BENGAL.—No. 86.

Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Oyster Reef Light-house—Erection of a Screw Pile Beacon.

The Principal Port Officer, Burma, has given notice, dated March 27, 1902, that a screw pile beacon has been erected near the site of the old Oyster reef light-house in lat. 20° 5' 2" N., long. 92° 38' 29" E., in 3 fathoms water.

NOTE.—Madras being considered in 80° 14' 9", the meridian on which Admiralty Chart No. 821 is constructed. The beacon consists of a red globular-shaped basket, six ft. in diameter, supported at a height of 27 ft. above H. W. O. S. T. by five round steel rods.

The Oyster Reef buoy has now been removed.

NOTE.—Mariners are warned that whereas the above position of the beacon, if laid off on Chart No. 821, will show the beacon as being west of the reef, it is really east of it, the reef being charted too much to the westward. Mariners are therefore warned to give the beacon a wide berth.

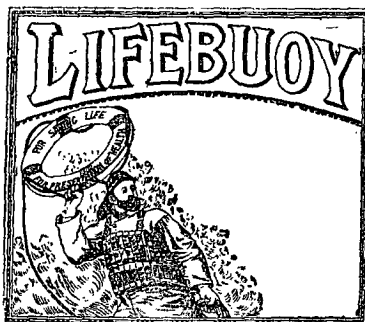
