MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Supplement to the Minutes of Proceedings of the Municipal Council, Kandy, held on Saturday, November 19, 1904, and published in the "Gazette" of February 24, 1905 (Part V., p. 195).

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1904.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was satisfactorily carried out during the month.

Drains.—The drains, as far as construction goes, are as they were, with the exception of those in Colombo street. The side drain in the upper part of railway approach road is always filthy, and will be until it is properly cemented. This I have reported many times. The drains have been kept clean and well flushed.

Water supply.—Good. See my analysis for last month.

Alleys.—Kept as clean as such places can be. I would again urge that a beginning may be made with regard to their construction.

Laundries.—Generally well kept. The owners have been noticed to limewash their places more frequently.

Dairies.—Generally well kept. The milk supply of Kandy is a serious question not from the dairies within the Municipality or those outside from known estates, but from the small vendors of milk, who bring their one or two bottles into town from (well?) just anywhere. It is most important that this should be stopped. The Inspectors and the police should be given power and orders to seize milk sold in the town, which had been brought from unknown quarters.

Bakeries.—Generally well kept.

Market.—Generally well kept. I have frequently had to speak to the market-keeper for neglect of his duty during the month.

Cattle passed this month.—Cattle, 436; buffaloes, 88; sheep, 143; goats, 216.

Slaughter-house exposing shed.—Well kept.

Night soil depôt.—Very well kept.

Cooly lines.—Fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General health.—The health of the town has been good during the month. House to house inspection was made last month, after a report (received from the General Hospital) of "enteric fever" at Katukele. No fresh cases were found. Every precaution was taken and houses thoroughly disinfected, &c.

Infectious diseases.—None were prevalent in Kandy during the month.

Bay of Bengal—Burma Coast—Rangoon River entrance, Western Channel—A small lump found with 19 feet reduced; also alteration in the Position of Lower Spit Buoy.

The Bombay Government has given notice (No. 2 of 1905) that information has been received from the Principal Port Officer, Burma, Rangoon, dated December 31, 1904, that a small lump with 19 feet reduced has been found near the middle of the Fairway below the Lower Spit and Upper Eastern buoys, western channel, Rangoon river entrance, on the following bearings :—

Lower Spit, N. 63° W. 5½ cables.
Upper Eastern, N. 63° E. 8½ cables.

The Lower Spit buoy has been shifted N. 23° E. 3½ cables from its former position with the following bearings :—

China, East Coast—Parker Islands—Button Island—Light and Fog Signal established.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 21 of 1905) that on November 14, 1904, a white occulting light every fifteen seconds, thus: light, twelve and a half seconds, eclipse two and a half seconds, was established in a cylindrical concrete tower, 32 ft. high, painted black, erected on the eastern end of Button Rock, Parker islands. The light, which is dioptric, of the 6th order, is elevated 67 ft. above high water and visible in clear weather from a distance of 10 miles. During thick or foggy weather a bell will be struck by machinery once every ten seconds.

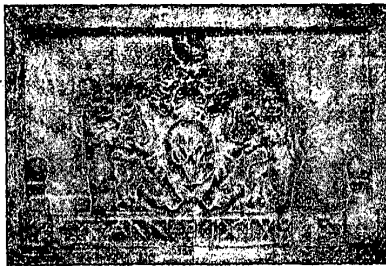

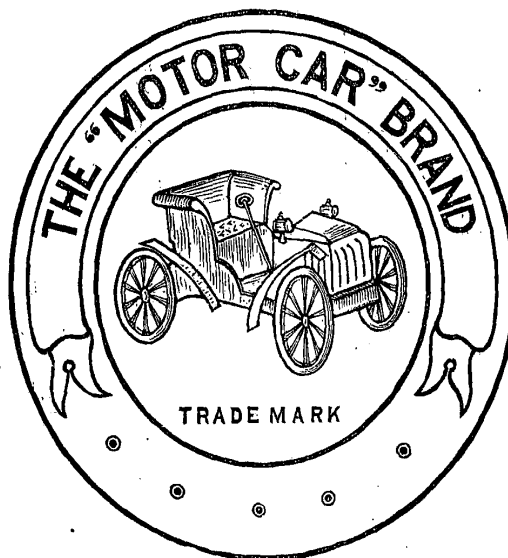

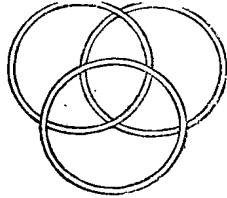
