## MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, April 11, 1902.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated April 7, 1902.



MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO, CEYLON.

Wanted a Medical Officer of Health for the City of Colombo.

The appointment will be for a period of five years from the date of taking up duties in Colombo. The salary will be Rs. 6,000, equivalent to £400 for the first three years, and Rs. 7,500 equal to £500 for the last two years.

A conveyance allowance of Rs. 80 a month, equal to £64 a year, will be paid in addition to the salary while he is actually performing the duties. Candidates for the post must hold an English Diploma in Public Health or equivalent British qualification, in addition to their ordinary medical qualification. A first class passage to Colombo will be provided for the candidate finally selected. The officer appointed will be required to reside in Colombo, and will be debarred from private practice or employment outside the duties of his office.

At the end of the period of five years it will be optional for the Council to engage the Medical Officer for such

further period and on such terms as may be agreed on should he desire to be re-engaged.

Should the Council not re-engage him at the end of five years, a first class passage to England will be provided for him at any time during the six months next following the termination of the five years. Should the officer be compelled at any time during the five years to relinquish his appointment owing to ill-health contracted through no fault of his own, a first class passage to England will be provided, and the agreement will thereupon be determined

Candidates should address their applications stating age, general qualifications, and qualifications for office as a Medical Officer of Health, with such testimonials as they may desire to submit, to Dr. Perry, care of British Medical Association, Strand, London.

Remarks on the proposed By-laws relating to Carriages and Drivers.

By-Law 3.—Our lawyers remark that no provision has been made as regards the fee for the annual renewal of the license. This question should be decided by the Council.

Rule 4.—By-law 14, Schedule A, of 16 of 1881, enjoins the carrying of a badge bearing the number of the ge license. In view of the fact that the license number is painted on the carriage, this is not necessary, and carriage license. In view of the fact that the license number is painted on the carriage, this is not necessary, and the by-law should therefore be repealed. Otherwise the driver will have to carry two numbers, that of his license and that of the carriage.

Rule 7.—The words "such officer or officers as the Chairman may appoint" should be substituted for the words "by a Board consisting of an officer of the Works Department of the Council and an Inspector of the Municipality," as it may not always be convenient to employ the same officer.

## Carriage License.

SIR,-With reference to some remarks that passed in the Municipal Council on the 12th July last, I have the honour to submit a draft set of by-laws (an amended version of those forwarded with my letter to you No. 3,367 of

10th November, 1900), which would, I think, after revision by the law advisers of the Municipality, meet the necessity for greater control over the drivers of hired carriages.

2. The examination of the drivers should be, in Colombo, as it is in London, strictly carried out. Careful inquiry should be first made as to the applicant's character, in which the Police, if required, would give assistance. If this is satisfactory, his sight should be tested by the ordinary methods which do not require to be carried out by a medical man. He should then be required to have the relative to the required to the relative to the medical man. He should then be required to show that he understands the taking in and out of the carriage of the horse and the rule of the road. He should then be practically tested in driving, and his knowledge of localities, and this should be done by the inspecting officer requiring him to drive him from one place to another, say, from the Town Hall to Green street, when he could see if he took the most direct route and drove properly, and whether the horse were a suitable one in those respects in which a Veterinary Surgeon could not judge except by practical test.

3. The license should, I suggest, have on its back the conditions on which it is i-sued—in Tamil and English, possibly a few might be required in Sinhalese and English—such, for instance, as that the man must be properly dressed, that he must be civil to his fares and of good conduct, that he will not break any of the by-laws affecting hired carriages or the rules of the road, &c., and that his license is conditional on his observance of these rules and by-laws, and may be cancelled by the Mayor at any time for sufficient receip

by-laws, and may be cancelled by the Mayor at any time for sufficient reason.

4. If this is carried out, the Inspectors of Police will be instructed to examine periodically all drivers on the stands, to see that they have their licenses, and, if necessary, to identify them with the descriptions on the license, and to prosecute any driver not having a license. They will also be directed to have reported to you any driver who may be convicted of misconduct, or who may have committed any breach of his license, so that you may consider the withdrawal of his license.

## Carriages. - Additional By-laws.

1. No person shall act as the driver of any licensed carriage (other than a hackery) which is drawn by a horse or horses unless he shall have first obtained a license from the Chairman.

2. The Chairman shall on the application of any person for a license to act as a driver of any licensed carriage satisfy himself by are minoriant that the applicant is affected to a driver and is duly fitted to fulfil the duties of a driver.

2. The Chairman shall on the application of any person for a license to act as a driver of any incensed carriage satisfy himself by examination that the applicant is of good character and is duly fitted to fulfil the duties of a driver. On being so satisfied he shall cause the applicant to be registered as "a licensed driver."

