MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, August 11, 1905.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated August 5, 1905.

Present :—Mr. E. M. de C. Short, Chairman ; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel ; Mr. P. D. Warren ; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Mr. M. F. Khan ; Sir Allan Perry ; Mr. Chas. Perera ; Mr. C. P. Dias ; Mr. James Peiris ; Dr. Solomon Fernando ; and Mr. R. Davidson.

The Minutes of July 20, 1905, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of July 20, 1905, be confirmed.

With reference to resolution No. 8 of Council dated July 20, 1905, Mr. Chas. Perera, with the leave of Council, moved that the quorum be fixed at 3.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.—Carried.

1. The following extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 5, 1905, were laid before the Council :—

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 5, 1905.

(5) Mr. C. Perera's motion suggesting a re-definition of the interpretation of annual value.

Resolved—That in the opinion of the Committee it is desirable to exempt properties from tax during periods of non-tenancy or non-occupation.

Chairman dissenting.

(9) Papers *re* slaughtering licenses for Hadjie festival.

The Committee is of opinion that special licenses should be allowed to slaughter cattle within the applicant's premises, provided no actual public nuisance is thereby created.
Chairman dissenting.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of July 5, 1905, items 5 and 9, do stand over.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.—Carried.

2. Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of August 7, 1905.

This item was withdrawn with the permission of Council.

3. Report of the Special Committee to consider what steps should be taken to ensure more efficient drainage of that portion of the town not affected by the modified Mansergh Scheme of Drainage was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved—That until the Council is in a position to carry out the whole of the Mansergh Scheme the existing drains be repaired, and such new drains which may be necessary and are consistent with the Mansergh Scheme be constructed—and that estimates be called for for such work.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved as an amendment—That the report of the Special Committee be adopted, it being understood that its adoption will not preclude the Council from carrying out such works from time to time, as may be necessary, to meet special cases.

Dr. C. W. van Geysel seconded.

With the permission of the Council, the Chairman moved—That the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Finance, with the addition of the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., Mr. Chas. Perera, and Mr. James Peiris—three to form a quorum—to report on the financial position of the Council in reference to the carrying out of the Mansergh Scheme in its entirety.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

4. Report of the Special Committee to recommend to Council the least expensive and most feasible of the proposals contained in the reports of the experts consulted and the Council's Officers *re* the lake fly nuisance was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That Council do go into Committee.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded.

[Council in Committee.]

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved—That the second paragraph of the report of the Special Committee be amended by the substitution of the following words after the word "zone" in line 1 : " should be reclaimed and such portion of the lake dredged, so as to secure a margin of at least 20 ft. in width free of floating rubbish and herbage and having a depth of 2 feet of water, and further that the embankment and such portion of the bed of the lake, as may be necessary, be covered with a layer of sand " for the rest of the paragraph ; and that the report, so amended, be adopted.

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

5. Draft Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Standing Committee on Law and the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., Mr. C. P. Dias, and Mr. James Peiris—three to form a quorum—the report to include the question of the feasibility of obtaining Legislative sanction to the adoption of the ballot system at the forthcoming elections.

Dr. C. W. van Geysel seconded.—Carried.

6. Letter from Colonial Secretary, No. 105 of July 20, 1905, with reference to the amendment of Ordinance No. 7 of 1886, in connection with the transfer of the Colombo Waterworks to the Municipal Council, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved—That the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Standing Committees on Law and Finance and the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper—three to form a quorum.

Dr. C. W. van Geysel seconded.—Carried.

7. Letter from Colonial Secretary, No. 65 of May 6, 1905, regarding the closing of Flagstaff street, was laid before the Council.

This item was, with the leave of Council, deferred to next meeting of Council.

8. Papers *re* permanent hospital for infectious diseases were laid before the Council.

This item was with the leave of Council, deferred to next meeting of Council.

9. Papers *re* illicit sale of poisons—new regulations were laid before the Council.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G., moved—That the papers be referred back to the Medical Officer of Health for further report, the terms Apothecary, Chemist, or Druggist not having been defined for purposes of the proposed Ordinance.

Sir Allan Perry seconded.—Carried.

10. Papers with reference to the Colts' Cricket Club Pavilion at the Racquet Court, and Chairman's memorandum thereon as to change of site, were laid before the Council.

Mr. Chas. Perera moved—That the proposed change of site be approved.

Dr. C. W. van Geyzel seconded—Carried.

11. Plans and Estimates A and C for the new office and stores and Depot keeper's quarters at Suduwella were laid before the Council.

This item was, with the leave of Council, deferred to next meeting of Council, pending circulation of papers

12. Estimate for laying out Havelock park extension, Rs. 2,637, was laid before the Council.

Mr. P. D. Warren moved—That the estimate be passed, subject to the approval of the Standing Committees on Finance and Works.

Sir Allan Perry seconded—Carried. Mr. Chas. Perera dissenting.

13. Letter from Municipal Engineer, No. 56r of July 20, 1905, forwarding amended tracing for acquiring land in the immediate neighbourhood of St. Joseph's bridge for new road from Armour street to Nagalagam street was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the amended plan be adopted, and the additional acquisition authorized.

Mr. P. D. Warren seconded—Carried.

14. Letter from Mr. S. W. Dassanaikie, Assistant Municipal Engineer, asking for permission to avail himself of the concession granted to him at the time of his appointment to the Municipal Council, and to apply to Government to rejoin the Government Service was read.

The Chairman moved—That the permission applied for be granted.

Mr. Chas. Perera seconded—Carried.

15. Application from Messrs. Boustead Brothers, dated July 4, 1905, for permission to make connection to the Apothecary's Co. Printing Office Motor, at a pressure of 440 volts for power purposes, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the application be allowed on the conditions laid down by the Electrical Adviser.

Mr. R. Davidson seconded—Carried.
