pin joint girders; rigid and hinged arches; strains due to weight of structures; theory of earth pressure and of foundations; stability of masonry and brickwork structures. Coefficients of elasticity; elastic resistance to tension, compression, shearing, and torsion; uniform and varying stress; moment of stress and of resistance in beams of various sections; distribution of shearing stress in beams; stresses suddenly applied and effect of impact; buckling of struts; effects of different end fastenings on their resistance; combined strains; calculations connected with statically indeterminate problems, such as beams supported at three points, &c.; limit of elasticity; yield point and ultimate resistance of various materials as tested; plastic state; principal forms of testing machines and of appliances used in measurement for the determination of coefficients of elasticity; calculations of extension, deflection, buckling, &c., within elastic limits, and of ultimate strength and utility for ordinary materials of construction.
- III.—*Hydraulics*.—The laws of the flow of water by orifices, notches, and weirs; laws of fluid friction; steady flow in pipes or channels of uniform section; resistance of valves and bends; general phenomena of flow in rivers; methods of determining the discharge of streams; tidal actions; generation and effect of waves; impulse and re-action of jets of water; transmission of energy by fluids; principles of machines acting by the weight and pressure of water; theory and structure of turbines and pumps.

The course will include also mathematics, drawing, experimental mechanics and workshop practice within the limits of the work required by the above syllabus. Surveying and levelling will be taken in addition during the last six months of the course.

The syllabus for Surveying and Levelling will be—

Field Work.—Chain surveying; theodolite surveying and levelling, including the adjustments of the theodolite and level and setting out curves.

Drawing.—Setting out; plotting; tracing; and office work, including a report on a survey.

FEES.

The fees will be Rs. 100 per annum paid in advance, and in addition a deposit of Rs. 100 will be made on admission.

Second Year.

Laboratory Work (eight hours per week).—Telegraph and telephone instruments; detection of leakage and faults; line construction and maintenance.

Lectures (three hours per week).—Measuring instruments; leakage; resistance; signalling instruments; sounders; recorders; line construction and maintenance.

Drawing (five hours per week).—Parts of instruments; circuit arrangements; telephone switch boards.

Classes (four hours per week).—Exercise classes on laboratory work and lectures.

Note.—Students who intend to qualify for Railway appointments will take Shorthand and Typewriting and Mental Arithmetic in the second year in place of Mathematics and Drawing.

TWO-YEAR COURSE.

SYLLABUS

First Year.

Workshop Practice (six hours per week).—Woodwork: names and uses of tools; examples of joints; tenon and mortice joints, dovetails, framing and panelling, &c. Metalwork: names and uses of tools; chipping, filing, scraping; fitting, drilling, and tapping; screwing.

Mathematics (five hours per week).—Algebra; areas and cubic contents; quantities; logarithms.

Lectures (two hours per week).—Mechanical principles; work; efficiency; transmission by lever, screw, and wheel; forces in equilibrium; velocity and acceleration; stress and strain; properties of materials; proportions of simple structures.

Classes (two hours per week).—Exercise classes on laboratory work and lectures.

Second Year.

Drawing (eight hours per week).—Graphic statics; roofs and girders; machine design.

Workshop Practice (eight hours per week).—Woodwork: turning; pattern-making. Metalwork: turning; planing; screw-cutting; fitting and setting out.

Mathematics (five hours per week).—Equations; elementary trigonometry.

Lectures (two hours per week).—Beams; struts; shafts; springs; belts; spur gear; steam engines; gas engines; oil engines.

Classes (two hours per week).—Exercise classes on lectures.

Regulations for the Admission of Ceylonese to certain Appointments.

