MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, February 10, 1905.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 4, 1905.

Present :—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman ; Dr. C. W. van Geysel ; Mr. F. C. Allen ; Mr. P. D. Warren ; the Hon. Mr. Giles F. Walker ; Dr. C. T. Griffin ; Mr. M. F. Khan ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. James Peiris ; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen ; Dr. W. H. de Silva ; Mr. H. Tiruvilangam, and Mr. R. Davidson.

The Minutes of January 10, 1905, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of January 10, 1905, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—If directions have been issued to prosecute householders for recovery of conservancy dues before the expiry of the month for which such amount is due.

The Chairman replied that no particular directions have been issued and the practice hitherto followed has not been altered.

2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That no such prosecution be entered against householders for recovery of conservancy dues before the expiry of the month for which such amount is due, unless in any matter of urgency, and that no prosecution be sanctioned without a demand first made of the amount due.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

Mr. C. Perera by leave of Council withdrew his motion.

To be struck off.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of January 24, 1905.

- (3) Application for meat stalls, Slave Island market.
Approved the conversion of the eight unused mutton stalls at this market into beef stalls at a rental of Rs. 40 per month each.
- (4) Papers *re* infant mortality, private practice to midwives.
The Committee amend their resolution 7 of December 13, 1904, as follows:—
In line 3 insert "not" between "should" and "be," and substitute "and" for "but" in same line, and for "Rs. 35" in line 5 substitute "Rs. 41 66." Add after "month" in same line "or Rs. 500 per annum." For "2,520" in last line but one substitute "3,000." Copy of amended resolution annexed.

ANNEXURE REFERRED TO.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of December 13, 1904.

- (7) Papers *re* Infant mortality—Midwives.
The Committee recommend to Council that six midwives be employed. They should be paid Rs. 5 a case, to include attendance at the confinement, and for four days afterwards. They should not be allowed private practice, and should agree to live in such street as the Medical Officer of Health approves, and the Council should guarantee each of them Rs. 41 66 a month or Rs. 500 per annum. The Council should also provide each with an outfit consisting of a small bag containing a pair of scissors, a nail brush, a phial of antiseptic tabloids, and a phial of amorphous boric acid. Each outfit is estimated to cost Rs. 14. The total cost will be Rs. 94 for the outfits, and Rs. 3,000 annual expenditure at least. It may be more, if there are more cases than the number guaranteed.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 30, 1905.

- (6) Estimate for extra shelves for almirah, Assessment Department, Rs. 23.
Approved.
- (17) Papers *re* closure of well at No. 29, Second Mosque lane.
The Committee are of opinion that, where the Chairman is satisfied that the owner of a well is unable to bear the cost of filling it up, when required to do so for sanitary reasons, the Council should pay the cost.

Extract from Minutes of Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of February 1, 1905.

- (5) Papers *re* lease of land in Gas Works street.
The Committee decide that Gauder be given notice that he must remove the materials of the boutiques and deliver over the land on April 30, and that, in default, steps will be taken to eject him.
- (6) Draft regulations *re* leave of absence to Officers of the Municipality, other than the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and Municipal Magistrate.
Rules approved as amended. (See document A annexed) and recommended to Council.

ANNEXURE A REFERRED TO.

Draft Regulations regarding leave of absence to Officers of the Municipality of Colombo, other than the Chairman, Assistant Chairman, or Municipal Magistrate.

- All leave is granted or withheld subject to the necessities of the Municipal service, and leave once granted may be recalled at any time by the Chairman if such a step be deemed necessary for the Municipal service. If the leave has been granted by the Council, the Chairman shall at once report his action recalling the leave to the Council.
- Officers temporarily employed by the Municipal Council are not entitled to any leave beyond that (if any) which may be mentioned in their respective written contracts with the Municipal Council. Provided that the Chairman may grant them such full or half pay leave, not exceeding thirty days in any year, as he may think fit, and that the Municipal Council may, in cases of sickness, grant such further leave as it thinks fit.
- An officer may not absent himself from Colombo without the permission of the Chairman.
- When an application for leave or an extension of leave is based on the ground of ill-health, a certificate from a medical practitioner should invariably be sent in.
- All applications for full pay leave must state the amount of previous full pay leave granted to the applicant during the current and preceding year.
- Vacation leave on full pay may be granted by the Municipal Council for periods not exceeding six weeks in respect of any one calendar year's service, or three months in respect of any two successive calendar years' service. Such leave may be accumulated in respect of two years only. The Chairman may grant such leave of absence, not exceeding thirty working days in the aggregate for any one year, as he thinks fit. Such leave, when granted on full pay, shall be counted as part of the period of six weeks or three months which officers may be granted under this rule.
- Vacation leave may be granted to an officer to be followed immediately by leave on half pay.

