Africa, East Coast—Beira Harbour - Rambler Channel—Buoyage.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 10 dated January 6, 1902, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 99 of 1902) that a misprint has occurred in the description of the positions of A and B buoys; the correct bearing of Massique point from A buoy being N. 45° W., and from B buoy, N. 57° W.

The notice should accordingly read thus:—

A buoy (black) is situated with Ponta Jea light bearing N. 1° E., distant $5\frac{4}{10}$ miles; Massique point bearing N. 45° W.

B buoy (red) is situated with Ponta Jea light bearing N. 6° E., distant $3\frac{7}{10}$ miles; Massique point bearing N. 57° W.

The remaining part of the notice is correct.
Approximate position: lat. 19° 54' S., long. 34° 50' E.
Variation, 16° westerly in 1902.

Australia, South—Streaky Bay—Light established on Flinders Jetty.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 104 of 1902) that on and after January 1, 1902, a fixed white light will be exhibited from the end of the jetty at Flinders, Streaky bay, visible in clear weather from a distance of 6 miles, when bearing from S. 19° W., through south to S. 5° E.

The light will be shown from a square white box on the end of the jetty.

*Australia, West—Cockburn Sound—Woodman Point—
Light Building.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 105 of
1902) that a gray stone lighthouse is in course of con-
struction on Woodman point, Cockburn sound, from
which it is intended to exhibit a dioptric 1st order
occluding light showing white, red, and green sectors, the
central sector being white.

The light will be elevated 123 ft. above high water.

Further notice will be given with reference to the
exhibition of the light, the period of occultation and
limits of the sectors.

—Rock in Southern Entrance.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 110 of
1902) of the existence of a rock, with less than 6 ft. of
water on it, in the southern entrance to the channel
between pulo Pasi and pulo Salayar, south coast of
Celebes island.

The rock is situated with the south point of pulo Pasi

extreme of Padang point bearing N. 7° W.
