MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the
Municipal Office on Friday, February 14, 1902.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 8, 1902.

Present.—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Mr. A. Perry; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; Mr. D. W. H. Skrine; the Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; and Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen.

The Minutes of January 10, 1902, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of January 10, 1902, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. R. Morgan presented a petition from the residents of Wellawatta lane and its vicinity praying that the lane be put in order and a lamp-post be erected, and moved that it be considered.

The petition having been taken as read, Mr. R. H. Morgan moved that the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman to be dealt with as he thinks fit.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.—Carried.

2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Solomon Fernando presented a petition from the residents and house owners of Ambalama road, Kotahena, praying for water and light.

The Chairman intimated that he would confer with the Member for the Kotahena Ward on the subject and consider it.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera moved—That this Council do present an Address of Congratulation to His Majesty the King on the occasion of his Coronation, and that a Special Committee be appointed to draft an Address and make the necessary arrangements. This motion was, by leave of Council, amended by the addition of the words "and also to make recommendations generally for celebrating the event." Mr. C. Perera further moved that the Special Committee do consist of the Chairman, Mr. A. Perry, Mr. A. de A. Seneviratne, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. R. H. Morgan, Mr. Arthur Alvis, Dr. Solomon Fernando, and the mover—three to form a quorum.

Mr. R. H. Morgan seconded.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera asked—When the plan and estimate for the drainage of de Saram place at Maradana will be submitted to the Council, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the matter had not been lost sight of, and that the Superintendent of Works expected the plan and estimates to be ready in a month's time.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. Perera asked—If the attention of the Chairman has been called to the judgment of His Lordship the Chief Justice in the case No. 12,592 of the District Court of Colombo of a land sold for assessment tax at Maradana, and whether any similar cases have occurred after the amendment of the Municipal Ordinance, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied in the affirmative, and added that only one certificate of sale was issued since 1895.

Approved. Chairman may pay.

Resolved that he be given two weeks' leave on full pay, and that Chairman may engage and pay a substitute.

Mr. R. H. Morgan seconded.—Carried.

The papers included a memorandum (copy annexed) by the Chairman, which had been printed and circulated to Council on February 8, and a list of applicants.

Mr. C. Perera moved that Council do go into Committee.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy seconded.

The Chairman's memorandum having been considered by Committee, the following amendments were made:—

For the word "England" in line 10 of the memorandum substitute the words "the United Kingdom."

Add the words "or equivalent British qualification" after the word "health" in lines 12 and 16.

Add the words "conveyance allowance of Rs. 80 a month to be given to each Sanitary Officer" after the word "practice" in the last line of the memorandum.

MEMORANDUM REFERRED TO IN PARAGRAPH 7 OF THE FOREGOING MINUTES.

Appointment of Sanitary Officer.

Until recently Colombo has only had one Sanitary Officer, and that not a very well qualified one. It was only last year that Mr. Paulusz, who was Assistant City Analyst, was transferred to the Sanitary Department as Assistant Sanitary Officer. His qualifications are those of a Fellow of the Chemists Society, and he is better fitted for analytical than sanitary work. The pay hitherto given (Rs 3,000 rising to Rs. 5,000 in the case of the Sanitary Officer, and Rs. 1,000 for his Assistant) is not sufficient to attract good men. I am of opinion that in Colombo, with its population of 150,000, there is ample work for two Sanitary Officers, and that the pay should be considerably increased in order to get capable men. This increase the Council can well afford, as when the new Ordinance is passed its revenue will no longer be largely earmarked as at present. I would suggest that a thoroughly good man be obtained from England, on a five years' agreement, as Sanitary Officer, and that he should be required to hold, in addition to his ordinary medical qualification, an English Diploma in Public Health. I understand that such an officer could be obtained for a salary of about £400 for the first three years and £500 for the last two, equal to Rs. 6,000 and Rs. 7,500, respectively. I would recommend that an Assistant Sanitary Officer be locally appointed, as a permanent officer, on a salary of say Rs. 3,000 rising by increments to Rs. 5,000, and that he too should hold an English Diploma of Public Health, in addition to his ordinary medical qualification. It is required of all health officers appointed to towns or districts having 50,000 inhabitants in England that they should hold diplomas in public health, and the same requirement is made at both Singapore and Penang in the case of the health officers there. The two Sanitary Officers should not be permitted to undertake private practice.

In regard to the resolution passed by the Council on February 14, 1902, re "Papers relating to applications for the post of Sanitary Officer," we wish to record as grounds for our dissent the following :—

1. Pursuant to a resolution passed at the Meeting of Council on January 10, 1902, notice had been given calling for applications for the post of Sanitary Officer. The applications made were before the Council for consideration at the Meeting of February 14. Yet without considering the applications made for the post advertised for, the Meeting deviated into a consideration of a memorandum by the Chairman upon a matter that was not specifically before the Meeting.

2. The resolution of February 14 makes the possession of "an English Diploma in Public Health or an equivalent British qualification," a *sine qua non* for an appointment to the post of Sanitary Officer on the pretended analogy of the practice in England, but the authority appealed to does not impose such a restriction. (See section 18 of the "Local Government Act, 1888.")

Nor does the Government of this Colony, in the Medical Department thereof, make "an English Diploma of Public Health" necessary to posts in that Department, which include among their duties those of Health Officers of Provinces. Still less does the Government in its dispositions of place or pay in that Department attach any special importance to such a diploma. There is no reason why the Council should take upon itself to make distinctions that are not countenanced either by English practice or by the regulations and policy of the local Government.

3. The resolution, in our judgment, unnecessarily and invidiously, and as we believe to the prejudice of the public interest, restricts the appointment of Sanitary Officer to "a person obtained from the United Kingdom," while persons in every respect competent, and in some respects more competent, may be found in Ceylon or India or elsewhere.

4. The resolution created a new post of Assistant Sanitary Officer, with a salary attached to it, and made additions of allowances both to the Assistant and to the Sanitary Officer without the sanction of law and without any notice, even the Chairman's memorandum making no reference to these additions.

5. By the resolution an appointment was made to the post of Assistant Sanitary Officer without notice or advertisement, the person selected being one who had not applied for the post, and the resolution leaving it to him either to accept or refuse the appointment conferred upon him.
