## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty EDWARD THE SEVENTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir HENRY ARTHUR BLAKE, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HENRY A. BLAKE.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Midland Circuit, three times at least at Kandy, and any other sessions at such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultations with the Judges, shall appoint; such sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1, in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden on the days hereinafter mentioned at Badulla, a place included within the said Midland Circuit.

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Badulla, in the said Midland Circuit, on or about Wednesday, the 17th day of January, 1906.

WHEREAS by section 21 of "The Salt Ordinance, 1890," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to exempt any part or parts of the Island from all or any of the restrictions to which the same are subject under the said Ordinance in regard to the sale, possession, removal, or manufacture of salt:

And whereas it is expedient to exempt certain parts of the Island from all the restrictions to which the same are subject under the said Ordinance in regard to the sale, possession, or removal of salt:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby exempt as from and after the First day of January, 1906, the divisions of (1) Kirama, (2) Katuwana, and (3) Julampitiya, situated to the north of Walesmulla and west of Paranagampalata in the judicial district of Tangalla, Southern Province, from all the restrictions to which the same are subject under the said Ordinance in regard to the sale, possession, or removal of salt.

## COLOMBO WEEKLY HEALTH REPORT.

THE weekly return of births and deaths in the Colombo town for the week ended December 16, 1905, 1905, is subjoined (A).

*Births.*—The total births were 89. The birth-rate per 1,000 was 27·3,\* as against 25·5 in the preceding week and 29·1 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths were 136. The death-rate per 1,000 was 41·7,\* as against 47·6 in the previous week and 16·0 in the corresponding week of last year.

*Causes of death.*—No person died from cholera, smallpox, or measles; 28 died from diarrhoea and dysentery; 22 from phthisis, bronchitis, and pneumonia; 8 from different kinds of fever; and 14 from infantile convulsions.

*Infantile deaths.*—Of the 136 total deaths, 41 were of infants under 1 year of age, as against 33 in the corresponding week of the previous year.
