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## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Tuesday, January 10, 1905.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated January 4, 1905.

*Present*.—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. P. D. Warren; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; the Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker; Dr. C. T. Griffin; Mr. M. F. Khan; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; Dr. W. H. de Silva; and Mr. H. Tiruvilangam.

The Minutes of December 6 and 9, 1904, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

The Chairman moved—That the Minutes of December 6 and 9, 1904, be confirmed.

The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker seconded.—Carried.

1. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That for the words “75 cents” in by-law 4 of the by-laws made under section 5 of the Ordinance No. 25 of 1901, the words “one rupee” be substituted.  
The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker seconded.—Carried.

2. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 7, 1904, Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904, and Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1904, were laid before the Council :—

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 7, 1904.

- (4) Medical Officer of Health's letter No. 2,374c of November 26, 1904, *re* train fare allowance to Supervisor H. W. Davidson. Re. 1.50 per month.  
Approved.
- (5) Papers *re* train fare allowance to H. R. Wickremasinghe. Re. 1.50 per month.  
Approved.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904.

- (3) Papers *re* closure of condemned cesspits :—  
Nos. 12/14, Wilson street; 8, Prince's gate; 71, Messenger street; 18, 20, and 83, Ferry street; 98 and 99, Hulftsdorp street; 72, Wolfendahl; 40, Siripina lane; 3, 18, and 19, Gintupitiya street; 24, Brass-founder street; 12/16, Kopiaiwatta; 78 and 108, Chekku street; 109, St. Joseph's street; 30, Galkapanawatta; and 34, New Moor street.  
The Committee recommend to Council to empower the Chairman to close these pits, except that at No. 78, Chekku street, regarding which further inquiry should be made.
- (4) Papers *re* fees for notification of infectious diseases.  
The Committee do not recommend that these fees should be paid to the salaried Medical Officers of Government. It was only intended to make these payments to private practitioners.
- (5) Papers *re* closure of cesspit at No. 5, Andival street.  
The Committee recommend that the Council do empower the Chairman to close this pit.
- (6) Papers *re* closure of cesspit at No. 69, Layard's Broadway.  
The Committee recommend that the Council do empower the Chairman to close this pit.
- (7) Papers *re* infant mortality—Midwives.  
The Committee recommend to Council that six midwives be employed. They should be paid Rs. 5 a case, to include attendance at the confinement, and for four days afterwards. They should be allowed private practice, but should agree to live in such street as the Medical Officer of Health approves, and the Council should guarantee each of them Rs. 35 month. The Council should also provide each with an outfit consisting of a small bag containing a pair of scissors, a nail brush, a phial of antiseptic tabloids, and a phial of amorphous boric acid. Each outfit is estimated to cost Rs. 14. The total cost will be Rs. 94 for the outfits, and Rs. 2,520 annual expenditure at least. It may be more, if there are more cases than the number guaranteed.
- (9) Papers *re* fruit trees at slaughter-house, Madampitiya, at present rented at Rs. 9 per month to the slaughter-house keeper.  
The Committee recommend that he be allowed to take the produce free of rent until the question of his salary is further considered.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1904.

- (3) Papers *re* widening of Skinner's Road North.  
The Committee recommend the land required for the widening and partial diversion of Skinner's Road North from Korteboam street to Layard's Broadway, and also the land required for the extension of Jampettah street to Skinner's Road North, as improved, be acquired, and that the Municipal Engineer should prepare plans to indicate what is required for acquisition.
- (16) Papers *re* lands in preliminary plan No. 6,316 in Slave Island.  
The Committee recommend that Government be asked to dispose of this land to the Council for the purpose of road improvement.

The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee.  
Mr. James Peiris seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations contained in the foregoing extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 7, 1904, be adopted.  
The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker seconded.—Carried.

With reference to item No. 4 of the Minutes of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904, the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved that Medical Officers in the employ of Government should be paid the fee with regard to cases occurring in their private practice, and that the Council address the Government requesting that Government Medical Officers be instructed to furnish the information required by this Council with regard to cases admitted into the Government hospitals without payment of any fee.  
Mr. James Peiris seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved—That item No. 7 of the Minutes of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904, be postponed to the next meeting of Council.  
Dr. C. T. Griffin seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved—That the remaining items contained in the foregoing extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904, be adopted.  
Major A. W. de Wilton seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved—That item No. 3 of the recommendations contained in the foregoing extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 15, 1904, be adopted.

3. Papers *re* additional pension rules were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the draft rule attached to the Chairman's letter No. 251 of December 15, 1904, to the Colonial Secretary.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

4. Draft regulations *re* leave of absence to Officers of the Municipality, other than the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Municipal Magistrate, were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee.

The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

The Chairman moved—That Council do resume, and that the consideration of the draft regulations be postponed to next meeting of Council.

Dr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

5. The Council then proceeded to ballot for the election of Members to form the four Standing Committees for 1905, in terms of section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman as follows :—

- (1) Committee on Law and General Subjects.—Major A. W. de Wilton, Mr. Chas. Perera, and Mr. H. Tiruvilangam.

- (3) Committee on Finance and Assessment.—The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker, Mr. H. A. Jayewardene, and Mr. R. Davidson.
- (4) Committee on Municipal Works.—The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. James Peiris.

Accordingly the above-named Members were elected to form, with the Chairman, the four Standing Committees for 1905.

6. Reappointment of Special Committee to consider the scheme for the quarry at Hill House, and Special Committee on motor car by-laws.

The Chairman moved the reappointment of the above Special Committees.

Major A. W. de Wilton seconded.—Carried.

7. Papers *re* Gintupitiya mutton market were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. H. Tiruvilangam moved—That the matter be postponed to next meeting of Council.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

8. Letter from the Medical Officer of Health No. 2,348 of December 17, 1904, regarding illicit sale of poisons was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That Government be requested to amend the Poisons Ordinance, No. 11 of 1901, so as to make penal the possession by any person of poisons without permission.

Dr. C. T. Griffin seconded.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved as an amendment—That the Medical Officer of Health be instructed to report upon the provisions of the Poisons Ordinance, and what further provisions are necessary for the health and safety of the public.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.

The Chairman withdrew his motion in favour of the amendment, which was carried.

9. Papers *re* mango tree standing by the roadside in Regent street were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That permission be given to cut down the tree.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.—Carried.

10. Municipal Engineer's letter No. 1,462 of December 23, 1904, regarding over-expenditure on Estimates were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved—That the over-expenditure be provided for in the Supplemental Budget.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. Papers regarding cattle straying on public roads and report of the Inspector-General of Police were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

(The following Members left before the discussion on this item:—The Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker, Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. H. A. Jayewardene, and Mr. H. Tiruvilangam.)

The Chairman moved—That the proposals of the Inspector-General of Police be given a trial for one year, and that the necessary funds be provided.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved as an amendment—That the scheme of the Inspector-General of Police be adopted, striking out "the payment of 25 cents per head of cattle to be paid to the constable as an incentive to work well."

Mr. James Peiris seconded.