(1.)—THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

1. All appointments will be made in the first instance to the Head Overseer Grade, without exception.

2. Candidates will be selected in the first instance by a competitive examination (viz., the entrance examination of the Ceylon Technical College in the Department of Civil Engineering, unless they hold certificates which exempt them), and having been pronounced physically fit and having gained the nomination of His Excellency the Governor will become students of the Technical College in a special course of training in Civil Engineering, and will become subject to the regulations of that Institution for not less than three years. They must gain the diploma of the College in Civil Engineering duly attested by the Director of Public Works, who is appointed to be associated with the Superintendent of the College, in matters connected with the course of study. They will be required to serve a further two years in the Government Factory or Railway

Works, or other approved engineering works in Ceylon; and after completing that term of service satisfactorily, selection will be made from among them for appointment to posts in the Head Overseer Grade as vacancies may occur in the three years immediately following after the completion of their apprenticeship. They will be eligible for promotion afterwards, subject to the rules and regulations of the Department, to the grade of District Engineer.

3. Students of the Technical College who have gained the diploma of the College will, during their service of two years in the Government Factory or Railway Works or other approved engineering works in Ceylon, be paid during the first year of such service at the rate of 75 cents per diem, and during the second year at the rate of Re. 1.25 per diem, provided they pursue their studies with due diligence and their conduct is satisfactory.

4. Candidates must not be less than 16 years nor more than 18 years of age on the first day of the year in which the entrance examination for admission to the College is held, and must satisfy the Examiners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. They must be of sound constitution, possessed of good sight, and be otherwise physically qualified for service, and they will be called on to undergo a medical examination to test these points.

5. The classification of the Public Works Department in the District Engineer and lower grades is given below. Head Overseers who have attended the full course in the Department of Civil Engineering of the Technical College, who have gained the diploma of Civil Engineering, duly attested, and have served afterwards a two-year apprenticeship in approved works, are eligible for promotion to the grade of Inspector without further examination, but subject to their proficiency and suitability.

For promotion from the class of Inspector to that of Third Grade District Engineer candidates must pass an examination known as the "Junior Examination," in the following subjects:—

- Geometry : the first four books of Euclid and deductions.
- Mensuration : taking out quantities and estimating.
- Surveying and levelling.
- Drawing.
- Civil engineering.

6. To rise from the third grade into the second and qualify for the first grade, a final examination must be passed, which will be known as the "Senior Examination," in the following subjects:—

1. Trigonometry : practical trigonometry (heights and distances).
2. Civil engineering.
3. Mensuration : taking out quantities; estimating analyses of work.
4. Surveying and levelling.
5. Drawing.
6. Departmental rules and accounts.

The examination in the last four subjects will take place in the Provincial Headquarters of the Province in which the candidate may happen to be stationed.

7. The classification of the Public Works Department in the District Engineer and lower grades is as follows:—

First Grade.

Fifteen appointments as District Engineers at Rs. 4,500 to Rs. 6,000 per annum.

Second Grade.

Twenty-four appointments as District Engineers at Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 4,000 per annum.

Third Grade.

Three appointments as District Engineers at Rs. 2,500 per annum.

Three do. at Rs. 2,000 do.

Fourth Grade.

Seven appointments as Inspectors at Rs. 1,500 per annum.

Fifth Grade.

Fifteen appointments as Head Overseers at Rs. 1,000 per annum.

The above regulations apply only to those Ceylonese who have not qualified by the usual training in England in Civil Engineering. Ceylonese who have so qualified by fulfilling at least the under-mentioned conditions will be eligible for appointments as District Engineers (second grade) on vacancies occurring.

In the case of a candidate who has only received the general education required for studentship of the Institution of Civil Engineers, a pupilage or a training as an assistant of not less than three years' duration is required, and during this time the candidate shall have given his attention to various branches of work, partly in an engineer's office and partly in or upon engineering works.

In the case of a candidate whose education has included a college course in scientific subjects, and who can produce such a certificate of that course as is accepted by the Institution of Civil Engineers, a pupilage or a training as an assistant of not less than two years' duration is required, and during this time the candidate shall have given his attention to various branches of work, partly in an engineer's office and partly in or upon engineering works.

