COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended June 10, 1905, is subjoined (A).

Births.—The total births were 62. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 19·0,* as against 17·2 in the preceding week and 22·5 in the corresponding week of last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths were 110. The death-rate per 1,000 was 33·8,* as against 33·5 in the previous week and 28·2 in the corresponding week of last year.

Causes of death.—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles. 19 died from diarrhœa and dysentery; 22 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 11 from different kinds of fever; and 11 from infantile convulsions.

Infantile deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 25 were of infants under 1 year of age, being in the proportion of 403 to 1,000 registered births, as against 413 to 1,000 in the previous week and 292 to 1,000 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
