## PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Northern Circuit, twice at least at Jaffna and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such sessions commencing at Jaffna in the month of February and the month of July in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Batticaloa, a place included within the said Northern Circuit:

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Batticaloa, in the said Northern Circuit, on or about Monday, the Twenty-eighth day of August, 1905.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Second day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Five.

NOTICE is hereby given that a Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor will sit on the following day at the Council Chamber for the purpose of opening and considering tenders for the purchase of the following Arrack Rents for the period as stated:—

August 17, 1905.

(1) *Western Province.*—The Arrack Rent of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted), Lansiyawatta (including Wattala, Peliyagoda, and Ambatalenpahala), and Salpiti korale. For a period of one or two years from January 1, 1906.

(2) *Western Province.*—The Arrack Rent of the Negombo District, viz., Dunugaha, Ragama, and Dasiya pattus of Alutkuru Korale North and Hapitigam korale. For a period of one year from January 1, 1906.

No tender will be received after 12.30 P.M. on the appointed day.

Each tenderer should state in his tender the period or periods in respect of which he tenders, and the price or prices that he is prepared to pay.

Separate tenders should be made for the several rents as shown above, both the name and number of the rent being inserted in the tender.

Tenders, properly sealed, marked "Arrack Rent Tender," must be delivered personally by the tenderer to the Board.

Forms of conditions of sale with lists of taverns can be obtained at any Kachcheri in the Island. Any further information required will be supplied by the Hon. the Government Agent, Western Province, on application made to him either personally or by letter.

Tenderers who cannot speak English and wish to communicate with the Board must bring their own interpreters.

No tender will be considered unless the tenderer is present in person or by his authorized agent at the Council Chamber, and is prepared to deposit forthwith the amount of one month's rent as tendered by him.

In the event of two or more tenders being for an equal amount, the Board shall have the option of forthwith offering the rent for sale by public auction—the bidding to be restricted to the tenderers in question—or of calling for fresh tenders.

Purchasers of these rents will be allowed to sell arrack at any price not below Rs. 4.50 per gallon.

And notice is hereby further given that the purchasers of the Arrack Rents of the Four Gravets of Colombo (Fort excepted) will be required to pay, in terms of the provisions of the Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, a stamp duty of Rs. 500 for each and every license issued under the Ordinance No. 13 of 1891 to sell arrack by retail at each and every tavern situated within the limits of the Municipality of Colombo.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended July 29, 1905, is subjoined (A).

*Births.*—The total births were 62. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 19·0,\* as against 20·9 in the preceding week and 19·1 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths were 103. The death-rate per 1,000 was 31·6,\* as against 30·7 in the previous week and 34·1 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Causes of death.*—No persons died from cholera, smallpox, or measles. 18 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 33 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 7 from different kinds of fever; and 8 from infantile convulsions.

*Infantile deaths.*—Of the 103 total deaths, 23 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year.

Subject: "The Ideas expressed by the word "Empire."

(B) LORD MEATH EMPIRE DAY PRIZE (Primary Schools).—A Silver Challenge Cup, value £10 10s., presented by the Right Hon. the Earl of Meath, K.P., and a personal prize of £3 3s., given by the League of the Empire, is offered for competition, inter all primary schools of the Empire, for an Empire Day Essay of not more than 1,000 words. Subject: "The Chief Stages in the Growth of Greater Britain."

All essays must first be judged in the schools, and afterwards through Representatives of the League in different countries of the Empire. Full publicity of the competition will be given in each country, with the name and address of the Representative of the League in charge of the matter in that country.

Only those essays sent in through the authorized channels will be eligible for the final judging arranged for by the Federal Council of the League in London.

The names of the winning schools will each year be engraved upon the Cups, and a parchment notification of the event will be sent to each winning school.

The Silver Cups are replicas of the Warwick Vase, and are now on view in the League of the Empire Section at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition at the Crystal Palace.

Ceylon Candidates will be considered to belong to primary schools if they are in the 7th or any lower standard of a registered English school, or if they belong to the Training College English School. The Royal College and the four colleges which are exempted from individual examination will be regarded as secondary schools. Pupils of classes above the 7th standard in other schools can compete for the prize for secondary schools. Unregistered schools or colleges which wish to compete should communicate with the Director of Public Instruction with regard to their status.

The Principal or Manager of each school or college should select the six best essays for each of the two prizes, and should forward them so as to reach the Office of Public Instruction not later than December 1, 1905