The addition to the regulations regarding the admission of Ceylonese to the Public Works Department, dated 15th November, 1899, is hereby cancelled.

(2.)—THE SURVEYOR-GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT.

Appointments to the third grade of Surveyors in the Surveyor-General's Department, who are paid at the rate of Rs. 1,200 per annum, will be made by selection as vacancies occur from holders of the diploma in Civil Engineering of the Technical College gained in the College course immediately preceding the year such vacancies occur; but of the actual vacancies in that grade such holders are to be eligible only for every alternate one in rotation with those candidates

in the Department at the time who can qualify by examination and seniority of service for promotion to that grade; that is to say, of two vacancies in the third grade, one is to be filled by selection from among outside candidates from the Technical College, and the other from among candidates in the ranks of the Department who can qualify for such promotion, and so on alternately with every vacancy which may occur in that grade.

Appointments directly to the third grade from among the eligible candidates from the Technical College will be made without further examination, and they will be eligible for promotion from grade to grade, according to merit, along with the other officers of the Department of the same grades; but to qualify for promotion out of the first grade Surveyors, who are paid at the rate of Rs. 3,200 per annum, into the senior grades, they as well as all other officers of the same standing must pass the departmental qualifying examination instituted for that purpose.

Candidates from the Technical College for appointment to such vacancies are eligible for selection if they gain the diploma in Civil Engineering in the College course immediately before such vacancies occur, and if their diploma is duly attested by the Surveyor-General, who is appointed to be associated with the Superintendent of the College in matters connected with the courses of study.

Candidates for these appointments must be not more than 18 years of age on the first day of the year they enter the College. They must pass a medical examination for physical fitness and the entrance examination of the Department of Civil Engineering, including colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese.

Their course of training at the Technical College will extend over three years, and they will be subject to the regulations of that Institution for that period.

All officers of the Department who have passed the departmental qualifying examination are eligible for appointments in the senior grades up to the rank of Superintendent of Surveys on Rs. 6,500 per annum, but vacancies in the senior grades will be filled up alternately from the Department and from Cooper's Hill College.

(3.)—THE TELEGRAPH BRANCH OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.

Admission to the Telegraph Branch of the Post and Telegraph Department may be obtained by presentation of the Diploma of the Ceylon Technical College. Appointments are made as vacancies occur, and the holders of the Diploma of the Ceylon Technical College will have preference as regards priority of appointment over other candidates. Several vacancies occur every year.

The commencing salary will be Rs. 360 per annum, but this will be followed by promotion to a class at Rs. 500 rising by annual increments to Rs. 900, with allowances. There are 93 fixed appointments of this kind. Then, by promotion to the next class a salary of Rs. 1,100 is attained, with annual increments thereafter until Rs. 1,500 is reached. There are 10 appointments in the special class varying in salary from Rs. 1,700 to Rs. 3,000, and a Postmaster of merit may be selected for the post of Inspector of Telegraphs, the salary of which rises to Rs. 2,000.

Candidates must be not more than 19 years of age on the first day of the year they enter the Technical College. They must pass a medical examination for physical fitness and an entrance examination in the following subjects:—

- (a) Handwriting; orthography; composition; geography; arithmetic; algebra (up to and including simple equations); geometry (the first book of Euclid).
- (b) Elementary trigonometry; inorganic chemistry; electricity and magnetism.

The subjects (b) are not compulsory, but evidence of some elementary knowledge of these will count advantageously for gaining admission.

The course of training at the Technical College will extend over two years, and candidates will be subject to the regulations of that institution during that period.

(4.)—TO CERTAIN DEPARTMENTS OF THE RAILWAY.

All Ceylonese candidates for admission to the following departments of the Ceylon Government Railway, as vacancies may occur, must present diplomas showing that they have passed a specific course of training at the Ceylon Technical College, and gained in the course immediately preceding the time when such vacancies occur. Such diplomas gained in the department of the College which provides the appropriate training and duly attested by the General Manager of the Railways who is appointed to be associated with the Superintendent of the College in matters connected with the course of study, renders the holder eligible for selection to such appointments without further examination.