3. The license so issued shall be renewable annually on or before January 31 in each year. It shall be open to the Chairman at any time to revoke any such license, or to refuse to renew it on his being satisfied that there are reasonable grounds for doing so. The fee payable for each license shall be such sum not exceeding 50 cents as the Chairman shall from time to time determine.

4. A license renewable annually shall be issued to each licensed driver, and in addition he shall be given a

A license renewable annually shall be issued to each licensed driver, and in addition he shall be given a metal badge giving his licensed number. This badge must be worn by the driver in a conspicuous place on the left arm.

The license shall contain the driver's name in full and licensed number, his nationality, his village, caste, residence, description, the print of his left thumb and two forefingers, and any other particulars which will ensure his complete identification. It shall further state the date of the renewal of his license.

6. Every driver shall, at any time that he may be required to do so by an officer of Police not under the rank of Inspector, furnish proof of his identity by allowing the impression of his thumb and fingers to be taken in such

manner and at such places as the said officer may require.

7. Every carriage and jinricksha shall be inspected half-yearly by a Board consisting of an officer of the Works Department of the Council and an Inspector of the Municipality, who shall furnish the Chairman with a

report respecting the order of each carriage and jinricksha so inspected.

8. Every horse licensed for drawing a carriage shall be inspected each half-year by the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon or some other competent Veterinary Surgeon, who shall report whether it is fit to draw a carriage or not.

9. (1) Any person who shall act as a driver of a licensed carriage (other than a hackery) which is drawn by a

horse or horses without having obtained a license, or after the license has been revoked, or its renewal refused;

(2) Any licensed driver who shall commit any breach of the foregoing by-laws;

(3) Any owner of a licensed carriage (other than a hackery) which is drawn by a horse or horses who shall suffer it to be driven by a person other than a licensed driver-

shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable for each such offence to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20, and in default to rigorous or simple imprisonment not exceeding one month.

Dissent to Resolution No. 9 of the Minutes of the General Meeting of the 11th April, 1902.

This proposal adds one more to the various schemes of extension and alteration of the Town Hall that have been adopted from time to time and that have one and all failed of their purpose. In 1888 money was spent upon alterations for the accommodation of the Chairman, and the removal of the Magistrate's Court to a different site in 1894 that court was brought back to its present place, and further money spent upon alterations of the western wing of the hall, which wing was then used as a vegetable stall. Again, in 1898 and 1899 money was expended in enclosing the outer verandah on the eastern side, and a latrine for the use of the Municipal Officers was erected at a cost of no

It is now proposed further to enclose the western side to put up a row of boutiques, to remove the present vegetable stalls to the meat market, to build a room over the porch, enclose the building with a boundary wall, and close the roads north and south for traffic.

In my judgment these alterations and extensions will fail of being improvements, will not answer the purpose

intended, will cause a great deal of inconvenience, and will involve merely fruitless expenditure.

To begin with, there is a curious disagreement as to their cost. The Superintendent of Works estimates the cost at Rs. 69,411·42, the Special Committee recommended a grant of Rs. 57,000, and the Council has voted Rs. 60,000. It does not seem clear how these differences are to be adjusted, or the balance of Rs. 9,411·42 is to be

provided.

The meat stalls, again, are to be built after the model of the Slave Island market. Is it forgotten that owing to their large size the greater number of the meat stalls in the market have been unoccupied ever since they were constructed? Moreover, the inevitable result of these alterations will be to render the Town Hall yet more circumscribed, crowded, and congested. And this just at the time when the Council is framing by-laws with the view of preventing these faults in respect of private buildings! Instead of these unsatisfactory experiments, would it not be well to take steps to build a new hall and offices on a site entirely different? It would be appropriate that the Municipal offices should be in the Fort. The Government has ample land there, which could easily be got to dispose of to the Council in the same way as it has given a site for the Chamber of Commerce. If we get such a site, the proceeds of the sale of the present site would go a great way towards the cost of erecting a suitable set of buildings. Perhaps that might cost a little more. But the expense would be well repaid every way. The attempt, I venture to think, is worth making. At any rate, the present scheme seems to me in no way satisfactory.

## ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE JAFFNA AGRICULTURAL COMPANY, LIMITED.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. The regulations contained in Table C in the schedule annexed to "The Joint Stock Companies' Ordinance, 1861," shall not apply to this Company, which shall be governed by the regulations contained in these Articles, but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration, by special resolution.

