HEREAS by section 4 of "The Dog Registration Ordinance, 1901," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the Government Gazette, to bring any province, district, town, or place under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such province, district, town, or place for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with the like advice, determine:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the town of Kurunegala, in the North-Western Province, under the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the powers in Us vested by the said section of the said Ordinance, do hereby as from and after the First day of June, 1902, bring the town of Kurunegala aforesaid under the operation of the said Ordinance, and define the limits of the said town for the purposes of the Ordinance to be those set out in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Town of Kurunegala.

On the west by a line drawn from a point on the Puttalam road, two chains on the north-west of its junction with the Circular road, parallel with the Circular road, and at a distance of two chains from it up to the Welgoda-ela, thence directly to a point on the Negombo road, two chains to the west of its junction with the old Negombo road, otherwise called the Malkaduwawa circular, and thence to a point two chains due south of the Negombo road; on the south by a line drawn from the southern end of the western boundary, parallel with the said old Negombo road or Malkaduwawa circular, and two chains distant from it as far as the Colombo road, thence straight to a point six chains south of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ milepost on the Kandy road; on the east by a line drawn from the eastern extremity of the southern boundary to the $1\frac{1}{2}$ milepost on the Dambool road, and thence to a point half a mile due north; on the north by a line drawn from the northern extremity of the eastern boundary to the northernmost point of the western boundary.

Limits of the Town of Trincomalec.

East and North-East.—Dutch Bay, Fort Frederick, up to a line taken from the junction of the Love lane with the Coast road to the sea.
