IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by section 26 *a* of the Ordinance No. 2 of 1877 (see section 4 of the Ordinance No. 21 of 1900), it is enacted that the Governor may, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time make rules for the direction and guidance of Notaries, not being advocates or proctors, in the discharge of their notarial duties:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said section of the said first-mentioned Ordinance, that any rule so made shall be published in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and be laid before the Legislative Council; and that if

within 40 days of such rule being so laid it is not amended or annulled by the Legislative Council, such rule shall be proclaimed in two successive issues of the *Government Gazette* in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages, and shall come into force upon such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* :

And whereas the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the rule appearing in the schedule hereto annexed for the direction and guidance of such notaries :

And whereas the said rule has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th day of February and 7th day of March, 1902, in the English, Sinhalese, and Tamil languages and was laid before the Legislative Council on the 15th March, 1902, and has not been amended or annulled by the said Council :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim the said rule.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Two.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the period or periods in respect of which he tenders, and the price or prices that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above.

Tenders, properly sealed, may either be posted, addressed to the Hon. Mr. R. W. Ievers, Acting Colonial Secretary, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," or delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

Rules and Regulations made by the Local Board of Batticaloa, under Section 23 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893.

1. No licensed butcher or other person shall slaughter cattle at any place other than the public slaughter-house proclaimed as such. Slaughtering shall not take place except between the hours of 3 and 5 P.M.
2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle before slaughter shall be the cattle pound at the Batticaloa Police Station.
3. No licensed butcher shall slaughter any cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, unless he shall have previously exposed the same to public view at the appointed place for a period of not less than twenty-four hours.
4. Every licensed butcher and any person slaughtering under special license shall produce for inspection before the Medical Officer appointed by the Local Board any animal or cattle he desires to slaughter.
5. The Medical Officer inspecting shall keep a register of all animals exposed for inspection in the following form :—

6. For each animal passed as fit for slaughter the inspecting Medical Officer shall demand the sale voucher, or, if bearing the butcher's brands, a certificate from a headman.
7. The inspecting Medical Officer shall endorse on this "passed as fit for slaughtering" with his signature and date, and pass the documents to the Inspector of the Local Board, or other officer appointed by the Local Board under rule 8 to be in charge of the slaughter-house.

8. The slaughter house shall be in charge of the Inspector of the Local Board or such officer as the Local Board may from time to time by writing appoint. He shall keep a register in the following form :—

9. In the case of sheep or goats a written permit to slaughter, signed by the inspecting Medical Officer, shall be produced with each animal brought for slaughter.

10. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge of the slaughter-house to see that the animal so passed and no other is slaughtered. He shall require the production of the voucher or certificates under rule 6, or permit under rule 9, and shall not allow any animal to be slaughtered until such documents have been delivered to him. He shall endorse on the same "slaughtered in my presence" with signature and date, and at the end of each month send the vouchers, certificates, and permits, with a copy of the register under rule 8, to the inspecting Medical Officer.

11. The permission to slaughter shall only be valid for seven days from the date of the inspecting Medical Officer's passing the cattle or animal.

12. The inspecting Medical Officer shall check the endorsed voucher or certificate, or permit, and copy of register received under rule 10, with the register kept by him under rule 5, and report any discrepancy to the Chairman of the Local Board, to whom he shall transmit the documents received by him.

13. Every butcher or other person shall pay for the use of the slaughter-house the fees prescribed in the annexed schedule to the officer in charge of the slaughter-house:—

14. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge to recover the fee due for every animal before he permits slaughter, and to note on the day of slaughter the date of such slaughter in the register under rule 8.

15. The officer in charge shall remit within seven days after the end of each month to the Chairman of the Local Board the fees collected by him in respect of such month.

16. Should the meat of any animal slaughtered appear to the officer in charge to be unfit for human food, it shall be his duty to at once secure the lungs and liver, and cause the butcher to produce them and the meat before the Medical Officer, and if such Medical Officer shall be of opinion that the meat is unfit for human food, to cause the same to be forthwith buried or destroyed, and report the matter to the Chairman of the Local Board.

17. The Medical Officer shall make daily inspection of meat of all cattle passed by him for slaughter or exposed for sale by any butcher.

Regulations.

1. All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for burial of the body for which the grave is required.
2. The keeper shall intimate the line to be followed by a funeral party on arrival at the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party arrive at the same time, the order in which they are respectively to move to the graves, and funeral parties shall obey the directions of the keeper.
3. Should it be necessary, for the purpose of preventing the disturbance of one funeral party by another and not otherwise, the keeper of the cemetery may require that one burial service shall be concluded before the other commences.
4. The keeper of the cemetery shall be entitled to keep order within the cemetery and his orders are to be obeyed.
5. No grave shall be less than 4 ft. in depth or at a distance of less than 4 ft. from any other. No grave shall be re-opened within a year, nor vault within six months from the date of the last interment therein, except upon orders made by a competent Police Magistrate.

The above are rough measurements.

Logs sold as sound, but proving on felling to be hollow or rotten, must nevertheless be brought out of the forest by the purchaser, when they will be sold by public auction and 60 per cent. of the proceeds paid over to the purchaser.

Logs will not be considered hollow or rotten if the unsoundness is slight and extends only a few feet, nor will cracks be considered unsoundness. The decision on these points to rest with the Assistant Conservator of Forests.

Tenders are invited for the purchase of—

- All the trees in the whole forest;
- All the trees of any particular species in the whole forest;
- All the trees in any one or more of the compartments;
- All the trees of any particular species in any one or more of the compartments.

Tenders will not be received for a limited number of trees to be selected out of the forest or any compartments.

Offers may be made by lump sum, or rates per tree or per cubic foot. It should be stated in the tender how payment of the purchase money will be made.

All the trees purchased will have to be felled and removed from the forest within one year after date of signing contract.

In the event of a rate per cubic foot being accepted, 10 per cent. will be allowed for bark, &c., off cubic contents calculated from actual measurements of felled logs.

Any person wishing to tender for the purchase of the above trees should deposit in the Trincomalee Kachcheri the sum of Rs. 50 and submit the receipt to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, North-Eastern Circle, who will thereupon issue to him the form on which the tender must be made. No tender will be considered unless it is furnished on the recognized form thus obtained.

The original tender must be sent to the Assistant Conservator of Forests and the duplicate of it direct to the Hon. the Auditor-General, both being despatched at the same time.

Should the person tendering decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish security, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown.

The rate per tree or per cubic foot or by lump sum must be quoted, written both in words and figures.

All alterations in any tender should be initialled by the person signing it. All tenders containing alterations not so initialled will be treated as informal and rejected.

Cash security at the rate of 5 per cent. of the purchase money, but not less than Rs. 50 in any case, will have to be deposited for the due fulfilment of the contract before it is signed.

The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.
