MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, October 15, 1904, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated October 11, 1904.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G., Chairman; Hon. Mr. W. D. Gibbon; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman; L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on September 17, 1904, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1903 to September 30, 1904, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of September, 1904.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Resolved—That statements be circulated.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during September.

Resolved—That the reports be circulated.

4. Correspondence :—

(a) Read memorandum dated September 16, 1904, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter No. 1411 of same date to the Director of Public Works, stating that His Excellency the Governor has ordered that the widening of the bridge over the spill wall of the lake should not be carried out, and the sanction given is cancelled.

(b) Read letter No. 122 of September 28, 1904, from the Hon. the Government Agent, forwarding copy of letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary regarding the fire escape ladder provided for the new Government buildings.

(c) Read letter No. 23, dated October 7, 1904, from the Colonial Secretary, stating, in reply to the Chairman's letter No. 59 of September 22 respecting the extension of the road from Lewella to Katugastota, that owing to many claims on the estimates for 1905 the work in question cannot be undertaken.

(d) Read circular No. 171, dated October 5, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of Ordinance No. 4 of 1904, "An Ordinance for better enforcement of certain conditions in sale of Tolls, Arrack Rent, and Opium Licenses."

5. Draft of an Ordinance to extend the powers of the Municipal Council of Colombo with regard to the provision and maintenance of schools, and which had been previously circulated, was laid on the table.

In accordance with notice the Chairman proposed the following motion.—That Government be asked to extend the proposed Ordinance with regard to the provision and maintenance of schools to Kandy as well as to Colombo.

This was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, and on being put to the Meeting carried unanimously.

6. Report of the Special Committee appointed on August 20, embodying remarks on the Annual Administration Report, was submitted (Appendix A).

On proposal by Mr Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Jonklaas, it was resolved that the report just read be accepted and forwarded to Government.

7. Read the following recommendation by Standing Committee (D) on Municipal Works :—

That application for house service pipes be allowed as follows :

Resolved—That the recommendation be adopted, and the applications for house service pipes granted on the usual conditions.

8. The Chairman reported that he had appointed Mr. Vivian Perera as Inspector in place of Mr. Wickramatunga, who had been dismissed.

9. The Secretary stated that the cemetery-keeper had reported that owing to the transfer of the portion of the cemetery marked for Dutch Presbyterians, previously used for this purpose, no place was left for the interment of unbaptized persons.

Annual Administration Report, 1903.

The Administration Report under consideration is a very full and complete one.

We are glad to observe that the recommendations of the Special Committee appointed to consider the Annual Report for 1902 have, as regards electric lighting and police, been adopted in 1903.

As regards postal facilities, we still think that further extension of these facilities are needed. While grateful for the boon of increased post pillars, we are of opinion that a receiving postal and telegraph office in a central position of the town is an essential want ; as also the opening of branch Post office at Katugastota.

With the arrival of the tipping wagons provided for in the Budget for 1904 and the increased prison labour sanctioned, we trust that the highly important work of widening and improving the recreation ground will be expeditiously carried out.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of September, 1904.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month. On September 14 I visited Colombo street (about 5.30 P.M.) and found the road strowed with rubbish from the carts which had been unloaded there during the day. This is a very busy thoroughfare, and an extra late cart should be sent to clear up after the business of the day is finished. This I have reported before and a late cart was then put on. Why should it be discontinued?

Drains.—Drains clean and well flushed.

Water supply.—Good. I attach an analysis sample taken from the standpipe in Ward street.

Alleys.—Kept as clean as possible; their owners were noticed to re-cement these drains. A good deal of this work has been completed.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—Well kept.

Bakeries.—In good order.

Market.—Generally well kept.

Cattle passed this month.—Cattle, 430; buffalo, 104; sheep, 123; goats, 219. All food stuffs were daily inspected by me and found to be good.

Slaughter-house and exposing shed.—Well kept.

Night soil depôt.—Well kept.

Cooly lines.—All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

Public health.—Good. A few cases of measles and one case of enteric fever were reported. Two other cases that were reported as enteric proved not to be enteric. Every precaution was taken even in the doubtful cases.

Examination of a Sample of Drinking Water.

Source and possibility of contamination: standpipe in Ward street. No possibility of contamination.

Chemical and Physical Examination.

1. Colour in 6-in. column: colourless.
Turbidity: no turbidity; bright, clear.
2. Odour: none.
3. Residue left on evaporation: a trace of white residue, which did not char when ignited.
4. Free ammonia: none.
5. Chlorine: under 2 grains per gallon.
Equivalent of common salt: about 3 grains per gallon.
6. Nitrites: none.
7. Nitrates: none.
8. Hardness: about four degrees.
9. Lead: none.
10. Zinc, iron, and copper: none.
11. Oxygen absorbed in 15 minutes at 212° F.: not more than .05 grain per gallon.

From the examination of the source of the water herein referred to, and the results obtained by analysis, I am of opinion that it is a clear water and well adapted for all domestic purposes.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, November 19, 1904, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated November 15, 1904.

Present.—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G., Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman; L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on October 15, 1904, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. Before proceeding with the business as entered on the Agenda paper Mr. Sproule brought forward, with permission, the following motion of which he had given notice: "that the Council be pleased, in terms of the provisions of section 32 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, to restore Mr. Edwin Beven, Member of Ward No. 3 to the office of Councillor for the said ward.

