W HEREAS by section 22 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1893 it is enacted that whenever a building shall have been erected for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, and such building shall have been certified to the Governor by the proper authority as sufficient for the purposes of a public slaughter-house, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, declare and proclaim such building to be a public slaughter-house:

COMPETITION.

TYPE PLANS OF POST OFFICES.

THE Government of Ceylon invites designs of Types A, B, and C for Post Offices suitable for erection in various parts of the low-country of Ceylon.

2. The designs must contain the accommodation and be within the nett cost given below, and must be drawn to $\frac{1}{8}$ in. scale and show ground plan (with roof lines dotted on), front elevation, and two sections. All sizes and heights of rooms, surface drains, foundations, and sizes of timber, thicknesses of walls, to be clearly shown, and nature of materials indicated; all rooms to have ceilings; Post Office to have counter and letter-box, and ground floor to be 18 in. above level of site. Each design must be accompanied by a detailed estimate and brief specification setting forth the nature and quality of materials proposed to be used.

3. The accepted set of designs will receive a prize of Rs. 500, the decision to rest with Government: the accepted design, including estimate and specification, to become the sole property of the Government. Members of the Public Service as well as the general public are invited to compete.

Designs to be forwarded by post addressed to the Hon. the Colonial Secretary so as to 4. reach his office on or before the 1st day of June, 1905, and to be under cover and marked on the ontside "Design for Type Post Offices," but no distinguishing name, mark, or sign is to be placed either on the plans or cover. A sealed blank envelope containing the name and address of competitor is to be attached to the plan. The envelopes will be opened after the award has been made, and designs other than the successful ones will be returned to competitors.

5. Parties submitting designs must do so at their own cost.

Sale of Articles within the premises of the Ceylon Government Railway.

5. No person shall offer for sale any goods or articles whatsoever in the trains or on the platforms or within the precincts of the Ceylon Government Railway without written authority from the General Manager authorizing him to do so, or contrary to the terms of such authority. Any persons acting in contravention of this rule shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees for each such offence.

Imported Live Stock.

Live stock imported from England and Australia and entire bulls imported from India introduced for stock purposes will be conveyed by Railway at half the ordinary rates on production of a certificate from the Government Veterinary Surgeon that the live stock for which transport by Railway at the reduced rate is claimed are bona fide imported animals, and that they are being conveyed by Railway solely for stock purposes.

CHAPTER IX.

BY-LAWS RELATING TO NIGHT SOIL.

Fee for removal of Night Soil.

12. Every person employing a municipal officer for the removal of night soil shall pay to the Council in advance such sum as shall be determined by the Chairman not exceeding two rupees per mensem for each bucket in which such night soil is deposited on his premises for removal by such officer. The sum payable, if not paid on or before the 10th of the month in respect of which it is due, may be reported by the Chairman to the magistrate and recovered in the same way as if it were a fine imposed by such magistrate; and such magistrate may, in addition, order the person liable to pay a sum not exceeding five rupees by way of costs, such sum to be recovered as if it were a fine imposed by such magistrate.

COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended April 8, 1905, is subjoined (A).

Births.-The total births were 83. The birth-rate per 1.000 was 25.5,* as against 23.9 in the preceding week and 27.6 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 106. The death-rate per 1,000 was 32.5,* as against 31.3 in the

previous week and 26.3 in the corresponding week of last year. *Causes of death.*—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 16 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 25 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 3 from different kinds of fever; and 13 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.-Of the 106 total deaths, 32 were of infants under 1 year of age, being in the proportion of 386 to 1,000 registered births, as against 313 to 1,000 in the previous week and 227 to 1,000 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
