Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, March 15, 1902, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated March 11, 1902.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.; P. T. Habeeboo Lebbe, Esq.

- I. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 15 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1901 to February 28, 1902, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of February.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 7. Submitted letter from Mr. S. W. Silva, respecting the payment of salary by biennial increments, while others have the privilege of annual increments.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of February, 1902.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town was not satisfactory, particularly during the latter end of this month. The scavenger was first warned and then reported.

Drains.—Little or nothing has been done to the drains in town for the last year, and now in many places in many streets the side walls have fullen in, again the open roadside drains. All these should be cemented. It is simply impossible to keep them in a sanitary condition as they are. I would call the attention of the Council to the filthy state of the side drains in railway approach road.

Water Supply.—Very good. I attach an analysis—the water was taken from the standpipe in Castle Hill street. (March 6, 1902.)

Alleys.—The alleys of the town are, as they have been, in a most unsatisfactory condition, and nothing more can be done than is done to keep them clean. I would strongly recommend that the town should take over one or more of these worst alleys, pull down these hovels, and build some model dwelling-houses on sanitary principles.

Laundries.—Generally well kept. Notice to limewash more frequently.

Dairies.—Well kept. That one at Ampitiya is unfit for a dairy in its present condition. The owner has been frequently noticed.

Bakeries .- Fairly well kept.

Market.—Well kept. All food stuffs have been inspected by me daily and found good.

Cattle passed during the month: -Cattle, 370; buffaloes, 90; sheep, 101; goats, 205.

Slaughter House and Exposing Shed .- Well kept.

Cooly Lines. - Fairly well kept.

Boutiques .- Fairly well kept.

Latrines .- Well kept.

General Health. -Good. A few cases of chickenpox have been reported.