8. After a period of six years' service with the Council or, in the case of seconded officers, a period of six years' total service with the Government and the Council, leave of absence on the half pay of an officer's appointment may be granted. It may be given before the expiration of that period in cases of serious indisposition or of urgent private affairs, if the Council is satisfied that the indulgence is indispensable. Provided that this rule shall not prevent an absent officer being placed on half pay at any time under the provisions of rule 10. All applications for half-pay leave must state the total amount of half pay leave granted to the applicant since the date of his first appointment under the Municipal Council or, if a seconded officer, the date of his first appointment under Government.

9. When an officer seeks to obtain vacation leave only, he must, in ordinary cases, make such arrangements as may be approved by the Chairman for the adequate discharge of his duties without expense or inconvenience to the Council. Provided that it shall be competent for the Chairman, with the approval of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment, in cases where it appear desirable to do so, to engage a substitute and pay him from the Municipal Fund for such period as may be thought fit, and that in the case of an officer drawing a salary of over Rs. 1,000 per annum the permission of the Council shall be first obtained for doing so.

10. When it is found impossible to make satisfactory arrangements for the discharge of the duties of an Officer absent on full pay leave only by the other officers of the Department, the absent officers may be placed on half pay and a substitute engaged to perform his duties on the available half-pay, or on such pay as the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment may approve.

11. Except in very special cases, no officer on leave will be allowed to receive half salary at any one time for more than one year, nor for a period which, added to his previous absence on similar leave, would exceed by six months one-sixth of his total resident service.

12. In case of applications to the Council for extended leave on grounds other than of ill-health, half salary will not be granted unless and until the Chairman is satisfied that continued absence can be conveniently allowed.

13. Any leave in excess of one month can only be granted by the Municipal Council, provided that in cases of urgency the Chairman may grant such leave, and report it for confirmation to the Municipal Council. This rule shall apply to the grant of both full and half pay leave.

14. Where full-pay leave is to be followed by half-pay leave, the arrangements for the discharge of the officer's duties will be made by the Council, and every officer is liable and required to act without any increase of pay in an office ranking as high as, or higher than, his fixed appointment during the period of full pay leave thus granted.

15. In the case of half pay leave being granted, half the period granted only can be reckoned as service.

16. An officer who has obtained leave of absence must not leave Colombo until he has handed over to the officer who was been appointed to act for him, or to some officer authorized by the Chairman thereto.

The Chairman moved—That Council do go into Committee.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, December 17, 1904, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated December 13, 1904.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G., Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 19, 1904, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. Before proceeding with the business of the day as entered on the Agenda Paper, the Chairman, with permission of the Council, moved—"That the Council desires to express its sincere sympathy with Mrs. Philip on the decease of her husband, the late Mr. Alexander Philip, and places on record its appreciation of the valuable services rendered by him to the Council and the inhabitants of Kandy during the period he was a Member of this Council.

This was supported by Mr. Sproule, and on being put to the Meeting carried unanimously.

The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1903 to November 30, 1904, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of November.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. The Auditors' reports for September and October, which had been previously circulated, were laid on the table.

5. Reports by the several Inspectors of laundries inspected during November were submitted.

6. The following correspondence was submitted and read:—

(a) Letter No. 25, dated November 24, 1904, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inviting attention to Circular respecting opium licenses, with reply.

(b) Letter No. 26, dated November 24, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, respecting provision and maintenance of schools.

Resolved—That reply to letter to Director, Public Instruction, be awaited.

(c) Letter No. 27, dated December 1, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, referring to statement of receipts and expenditure to September 30, and requesting a report for information of Government.

(d) Letter No. 28, dated December 5, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, inquiring the number of persons who have paid commutation rate during 1903 and reply.

(e) Letter No. 29, dated December 9, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, requesting that the forwarding of the Agenda Paper be discontinued.

7. Letter dated November 24, from Mr. L. E. Blazé, thanking the Chairman and Members for allowing the free use of the Town Hall for distribution of prizes (Kingswood College).

8. Memorandum No. 144, dated November 24, from the Hon. the Government Agent, forwarding copy of a reply to a petition presented to the Legislative Council by Ukku Banda and others of Mavilmada. Petitioners referred to reply sent them on March 24, 1904.

9. Letter dated November 21, from the Hon. the Government Agent, intimating certain re-arrangement of the police stations within Municipal limits.

Resolved—That the Hon. the Government Agent (Police) be informed that the arrangements proposed have the approval of the Council.

10. Considered the following recommendations by Standing Committee on "Municipal Works":—

(a) That the application be granted on the usual conditions for house service pipes to No. 73, Trincomalee street.

(b) Nos. 343 and 344, Peradeniya road, provided the assessment is increased so as to produce a water-rate of not less than Rs. 10 per annum, the owner having intimated his willingness to pay this increase.

11. Considered correspondence with the District Engineer, Ceylon Government Railway, Nanu-oya, respecting a supply of water to the Kandy waiting-room lavatories, with recommendation of the Standing Committee that the application be granted on certain conditions.

Resolved—That the supply be allowed on the usual conditions, and that meters be fixed on the new as well as all pipes connected with the Council's mains supplying the Railway buildings.

12. Supplemental Budget, as approved of by the Standing Committee, was submitted and considered.

Proposed by Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Beven—That the Supplemental Budget be approved and adopted. (Appendix A.)

