MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on March 18, 1905, at 1 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman; A. E. Mayes, Esq.; M. Ismail, Esq.; N. Dias Abeysinha, Esq.; D. G. Goonawardana, Esq.; Dr. E. Ludovici; and F. Abeysundara, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on February 24, 1905.

2. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated 7th March, 1905, stating the assistance the Government is prepared to render the Council to enable it to carry the proposed water scheme.

Resolved—(1) That the thanks of the Council be presented to the Government for the liberal assistance promised; (2) that in reference to paragraph 2 of the letter, it be pointed out that Mr. R. W. Smith's scheme and estimate included the laying of water to the whole of the police limits of the town where good water is not found, and do not take in Ward 4 and a portion of Ward 5, where good drinking water is abundant; (3) that the gauging of the Madola and its tributary so far as it has been carried does not yield satisfactory results, and before the Council reselve on embarking in the scheme it must satisfy itself that these streams will afford sufficient water to supply the town.

- 3. Read letter from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, dated March 3, 1905, informing the Council that the Government is not prepared to grant the Council power to vote money annually for the assistance of the Galle Friend-in-Need Society.
- 4. The following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on March 11, 1905, was laid before the Council:—

"Papers regarding the claim put forward by certain landowners at Pettigalawatta to the land reclaimed by

the Council from the Pettigala-ela.

"The Committee agreed with the Council's proctor that the claim cannot be maintained, but that in view of the fact that the Council had no power to make grants at appraised value or at half-improved value the Committee consider it would not be equitable to sell the land outright, including the improvements made by the owners of the adjoining properties. The Council will therefore not be able to come to any satisfactory arrangement with the owners.

"It was resolved to ask the Government to issue instructions to the Government Agent to deal with these lots as ordinary Crown lands and to put them up for sale or settlement, the proceeds being made over to the Municipality in lieu of the land itself."

Resolved—That the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

5. The Chairman applied for authority under section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896 to require the owner of house No. 21, Pedlar street, Fort, to close his cesspit and to substitute a dry-earth closet therefor.

Resolved—That the authority sought be granted.

The Sanitary Officer's Report for the Month of March, 1905.

Scavenging was well attended to.

Drainage.-Drains were kept clean.

Water supply. - Drinking water from Laouduwa was good.

Alleys were kept clean.

Dairies were well kept.

Bakeries were kept in good order.

Markets were well kept.

Cattle, &c., passed during the month .- 155 cattle, 22 buffaloes, and 168 goats.

Slaughter-house and cattle shed were well kept.

Night soil depôt.-Well kept,

Latrines were well kept.

General health.—Twenty-three cases of chickenpox were reported from China Garden and Dangedara chiefly. The spread of the disease was due to the congregation of large numbers, including persons from infected houses, in plumbago shed. Two cases of enteric fever and four of malarial fever occurred in the Fort, a case of enteric fever occurred in house No. 28, Colombo road, and a case of continued fever was reported from Bataganvila; the necessary precautions were taken. Measles was prevailing to some extent.