The departments of the Railway are:—

- (1) Station Clerks and Telegraph Operators.
- (2) Draughtsmen Clerks.
- (3) Overseers of Ways and Works.
- (4) Apprentices in the Locomotive Department.

And to qualify for selection to such appointments the candidates must have passed the course and gained the diploma in the following departments of the College respectively:—

- (1) The department of Telegraphy, with Shorthand and Typewriting.
- (2) and (3) The department of Civil Engineering.
- (4) The department of Mechanical Engineering.

All appointments will be made in the first instance to the lowest grade. Promotion to the higher grades will be subject to merit and seniority of service in the Department.

Station Clerks and Telegraph Operators.

Candidates for appointment as Station Clerks and Telegraph Operators must be not more than 19 years of age on the first day of the year they enter the Technical College. They must pass the medical examination for physical fitness and eye-

sight, and must be not less than 5 ft. 4 in. in height and 31 in. girth round the chest. They must pass an entrance examination in the following subjects:—

- (a) Handwriting; orthography; composition; geography; arithmetic; algebra (up to and including simple equations); geometry (the first book of Euclid).
 (b) Elementary trigonometry; inorganic chemistry; electricity and magnetism.

The subjects (b) are not compulsory, but evidence of some elementary knowledge of these will count advantageously for gaining admission.

The training at the Technical College shall extend over two years, and the candidates will be subject to the regulations of that institution during that period.

The commencing salary will be Rs. 360, but there will be fixed *annual* increments which will increase the salary to Rs. 720 in less than six years. There are 155 fixed appointments of this kind in the Department, to be recruited in this way. Then, by promotion a salary of Rs. 800 is attained, with annual increments thereafter until Rs. 1,100 is reached, and further promotion to a class of Rs. 1,100 by annual increments to Rs. 1,600. The highest posts to which present candidates may aspire to attain by efficiency and merit carry with them salaries rising to Rs. 2,500; there will probably be 12 such posts with salaries of Rs. 1,700 to Rs. 2,200, and 5 with salaries of Rs. 2,000 to Rs. 2,500. One special appointment carries a salary of Rs. 3,000 to Rs. 3,500.

Draughtsmen.

Candidates for appointment as draughtsmen must be not more than 21 years of age on the first day of the year they enter the Technical College. They must pass the medical examination for physical fitness and eyesight. They must pass the entrance examination of the Department of Civil Engineering including colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese.

The training at the Technical College shall extend over three years, and the candidate will be subject to the regulations of that institution during that period.

They must pass the medical examination for physical fitness and eyesight, and must be not less than 5 ft. 4 in. in height and 31 in. girth round the chest. They must pass the entrance examination of the Department of Civil Engineering, including colloquial Tamil or Sinhalese.

The training at the Technical College shall extend over three years, and the candidates will be subject to the regulations of that institution during that period.

They must pass an entrance examination in the following subjects:—

Handwriting; orthography; composition; arithmetic; geography of Ceylon.

The training at the Technical College shall extend over two years, and the candidates will be subject to the regulations of that institution during that period.

Regulations for Granting the License of the Surveyor-General to Students of the course in Surveying and Levelling at the Ceylon Technical College.

Students in the department of Surveying and Levelling of the Technical College, who pass the prescribed course and gain the diploma at the final examination of the course held at the Technical College, and satisfy as well the officer appointed by the Governor on the recommendation of the Surveyor-General to hold the examination, shall be eligible for the license and for registration as Surveyors or as Surveyors and Levellers without further examination and payment of the fees prescribed in section 5 of the Ordinance No. 15 of 1889. Such candidates for the license must be more than 21 years of age when they apply, and they must pay the registration fee and the stamp duty on the license as provided for in sections 2 and 7 of the Ordinance.