This was seconded by Mr. Habeeboo Lebbe, and on being put to the Meeting carried *nem. con.*

3. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1903 to October 31, 1904, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of October, 1904.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

With reference to the Health Officer's remarks on dairies, in his monthly report, it was resolved that the attention of the Health Officer be called to the provisions of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, chapter 2, and that the Inspectors be directed to enforce the requirements of section 39.

Resolved also that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Sanitation for report.

5. The Auditor's reports for the months of September and October were submitted.

Resolved—That the reports be circulated.

6. The following correspondence was read:—

(a) Letter No. 24, dated October 21, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, stating, in reply to the Chairman's letter, that owing to the stronger claims of other places for postal facilities a Post, Telegraph, and Money Order Office at Katugastota cannot be opened from January, 1905; also an estimate from the Postmaster-General of the approximate cost of opening and maintaining a Post and Telegraph Office at Katugastota.

(b) Circular No. 182, dated November 1, 1904, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding conditions to be attached to opium licenses.

7. Letter No. 129 of October 20, 1904, from the Government Agent, reporting the sale of the Illukmodara and Kundasale ferry tolls and recommending their acceptance was read; also letter No. 125, dated November 15, from the Government Agent, reporting sale of Lewella ferry toll for 1905 and recommending acceptance of the offer.

Resolved—That the offers made for the several tolls be accepted as recommended.

8. The carriage by-laws as revised by the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects, and which had been previously circulated among Members, were submitted and considered.

Resolved—That in clause 19 "jinrickshas" be omitted, as they should be classified; that under section 21 the following places for carriage stands be added:—Katugastota road, near the bridge, and northern end of Trincomalee street.

Proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Habeeboo Lebbe, that the by-laws as amended, as provided for by section 20 of Ordinance No. 90 of 1901, be forwarded for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

The motion was carried unanimously on being put to the Meeting.

9. Read report by the Health Officer that the cesspit privy on premises No. 92, Brownrigg street, is in an insanitary state, and recommending that it be emptied, disinfected, and closed, and a dry-earth closet substituted therefor.

Resolved—That the Health Officer's recommendation be carried out in respect of the cesspit on premises No. 92, Brownrigg street, and that the necessary notice be issued.

10. Read recommendation by Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.

That the application from a number of Hindu and Buddhist residents for a site within the cemetery, whereon to erect a mortuary temple or hall, be granted.

Proposed by Mr. Creasy, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the applicants be called on to submit a further plan showing the elevation and cross section of the proposed building.

The motion was carried *nem con*.

11. Read application by Mr. J. H. Eaton for house service pipes to premises No. 3, situated at Wewelpitiya and adjoining Woodlands, where a new building is in course of construction.

Resolved on motion by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Sproule, that the application be granted as recommended by the Standing Committee, on the condition mentioned in the Secretary's letter No. 1,965 of November 4 to Mr. Eaton.

12. Read letter No. 136, dated November 16, from the Government Agent, reporting the sale of opium licenses for 1905 for Rs. 6,755 to V. Cathamuthupillai.

Resolved that the offer be accepted.

- That Rs. 2,500 be voted for renewing roof of Green market.
- That Rs. 1,600 be voted for improving the Fort market.
- That Rs. 250 be voted for rebuilding old culverts.
- That Rs. 500 be voted for building a hut for the watcher, Bikke reservoir.
- That Rs. 500 be appropriated from the loan for sanitary improvements for reclaiming the Pettigala-ela below the Talapitiya cross road bridge.

The following amendments were then made, viz. :—

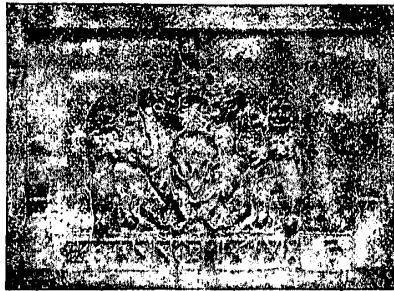

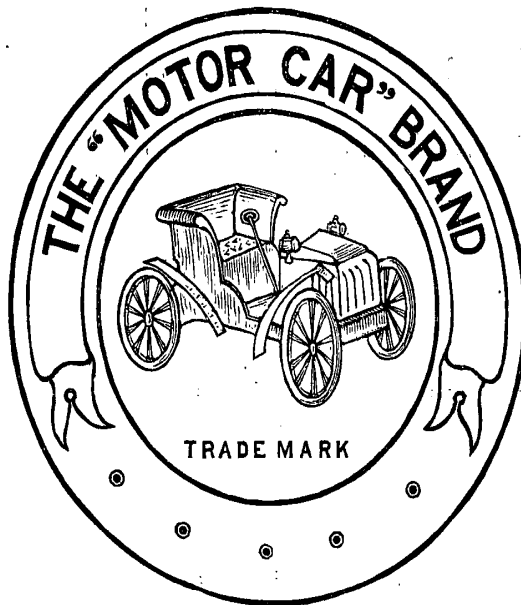

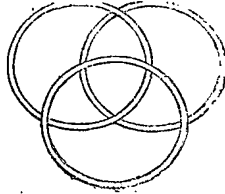
