

THIS matter coming on for disposal before R. W. Allegacoon, Esq., Additional District Judge of Chilaw, on this 3rd day of May, 1905, in the presence of Mr. G. E. Chitty, Proctor, on the part of the 1st plaintiff, and of Mr. C. Munasinha on the part of the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, and added plaintiffs, and of Mr. C. M. Fernando, Crown Counsel, instructed by Mr. N. J.
