DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to further amend the Law relating to the Registration of Trade Marks in Ceylon,

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Ordinances relating to the registration of trade marks in Ceylon by transferring to the Registrar-General the duties assigned by the said Ordinances to the Colonial Secretary: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Trade Marks Amendment Ordinance, 1905," and shall be read and construed as one with "The Trade Marks Ordinance, 1888" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), and this Ordinance, the principal Ordinance, and the Ordinances amending the same may be cited together as "The Trade Marks Ordinances, 1888 to 1905."

Amendment of section 2 of principal Ordinance with regard to definition of "Colonial Secretary."

Substitution of "Registrar-General" for "Colonial Secretary" throughout Ordinance.

2 For the definition of the term "Colonial Secretary" in section 2 of the principal Ordinance there shall be substituted the following definition, namely:

"Registrar" means the Registrar-General, and includes any officer in the Registrar-General's Department to the extent to which he may be authorized by general or special order of the Governor to discharge the duty of the registrar under this Ordinance.

3 For the terms "the Colonial Secretary" and "the Colonial Secretary's Office" wherever they occur in the principal Ordinance or in the schedule thereto, or in the Ordinances amending the principal Ordinance, or in the marginal notes to any of the said Ordinances, there shall be respectively substituted the terms "the registrar" and "the registrar's office."

Objects and Reasons.

THE purpose of the Draft Ordinance is to transfer to the Registrar-General the duties which "The Trade Marks Ordinance, 1885," assigns to the Colonial Secretary.

This change is introduced partly on grounds of administrative convenience and partly because the office of the Registrar-General is better adapted than that of the Colonial Secretary for the performance of the duties in question.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

An Ordinance to prohibit the destruction of Fish by means of Dynamite or other explosives.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prohibit the destruction of fish by means of dynamite or other explosives: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Fisheries (Dynamite) Ordinance, 1905."

Prohibition of use of dynamite for fishing.

2 Any person who uses any dynamite or other explosive substance to catch or destroy fish in any water within the island or at sea within one marine league of the coast shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction thereof to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months, or to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to both.

Place of trial of offences committed at sea. 3 Any offence committed against this Ordinance at sea shall be deemed to have been committed on the coast adjoining the sea, or to have been committed in any place where the offender is found, and may be tried and punished accordingly.

Procedure.

4 Every offence against this Ordinance shall be triable by a police magistrate, and shall be "cognizable" and "bailable" within the meaning of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

THE present Ordinance prohibits the use of dynamite and other explosive substances for the purpose of catching or destroying fish either in inland waters or at sea within territorial waters; and provides a penalty for contravention of this prohibition.
