*China Sea—Formosa—Hoko Reto (Pescadores) Hoko ko (Pongchau Harbour)—Buoys established.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 67 of 1905) that the under-mentioned white can buoys have been established to mark certain shoals in Hoko ko (Pongchau harbour):—

- A buoy moored in a position from which Fukibi kaku (Triumphant point) bears S. 50° E., distant 12½ cables, and Soshihi (Mung point) N. 59° E.
- A buoy moored in a position from which the extremity of Fukibi kaku bears N. 81° W., distant 1½ cable, and Soshihi (Mung point) N. 18° E.
- A buoy moored in a position from which the extremity of Fukibi kaku bears N. 41° W., distant 4½ cables, and the southern extremity of Observatory island (Sokuten to) N. 83° E.

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## BENGAL.—No. 65.

*Korea, South Coast—Nan How Group—Port Hamilton—Intended Light.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 68 of 1905) that it is intended shortly to establish a light on the southern extremity of San To or Sodo island at the entrance to Port Hamilton.

During the construction of the lighthouse a provisional white fixed light, elevated 230 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 8 miles from the bearing of S. 28° W., through west and north, to S. 73° E., will be exhibited from a staff erected in the position of the intended lighthouse.

*New Zealand—North Island—Port Nicholson—Evan's Bay—Intended Mine Practice Field.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 70 of 1905) that it is intended to establish a mine practice field in Evan's bay, which will be marked by two red buoys moored at distances of 4½ cables N. 50° E. and 3½ cables N. 76° E., respectively, from high water islet. Red posts will be erected on shore at a distance of about one cable east from each of these buoys. The limits of the practice field will be to the northward and the southward, a line between the red buoys and the red posts, and to the westward a line between the two red buoys. The above limits are approximate only.

The mines will be visible at all times of tide.

*Bay of Bengal—Hooghly River—Western Channel—G. Light Buoy altered.*

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 338 dated October 7, 1904, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given notice (No. 76 of 1905) that the Calcutta Port Commissioners have given further notice dated December 29, 1904, that the character of the light

exhibited from G light buoy (black can), situated in the Western channel, river Hooghly, 5¼ miles S. 86° W. from the Long sand light vessel, has been altered from a white group occulting every fifteen seconds, to a white occulting light every twenty-six seconds, thus: light, three seconds; eclipse, three seconds; light, ten seconds; eclipse, ten seconds.

*Australia—New South Wales—Cape Byron Light—Altered in Character.*

*China—Manchuria—Kwang Tung Peninsula, West Coast—Louisa Bay—Rock in Approach.*

*Pacific Ocean—The Philippine Islands—Mindanao, North Coast—Iligan Bay—Position and Description of Shoal on Western Side.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 88 of 1905) that the shoal on the western side of the entrance to Iligan bay consists of two white coral patches with a few large boulders, with a depth over them of 2½ fathoms, situated at a distance of 6 miles N. 62° E. from Polo point, or 1½ mile S. 22° E. from the position shown on the Chart.

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

### MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on January 21, 1905, at 1.30 p.m.

*Present* :—The Chairman ; C. P. Hayley, Esq. ; Dr. H. A. Keegel ; Dr. E. Ludovici ; D. G. Goonawardana, Esq. ; F. Abeysundara, Esq. ; and A. E. Mayes, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of General and Special Meetings held on December 17 last.

2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved—That the Council do follow the lead of the Colombo Municipality in obtaining power to vote a sum of money annually for the assistance of the Galle Friend-in-Need Society, and that such vote be limited to Rs. 1,000.

Seconded by Mr. F. Abeysundara.

Dr. E. Ludovici moved as an amendment—That the words "follow the lead of the Colombo Municipality" and that the words "and that such vote be limited to Rs. 1,000" be deleted from the motion, and the word "obtaining" be altered into "obtain."

Seconded by Mr. D. G. Goonawardana. The motion thus amended was carried.

3. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated December 20, 1904, No. 11/025906, on water supply to Galle and Chairman's reply thereto dated December 22, 1904, No. 45 ; also submitted correspondence on the subject of gauging the Madola.

Resolved—That the gauging be undertaken at once, and the expense incurred be defrayed by the Council.

4. Submitted letter from Rev. J. Cooreman, dated January 4, 1905, asking that the conservancy rate on the Galle Convent be calculated as for houses which are assessed from Rs. 20 to Rs. 30.

Resolved—That the application be allowed.

5. Submitted report from Inspector of Ward No. 2 on latrine accommodation at Kaluwella showing that sixty-one houses have cesspits, the owners of which are willing to adopt the dry-earth system of conservancy ; fifty-one houses the owners of which object to remove their cesspits ; nine houses with no kind of latrine accommodation ; twelve houses with no back entrance or ground for building closets ; twenty-one houses with privies open to the sea ; and three plumbago stores, where large numbers of men and women are employed without privies or urinals being provided for their use.

Resolved—That the Chairman be empowered under section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896 to require the owners of the sixty-one houses who expressed their willingness to adopt the dry-earth system, and the owners of the twenty-one houses having privies open to the sea to close their cesspits and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor ; and that the Chairman put into force section 207 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 as regards the plumbago stores.

Resolved—That the Sanitary Officer be asked to report on the condition of the privies in the fifty-one houses, the owners of which object to the substitution of dry-earth closets for privies.

Resolved—That the Chairman be authorized to incur the necessary expenditure in carrying out the above resolutions.

6. In terms of section 5 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902, the Council proceeded to elect by ballot Members for the four Standing Committees.

The following was the result of the ballot :—

Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects :—Mr. N. Dias Abeysinha, Mr. D. G. Goonawardana, Mr. F. Abeysundara.

Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment :—Mr. D. G. Goonawardana, Dr. E. Ludovici, Mr. Magdon Ismail.

Standing Committee on Public Works :—Mr. A. E. Mayes, Dr. E. Ludovici, Mr. F. Abeysundara.

Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation :—Dr. H. A. Keegel, Mr. A. E. Mayes, Mr. N. Dias Abeysinha.

7. The nomination of an Auditor was brought up for consideration, when Dr. Ludovici moved—That Mr. E. Soertsz be appointed Auditor for the year 1905.

Seconded by Mr. F. Abeysundara.—Carried.
