MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, March 10, 1905.

The Council met this day at 3 p.M., pursuant to notice dated March 4, 1905.

Present:—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. P. D. Warren;
Mr. M. F. Khan; Sir Allan Perry; Mr. C. P. Dias; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zajnudeen; and Mr. H. Tiruvilangam.

The Minutes of February 10, 1905, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member

of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of February 10, 1905, be confirmed.
