## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, November 11, 1904.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 5, 1904.

*Present*:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Major A. W. de Wilton; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. P. D. Warren; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Mr. Giles F. Walker; Dr. C. T. Griffin; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; and Dr. W. H. de Silva.

The Minutes of October 14, 1904, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of October 14, 1904, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That the Inspector-General of Police be allowed to use the upstairs portion of the new Fire Brigade buildings as an office for Mr. J. H. Daniel, Assistant Superintendent of Police, until such time as the rooms may be required for the Superintendent, Fire Brigade, or for any other purpose, it being distinctly understood that the building will be vacated at any time on a moment's notice.

Dr. C. W. van Geyzel seconded.—Carried.

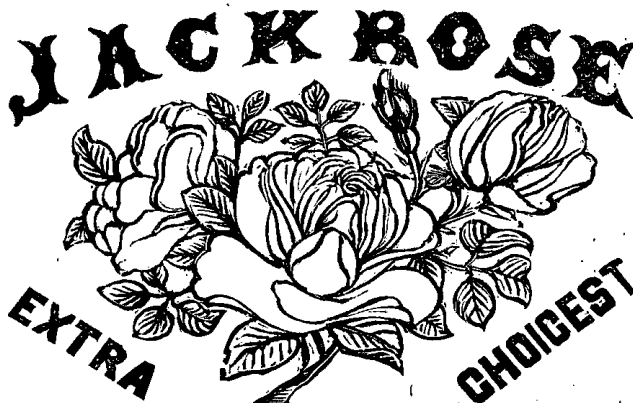