13. In accordance with notice Mr. Beven moved—That the attention of the General Manager of Government Railway be called to the inconvenience to passengers consequent on recent alterations in the train arrangements whereby Kandy has become a wayside station, and passengers are unable to entrain till the arrival of the trains from Matale.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Sproule, and on being put to the Meeting carried *nem. con.*

14. Read report by Inspector of the District (Mr. V. Perera) that the following cesspits are in a very insanitary state, with recommendation of the Health Officer that the cesspits be emptied, disinfected, and filled up and dry-earth closets substituted:—

Railway approach road, No. 1, Hajun Bai; No. 2, Hajun Bai; No. 3, Mrs. N. L. Musaffer; No. 4, Mrs. N. L. Musaffer; No. 5, Bisamba; No. 15, J. W. Henricus.

It is also reported that the several premises have means of access to the back to allow of night soil being removed.

On motion by Mr. Beven, seconded by Mr. Sproule, it was resolved—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of No. 1 of 1896, to require the owners of the several premises stated in the Inspector's report of December 12 to empty, disinfect, and close the cesspits on the said premises and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of November, 1904.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was fairly satisfactorily carried out during the month. The scavenger should be told to pay more attention to the side drains and traps which lead into the main drains.

Drains.—The drains of Kandy are as they have been for years. I would again bring to your notice the filthy state of the side drains in the upper part of railway approach road and to a patch of drain of about 100 yards in Peradeniya road starting from No. 885.

Water supply.—Good.

Alleys.—Remain in the same state as I have always reported. Nothing more can be done until they are pulled down and rebuilt on sanitary principles.

Laundries.—Generally well kept.

Dairies.—Generally well kept. A new register of dairies is in preparation.

Bakeries.—Frequent inspections are made. Generally well kept.

Market.—Generally well kept. All food stuffs have been inspected by me daily and found good.

Cattle passed this month.—Cattle, 427; buffaloes, 98; sheep, 147; goats, 210.

Slaughter-house and exposing shed.—Clean and well kept.

Night soil depôt.—Well kept.

Cooly lines.—All fairly well kept.

Boutiques.—Generally well kept. Cases were instituted against many of the boutique-keepers for obstructing the pathway with bags of fish, &c.

Latrines.—Generally well kept.

General health.—General health of the town was good during this month. A few cases of chickenpox were reported and the following cases of enteric fever:—

Robert Russell.—Case reported to me by House Surgeon of General Hospital from Getambe, Peradeniya, on the evening of November 12. Visited Peradeniya on the morning of the 13th with Chief Inspector, and on inquiry found that the patient came into town to a house at the back of No. 38, Ward street, on November 1 or 2, and was removed to hospital on November 3. This house was thoroughly disinfected with perchloride of mercury and re-limewashed. I heard that this patient, R. Russell, had just returned from Watagoda before his illness, November 9, 1904.

On a report received from the House Surgeon of the General Hospital I proceeded to No. 805, Peradeniya road, and found on inquiry that the patient Theodore Klyn had been suffering from fever for three days and was taking medicine from the outdoor dispensary. He was removed to hospital on November 1. As far as I can learn this patient had not been away from Kandy. The house was thoroughly disinfected and re-limewashed.

The other two cases reported to me from the General Hospital, viz., Father A. Gille of the Seminary, Ampitiya (who, I am told, landed here in Ceylon the beginning of November from a German ship which had enteric on board), and James Nubbs of Nawalapitiya. Both these cases are outside the Municipality, and so should be reported upon by the Colonial Surgeon.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held at the Town Hall on Saturday, December 17, 1904, at 9 o'clock a.m., as required by Section 111 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, for consideration of the Budget for 1905, as prepared by the Standing Committee, and in accordance with Notice dated December 14.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, C.M.G., Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.; Dr. G. P. Schokman; L. Creasy, Esq.

On motion of the Chairman the Council went into Committee.

The following recommendations of the Standing Committee on "Municipal Works" were considered:—

1. That the estimated cost Rs. 2,070 of providing stopcocks and taps to the several hydrants in the town, as suggested by the Provincial Engineer, be inserted in the Budget for 1905, under the Water-rate Account.

2. That the estimate of cost of replacing portion of the mains for a supply of water to the western portion of the town, the necessity for which was pointed out by the Secretary and Superintendent of Works, and amounting to Rs. 13,371.50, be inserted in the Budget for 1905, under the Water-rate Account.

3. That the estimate for carrying out certain improvements at the headworks of the reservoir, the necessity for which was pointed out by the Secretary and Superintendent of Works, and amounting to Rs. 3,141.80, be included in the Budget for 1905, under the Water-rate Account.

The Budget as prepared by the Standing Committee, and which has been published in the *Government Gazette* and a copy sent to each Member, together with the statement of the taxes necessary to be levied during 1905 in terms of section 110 of No. 7 of Ordinance 1887, were considered, the items in the Budget under the general heads being read *seriatim*. (Appendix A.)
