MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, March 15, 1902, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated March 11, 1902.

Present:—Hon. Mr. H. Wace, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib; P. T. Habeebo Lebbe, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 15 were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1901 to February 28, 1902, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of February.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during February and register.

4. The Auditor's report on accounts of the fourth quarter, 1901, which had been circulated, was submitted. It was resolved that the following account of amounts due be handed to the Council's proctor for recovery:—
Mr. R. J. Farquharson, Kataragam Dewale. Mr. J. D. Jonklaas.

That the sum due on account Warren's Circus be written off.

5. The following correspondence was submitted:—

(a) Letter No. 6 of February 1 from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that Mr. Kanakasundra's name has been noted for employment under Government.

(b) Letter No. 7 of February 1, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting the furnishing of a printed copy of by-laws as per section 7 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901. (Calls attention to No. 10 of June 19, 1901.)

(c) Letter E No. 1 of January 31, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, submitting a further amendment of the proposed amendment of by-law 15, chapter XV., for approval.

(d) Letter No. 9 of February 7/8, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, calling attention to letter No. 10 of June 19, 1901.

(e) Letter No. 10 of February 26, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Governor in Executive Council has confirmed the amendment of by-law 3d of May 17, 1898, and requesting to be furnished with the necessary proclamation.

(f) Letter No. 11 of February 28, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Governor in Executive Council has confirmed the proposed amendment of by-laws Nos. 15 and 18, and returns proclamation to fill in schedule and to furnish translations of the proposed amendments.

(g) Letter No. 12 of March 6/7 from the Colonial Secretary, requesting, with reference to his letter No. 10 of February 26, 1902, to furnish translations of the amended by-law.

6. Read letter from Rev. Bray, thanking the Council for exemption of school buildings in Brownrigg street from assessment tax.

7. Submitted letter from Mr. S. W. Silva, respecting the payment of salary by biennial increments, while others have the privilege of annual increments.

Resolved—That the papers be circulated and considered at next Meeting.

8. Read report by Inspector of the District on cesspit on premises No. 146, Castle Hill street, and recommendation by the Health Officer that the cesspit be emptied and closed and dry-earth closets substituted, there being means of access to the back of the house.

Resolved—That special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owner of premises No. 146, Castle Hill street, to empty, disinfect, and close the cesspit on the said premises and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

9. Resolved—That tenders be invited for the scavenging of the town from May 16.
