New Zealand—South Island, East Coast—Amuri Bluff—Breakers reported to the south-eastward.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 742 of 1905) that Mr. Rolls, commanding the ss. Tarawera, reports the existence of heavy breakers situated at a distance of about 10 miles S. 16° E. from Amuri Bluff.

Approximate position : lat. 42° 42½' S., long. 173° 32' E.

These breakers were assumed to be identical with the 4 fathom shoal marked on the Chart about 3 miles to the southward of the above position, but until this locality has been examined both these dangers will be shown on the Chart.

China Sea—Gulf of Siam—Bangkok river entrance—Outer beacon light established—Light-vessel withdrawn.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 266, dated July 15, 1905, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 753 of 1905) that information has been received that the Outer beacon, at the entrance to the Bangkok river, has been erected

in a position from which the Bar light (white occulting bears N. 32° W., distant 1¼ mile, and the Inner beacon N. 17° E. On this beacon, which is painted black, a white flashing light is experimentally exhibited.

The light exhibited from the Inner beacon, which is painted white, has been altered from fixed to white flashing.

The light-vessel three-quarters of a mile to the north ward of the Outer beacon, from which red and white lights were exhibited, has been withdrawn.

Pacific Ocean—Hawaiian or Sandwich Islands—Main Lahaina roads—Light and buoy altered.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 757 of 1905) that on June 20, 1905, a fixed dioptric light, elevated 60 feet above high water, would be established in a pyramidal tower about 55 feet high, painted white, erected about 20 feet to the eastward of the former light, which would be discontinued. The new light shows the following sectors : red from the bearing of N. 36° W., through north, to N. 20° E., white from N. 20° E. to East, red from East to S. 48° E., the white and red lights being visible in clear weather from distances of 12 and 7 miles respectively.