#### BUSINESS.

- 2. The Company shall proceed to carry on business as soon after the registration thereof as the Directors shall think fit, and notwithstanding that the whole of the shares shall not have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted, they shall do so as soon as, in the judgment of the Directors, a sufficient number of shares shall have been subscribed, or applied for, or allotted.
- 3. The business of the Company shall be carried on by the Directors, subject to the control of general meetings, in accordance with these regulations.

#### SHARES.

4. The shares shall be under the control of the Directors, who may allot or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms and conditions, and at such times as the Directors think fit.

5. Every person taking any share in the Company shall testify his acceptance thereof, by

writing under his hand, in such form as the Directors may from time to time specify.

6. Of the full amount of Rs. 20 per share, a sum of Rs. 5 shall be paid on application, a further sum of Rs. 5 shall be paid on allotment, and the remaining sum of Rs. 10 shall be paid at such times and in such instalments as the Directors may from time to time regulate.

7. The Company shall, before making any calls upon the Shareholders in respect of moneys due from them on their shares, give three months' notice of each such call by serving written notice

thereof on the Shareholders in manner hereinafter prescribed.

8. If on or before the day appointed for payment any Shareholder does not pay the amount due from him, then such Shareholder shall be liable to pay interest for the same, at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum, from the date of default till the time of payment in full of such amount.

9. The shares shall be allotted at the discretion of and by the Directors, who may from time to time issue any unissued shares and may add to such shares such an amount of premium as they

may consider proper.

10. Each Shareholder shall be liable to pay the amount of calls made on him to the person,

and at the time, and at the place appointed by the Directors.

11. The call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the

Directors authorizing such call was passed. 12. If several persons are joint-holders of any share, any one of such persons may give effectual

receipt for any dividend payable in respect of such share. 13. The certificate of title to shares shall be issued under the seal of the Company, and signed

by two Directors and the Secretary, or in such other manner as the Directors shall prescribe.

14. Every Member shall be entitled on payment of 50 cents to one certificate for all shares registered in his name, specifying the share or shares held by him and the amount paid up thereon.

15. If such certificate is worn out or lost it may be renewed on payment of 50 cents.

16. No person shall exercise any rights of a Member, until his name shall have been entered in the Register of Members, and he shall have paid all moneys payable for the time being on every share held by him.

TRANSFER OF SHARES.

17. The Company may decline to register any transfer of shares made by a Shareholder indebted to them.

18. Any Member may, with the consent of the Directors previously obtained, transfer all or any of his shares. The instrument of such transfer shall be in writing, signed both by the transferor and the transferee. And the transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the share until the name of the transferee is entered in the register.

19. The instrument of transfer shall be presented to the Company, accompanied by such evidence as they may require to prove the title of the transferor, and thereupon the Company shall

register the transferee as a Shareholder.

20. The transfer books shall be closed during the fourteen days immediately preceding the Ordinary General Meeting in each year.

21. The executors, administrators, or heirs of a deceased Shareholder shall be the only persons

recognized by the Company as having any title to his share.

22. General Meetings shall be called Extraordinary.

34. The Directors may, whenever they think fit, and they shall, upon a requisition made in writing by any number of Shareholders holding in the aggregate not less than one-fifth part of the shares of the Company, convene an Extraordinary General Meeting.

35. Any requisition so made by the Shareholders shall express the object of the meeting

proposed to be called, and shall be left at the registered office of the Company.

36. Upon the receipt of such requisition, the Directors shall forthwith proceed to convene a General Meeting; if they do not proceed to convene the same within twenty-one days from the date of the requisition, the requisitionists, or any other Shareholders holding the required number of shares, may themselves convene a meeting.

37. Twenty-one days' notice at least, specifying the place and the hour of meeting and the purpose for which any General Meeting is to be held, shall be given by advertisement, or in such

other manner as may be prescribed by the Company.

38. Any Shareholder may, on giving not less than seven days' previous notice of any resolution,

submit the same to a meeting.

39. Such notice shall be given by leaving a copy of the resolution at the registered office of

- 40. No business shall be transacted at any meeting, except the declaration of dividend, unless a quorum of Shareholders is present at the commencement of such business, and such quorum shall be ascertained as follows; that is to say, if the Shareholders belonging to the Company at the time of the meeting do not exceed twenty in number, the quorum shall be ten; if they exceed twenty, there shall be added to the above quorum one for every additional ten Shareholders, with this limitation, that no quorum shall in any case exceed thirty.
- 41. If within one hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the required number of Shareholders is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of Shareholders, shall be dissolved. If any other case it shall stand adjourned to the following day, at the same time and place, and if at such adjourned meeting the required number of Shareholders is not present, it shall be adjourned sine die.

42. The Chairman, if any, of the Board of Directors, shall preside as Chairman at every meeting of the Company. If there be no such Chairman, or if at any meeting he is not present, the

Shareholders present shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of the meeting.

43. The Chairman may, with the consent of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time and from place to place, but no business shall be transacted at any adjourned meeting other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

44. At any General Meeting, unless a poll is demanded by at least five Shareholders, a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried, and an entry to that effect in the Book of Proceedings of the Company, shall be sufficient evidence of the fact, without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against such resolution.

45. If a poll is demanded in manner aforesaid, the same shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs, and the results of such poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the Company

in General Meeting.

46. Every Shareholder shall have one vote for every share held by him.47. If any Shareholder is a minor, lunatic, idiot, or prodigal, he may vote by the person

legally appointed to the charge and administration of his property.

48. If two or more persons are jointly entitled to a share or shares, the person whose name stands first in the register of the Shareholders as one of the holders of such share or shares, and no other, shall be entitled to vote in respect of the same.

49. No Shareholder shall be entitled to vote at any meeting, unless all moneys due from him

to the Company are paid.

50. Votes may be given either personally or by proxy. A proxy shall be appointed in writing under the hand of the appointer, or, if such appointer is a corporation, under their common seal, and shall have affixed thereto a stamp of such value as shall in law be requisite.

51. No person shall be appointed proxy who is not a Shareholder, and the instrument appointing him shall be deposited at the registered office of the Company not less than twenty-four hours before the time of holding the meeting at which he proposes to vote; but no such instrument shall be valid after the expiration of three months from the date of its execution.

## DIRECTORS.

52. Until otherwise determined by a General Meeting, the number of Directors shall not be less than nine nor exceed sixteen.

53. The qualification of a Director shall be the holding of 50 shares, or the obtaining of votes

of a person or persons holding 100 shares in the aggregate.

54. The first Directors shall be Messrs. A. Kanagasabai, V. Casipillai, R. M. Velupillai S. Asaipillai, S. Velupillai, R. C. Alexander, Wm. Mather, M. Sinnappoo, S. Tambyapillai, C. Tirunavukarasu, M. M. Meydeen, Isaac Tambyah, G. S. Johnpullai, S. Visuvappah, A. Sabapathy, J. S. Sathupathy.

Any casual vacancy in the Board may be filled up by the Board, but any person so chosen

shall hold office only until the next Annual General Meeting.

56. As remuneration for their services the Directors shall be entitled to receive out of the funds of the Company such annual sum as may be voted by the Shareholders in General Meeting. Such remuneration shall be exclusive of any sum paid by way of salary or remuneration to any Managing Director or Directors, and shall be divided among the Directors as they may determine.

57. The office of a Director shall be vacated—

(1) If he ceases to hold the number of shares or votes qualifying him for the office.

(2) If by notice in writing to the Company he resigns office.

(3) If he becomes insolvent.

(4) If he is found lunatic or becomes of unsound mind.

58. The Company may, by special resolution, remove any Directors before the expiration of his term of office and appoint another Member in his stead.

59. At every Ordinary Meeting of the Company the whole of the Directors shall retire from

office, but they shall be eligible for re-election.

60. The Directors may from time to time appoint one or more of their body to be Managing Director or Directors of the Company, either for any fixed term, or without any limitation as to the period for which he is to hold such office and may, subject to any contract between him and the Company, from time to time remove or dismiss him from office, and appoint another in his place. The remuneration of the Managing Director shall be fixed by the Directors and may be by way of salary, commission, percentage, or participation in profits, or by any or all of these modes. The Directors may from time to time entrust to and confer upon a Managing Director such of the powers exercisable by them as they think fit, subject to such terms and conditions as they may prescribe.

61. The Directors may meet together for despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings as they think fit, and may determine the quorum necessary for the trans-

action of business, and until otherwise determined, seven shall form a quorum.

62. A Director may, and the Secretary at the request of any Director shall, at any time convene a meeting of the Directors. Questions arising at any meeting of the Directors shall be decided. by a majority of votes of the Directors present, and in case of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

63. The Directors may elect a Chairman of their meetings, and may determine the period for which he shall hold office. If such Chairman has not been appointed, or if he is not present at the time appointed for a meeting, the Directors present shall choose some one of those present to be Chairman of such meeting.

64. The Directors shall cause minutes to be made in a book or books provided for and solely

used for that purpose-

(1) Of all appointments of officers made by the Directors.

(2 Of the names of Directors present at each meeting of Directors.

(3) Of all orders made by the Directors.

(4) Of all resolutions and proceedings of meetings of the Company and of the Directors.

And any such minute as aforesaid, if signed by any person purporting to be the Chairman of any meeting of Directors, shall be receivable in evidence without any further proof.

65. A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors shall be as valid and effectual as if it

had been passed at a meeting of the Directors duly called and constituted.

66. The Directors may delegate any of their powers to committees consisting of such Member or Members of their body as they think fit, and may revoke the appointment of any such committee. Any committee so formed shall, in the exercise of the powers so delegated, conform to any regulation. that may from time to time be imposed on it by the Directors.

67. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two or more Members shall be governed by the provision herein contained for regulating the meetings of Directors, so far as the same are applicable thereto, and are not superseded by the express terms of the appointment

of the committee, or by any such regulations as aforesaid.

## DIVIDEND.

68. The Directors may, with the sanction of the Company in General Meeting, declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders in proportion to their shares.

69. No dividend shall be payable, except out of the profits arising from the business of the

Company and with the sanction of the Directors.

70. The Directors may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sum as they think proper as a reserve fund to meet contingencies or for equalizing dividends, or for repairing or maintaining the works connected with business of the Company or any part thereof, and the Directors may invest the sum so set apart as a reserve fund upon such security

as they may with the sanction of the Company select.

71. The Directors may deduct from the dividends payable to any Shareholder all such sums

of money as may be due from him to the Company on account of calls or otherwise.

76. No dividend shall bear interest as against the Company.
73. Notice of any dividend that may have been declared shall be given to each Shareholder, or sent by post, or otherwise, to his registered place of abode, and all dividends unclaimed for three years after having been declared may be forfeited by the Directors for the benefit of the Company.

74. The Directors shall cause true accounts to be kept of the moneys received and expended by the Company and all matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place and of the property, assets, credits, and liabilities of the Company. But no Member shall have any right to insist on the inspection of any account book or document of the Company, except as conferred by the Ordinance, or authorized by the Directors, or by a resolution of the Company in General Meeting.

#### ACCOUNTS.

75. Once at least in every year the Directors shall lay before the Company in General Meeting a statement of the income and expenditure of the Company for the past year, made up to a date not

more than three months after the financial year.

76. The statement so made shall show, arranged under the most convenient heads, the amount of gross income, distinguishing the several sources from which it has been derived, and the amount of gross expenditure, distinguishing the expense of the establishment, salaries, and other matters

Every item of expenditure fairly chargeable against the year's income shall be brought into account, so that a just balance of the profit and loss may be laid up before the meeting, and in cases where any item of expenditure which may in fairness be distributed over several years has been incurred in any one year, the whole amount of such item shall be stated, with the addition of the reasons why only a portion of such expenditure is charged against the year.

78. At the ordinary meeting in each year the Directors shall lay before the Company a

balance sheet containing a summary of the property and liabilities of the Company.

79. A printed copy of such balance sheet shall, fourteen days previously to such meeting, be delivered or sent by post to the address of every Shareholder.

#### AUDIT.

80. The accounts of the Company shall be examined and the correctness of the balance sheet ascertained by one or more Auditors to be elected by the Company in General Meeting.

81. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by the Company at the time of their

election.

82. If any casual vacancy occurs in the office of Auditors, the Directors shall forthwith call an Extraordinary General Meeting for the purpose of supplying the same.

83. The Directors shall appoint the first Auditor or Auditors to audit the accounts of the Company until the first Ordinary General Meeting, and fix the remuneration payable to them.

84. Every Auditor shall be supplied with a copy of the balance sheet, and it shall be his duty

to examine the same with the accounts and vonchers relating thereto.

85. Every Auditor shall have a list delivered to him of all the books kept by the Company, and he shall at all reasonable times have access to the books and accounts of the Company. He may at the expense of the Company employ accountants or other persons to assist him in investigating such accounts, and he may in relation to such accounts examine the Directors or any other officer of

86. The Auditors shall make a report to the Shareholders upon the balance sheet and accounts, and in every such report they shall state whether in their opinion the balance sheet is full and fair, containing the particulars required by these regulations, and properly drawn up so as to exhibit a true and correct view of the state of the Company's affairs; and in case they have called for explanations or information from the Directors, whether such explanations or information have been given by the Directors, and whether they have been satisfactory; and such reports shall be read together with the report of the Directors at the Ordinary Meeting.

## Notices.

87. Notices requiring to be served by the Company upon the Shareholders may be served either personally, or by leaving the same, or sending them through the post, at their registered places of abode.

88. Every Shareholder shall give an address which shall be deemed his place of abode, and

shall be registered as such in the books of the Company.

89. Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served at the time when the letter concerning same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the letter containing the notice was properly addressed and put in a Post Office box or handed in at a Post
